INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Londen Insurance Group 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Londen Insurance Group 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Londen Insurance Group, Inc. (the Company) who are at least eighteen years of age, have attained at least six months of service with the Company, and have regularly scheduled hours of service of a thousand hours annually. It is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan includes a deferred compensation arrangement under Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k), which allows eligible employees to make tax-deferred contributions to the Plan as a percentage of their compensation.

Employee Contributions

Participants are permitted to contribute up to 100% of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, to the Plan on a tax-deferred basis. Contributions may not exceed dollar limits set by law. Transfers from qualified plans are allowed under provisions of the Plan.

Employer Contributions

The Company contributes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of each participant's eligible contributions not exceeding 4% of eligible compensation. The Company also makes a profit-sharing contribution, as defined in the Plan document, equal to 2% of each participant's eligible compensation. For the years ended December 31, the Company made matching contributions of \$1,144,686 (2024) and \$1,126,751 (2023) and profit-sharing contributions of \$616,043 (2024) and \$600,066 (2023).

In addition, the Company can make additional matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no additional matching contributions were made.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions on the participant's behalf, and an allocation of the Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant account balances.

Investment Elections

Each participant may direct that salary reductions and profit sharing contributions allocated to their account be invested in one or more of the mutual fund investment alternatives or insurance contract offered. Participants may change such allocations at any time directly with Principal Trust Company, the Plan's trustee.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contributions and in safe harbor contributions made by the Company on their behalf plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contributions plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. In addition, a participant becomes 100% vested in the Company's contributions in the event of a participant's death or disability or upon termination of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the loan fund. Loan terms are up to five years, thirty years if used for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account. Interest rates are determined by the Trustee and Plan administrator at the time the loan is processed.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump-sum payment equal to the value of his or her account, provided the account does not have a value greater than \$1,000 and an election has not been made to directly rollover the balance to an IRA. Participants with account values of at least \$1,000 but less than \$7,000 may receive a lump-sum payment, elect to rollover the balance to another plan or IRA, or if no other option is selected, the balance will be rolled over to a Principal IRA on behalf of the participant. If a participant's account value is \$7,000 or more, the participant may elect an annuity to be paid in monthly, quarterly or annual installments, may receive a lump-sum payment, or may elect to defer benefits to a future date.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of profit sharing contributions made by the Company are determined at year end and are used to reduce the employer's future contributions. For the years ended December 31, forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions were \$98,949 (2024) and \$45,170 (2023). For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no unallocated forfeitures. For the year ended December 31, 2023, there were \$5,706 of unallocated forfeitures.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment in Insurance Contracts

As described in Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962, *Plan Accounting-Defined Contribution Pension Plans*, as updated by ASU 2015-12, investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at contract value. The Guaranteed Income Fund is a group annuity contract issued by Principal and is backed by the full faith and creditworthiness of the issuer. Guarantees are based on the claims-paying ability of Principal and not on the value of the securities within the insurer's general account. The credit rating of the issuer at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was considered investment grade and there are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Generally there are no events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value paid within 90 days or contract value paid over time. Additionally, there are no events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract and which require the Plan to settle at an amount different than contract value paid either within 90 days or over time. The Plan considers this contract to be fully benefit responsive. The guaranteed income fund is included at its contract value in the statements of net assets available for benefits. As of December 31, the contract value was \$946,433 (2024) and \$521,150 (2023).

The guaranteed income fund does not operate like a mutual fund, variable annuity product, or conventional fixed rate individual annuity product. Under the group annuity contract that supports this product, participants may ordinarily direct a permitted withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their account balance at contract value, within reasonable timeframes. Contract value represents deposits made to the contract, plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less withdrawals and fees.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the trustee.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses included on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits are primarily fees for investment management and other investment-related services that are generally assessed as a percentage of investment assets.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEES

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Trust Company has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i-Schedule of Assets

(Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan accounts for fair value in accordance with FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* (ASC 820). ASC 820 defines fair values, establishes a consistent framework for measuring fair value and expands disclosure requirements for fair value measurements. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

Under ASC 820, assets and liabilities are grouped in three levels, based on the markets in which the assets and liabilities are traded and the reliability of the assumptions used to determine fair value. These levels are:

- Level 1 – Valuation is based upon quoted prices for identical instruments traded in active markets.
- Level 2 – Valuation is based upon quoted prices for similar instruments in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in markets that are not active, and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market.
- Level 3 – Valuation is generated from model-based techniques that use significant assumptions not observable in the market. These unobserved assumptions reflect the Plan management’s own estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. Valuation techniques include use of option pricing models, discounted cash flow models, and similar techniques.

Under ASC 820, the Plan bases fair values on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements for assets and liabilities where there exists limited or no observable market data and; therefore, are based primarily upon the Plan’s estimates, are often calculated based on current pricing policy, the economic and competitive environment, the characteristics of the asset or liability, and other such factors. Therefore, the results cannot be determined with precision and may not be realized in an actual sale or immediate settlement of the asset or liability. Additionally, there may be inherent weaknesses in any calculation technique, and changes in the underlying assumptions used, including discount rates and estimates of future cash flows, that could significantly affect the results of current or future values.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have expressed no intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on August 30, 2004, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. Plan management and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 7 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Plan pays for certain Plan expenses while the Company absorbs certain administrative expenses, such as accounting fees.

Principal Trust Company manages certain Plan investments. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are denoted as such on the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i-Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through September 3, 2025, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that no events have occurred that would require disclosure.
