




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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors and Management of
Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan
Duluth, Georgia

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan, an employee plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 10 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Readers should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a multi-employer defined contribution plan covering all employees of the following companies:

- Network Cabling Infrastructures, LLC
- CZM Enterprises, GA, LLC
- Rodzilla Enterprises, LLC
- AI4F, LLC
- OLWJ, LLC
- Magic Systems, LLC

The Plan, which had an effective date of January 1, 2002 and has since been amended to remain in compliance with laws and regulations. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. Eligibility for employer contributions varies based on the type of contribution as defined in the plan documents.

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan include employee deferrals, Roth contributions, rollover contributions, matching contributions, and profit sharing contributions. Employees may defer up to a maximum of 100% of their compensation subject to the maximum amount allowed under the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan also allows for catch-up contributions subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of these contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Employer match contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$112,642 and \$145,431, respectively. The plan sponsor may also make a profit sharing contribution to the plan, allocated to the participant accounts based on a formula as defined in the Plan documents. There were no profit sharing contributions made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. There were payables of excess deferral contributions of \$46,703 and \$37,771 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the Company's contributions, plan earnings or losses, and plan expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan documents.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or beneficiary will receive the vested interest of his or her account in the form of a single lump-sum distribution. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in installments or as a lump-sum distribution.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN *(continued)*

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are subject to a vesting schedule for matching contributions received plus actual earnings thereon. Matching contributions vest at a rate of 25% each year beginning after the first year of service, enabling the participants to be fully vested in their matching contributions after 4 years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts an amount as defined in the Plan documents. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as defined by the Plan documents.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of unvested Company contributions from terminated participant accounts can be used to offset future Company contributions or to pay Plan administration expenses. Forfeitures are not allocated until there has been a break in service by the terminated participant as defined by the Plan. Forfeitures during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$6,055 and \$9,053, respectively. The balance in the forfeitures account was \$0 and \$4,853 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Company employer contributions were offset by forfeitures of \$10,907. There were no forfeitures used to offset Company employer contributions during the year ended December 31, 2023. There were no forfeitures used to offset Company administrative fees during the year ended December 31, 2024. During the year ended December 31, 2023, Company administrative fees were offset by forfeitures of \$7,234.

Priorities Upon Termination

In the event of termination, or partial termination, of the Plan, the affected participants shall become fully vested. All funds will be held until benefits are otherwise due or distribution is directed by the Company.

Hardship Withdrawals

Withdrawal of a portion of a participant's account will be permitted due to an immediate and heavy financial need, if it meets IRS requirements.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that could affect certain reported amounts and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their outstanding principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Loan origination and other fees are recognized as incurred. Interest income is recognized as it is collected.

Administrative Fees

Substantially all of the administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between willing market participants as of the measurement date. This value includes an estimate of surrender charges and market value adjustments as of the measurement date. Actual surrender charges and market value adjustments are determined at the date of payment. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets available for benefits are reported in net appreciation in fair value investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive fixed rate option contract. Ameritas is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The investment is an insurance contract and the Plan may transact with the issuer according to the terms defined in the contract at any time. The occurrence of an event that would limit the plan's ability to execute transactions at contract value with Plan participants is not probable of occurring.

The fixed rate option contract is included in the financial statements at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Ameritas, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The fixed rate contract does have a surrender charge that may be charged if the Plan terminates its interest in the contract. The average yield earned by the plan for the fixed annuity contract for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 4.35% and

3.01%. The contract value of the fixed annuity contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$137,545 and \$145,431, respectively.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan applies the provisions of *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* (FASB ASC 820) to its recurring and nonrecurring, non-financial measurements. Non-recurring assets are not measured at fair value on an ongoing basis but are subject to fair value adjustments in certain circumstances and on a period basis. In accordance with FASB ASC 820, the fair value of financial instruments is based on market trading information, where available. Absent published market values for an instrument or other assets, management uses observable market data to arrive at its estimates of fair value.

Fair value is defined as an exit price, representing the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. As such, fair value is a market-based measurement that should be determined based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. As a basis for considering such assumptions, FASB ASC 820 establishes a three level fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). These tiers include:

Level 1 - quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Company can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are directly or indirectly observable such as quoted prices for similar instruments in active markets or quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in markets that are not active.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs in which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring the Company to develop its own assumptions, such as valuations derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant value drivers are unobservable.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts - valued based on net asset values as a practical expedient, as reported by the managers of the pooled separate account funds and as supported by the unit prices of actual purchase and sale transactions occurring as of or close to the financial statement date. Because they are valued using a practical expedient, they have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

Fixed rate option - valued at original cost plus accrued interest. Because it is valued at cost, it has not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair values of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There were no transfers between the fair value hierarchy levels during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

5. INVESTMENTS THAT CALCULATE NET ASSET VALUE PER SHARE

The fair value of the investments using the net asset value as a practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 is \$7,209,447 and \$145,431, respectively.

6. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan utilizes an asset custodian and third-party administrator, Ameritas Life Insurance Corporation (Ameritas). Administrative fees charged by Ameritas were paid by the Company. The Plan's investments are also held and managed by Ameritas. Investment fees of \$4,350 and \$4,287 were paid by the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan utilizes a third-party administrator, Dorsa Consulting Services, Inc. (DCS). Administrative fees charged by DCS were paid by the Plan Sponsor.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed an intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

8. TAX STATUS

The Plan was effective January 1, 2002 and subsequently amended and restated. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan sponsor by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the letter, the Plan administrator and management believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and tax-exempt.

Generally accepted accounting principles prescribe requirements for the recognition, measurement, classification, and disclosure in the financial statements of uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken by the Plan. Management has evaluated the Plan's design and operation and has concluded that the Plan is designed and has been operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Further, management believes that the Plan has maintained its tax exempt status and has taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS and generally, the Plan's tax returns remain open for federal income tax examination for three years from the date of filing.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risk factors such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

10. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY AMERITAS LIFE INSURANCE CORPORATION

The Plan Sponsor has elected, as permitted by Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, to have certain financial statement information certified by the Plan's trustee, Ameritas Life Insurance Corporation.

The trustee has certified the investment assets, contributions, transactions, income, fees, benefit payments, and the schedule of investments.

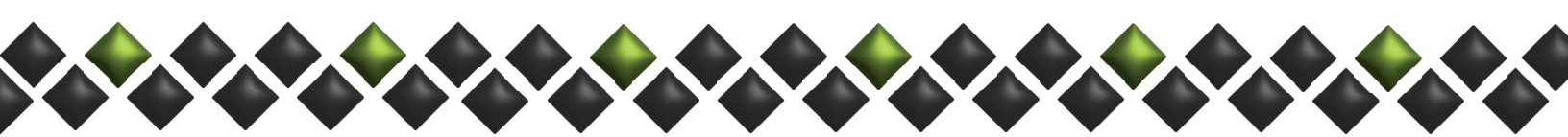

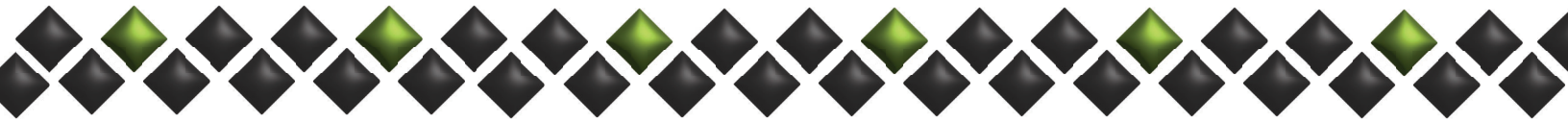
