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## Independent Auditors' Report

#### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

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**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Discovery Natural Resources LLC Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Discovery Natural Resources, LLC (the “Company”). The Plan is available to all employees on the first day of the month following their hire date. Employees who are under a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, or nonresident aliens and all irregular employees, including, without limitation, seasonal employees, student interns, and employees under student cooperative programs, are not eligible to participate in the Plan unless they complete 1,000 hours of service in a year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan is administered by the plan administrator. The plan administrator has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The plan administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Company administers the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) serves as trustee, manages plan assets, and maintains the Plan’s records.

Effective February 1, 2023, the Plan amended to allow for a change in investment options. The amendment also shifts the responsibility of approving hardship withdrawals from the Company to Fidelity. Effective October 1, 2024, the Plan amended to expand rollover contribution eligibility for employees who have yet to satisfy all eligibility requirements. Further the Plan amended to allow in-plan Roth conversions.

**Contributions**

Participants may make before-tax contributions up to 60 percent of their annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. This maximum percentage may be reduced by the plan administrator in certain circumstances. Eligible employees who have reached age 50 during the plan year may elect to make catch-up contributions, as limited by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”). The Plan also permits rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans. Employee contributions to the Plan are made through regular payroll deductions.

The Plan is operating pursuant to the safe harbor provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k)(12). The Company’s safe harbor matching contributions are on an annual basis and will equal 100 percent of elective deferrals up to 6 percent of plan compensation. The Company has the right to designate all or a portion of the matching safe harbor contributions as qualified. To the extent matching contributions are so designated, they are nonforfeitable and may not be withdrawn from the Plan prior to separation from service or attainment of age 59½. Safe harbor contributions totaled \$1,116,666 and \$998,205 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Newly eligible employees who do not affirmatively elect to have a specific deferral percentage contributed or opt out of deferring into the Plan will automatically have 3 percent of their eligible compensation deferred into the Plan, escalating yearly by 1 percent on April 1 of each year until deferral reaches 6 percent of their salary.

**Contributions (Continued)**

The Company has the option to contribute a discretionary profit-sharing contribution in an amount to be determined by the Company. In order to be eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contribution, the employee must be employed on the last day of the plan year and have met all other eligibility requirements. The Company declared \$796,090 and \$534,837, in discretionary contribution, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participants are eligible to defer, on an after-tax basis through regular payroll deductions, a portion of eligible compensation as Roth 401(k) deductions. Provided requirements are met, withdrawals of contributions, and any earnings are tax free to the participant. A participant's combined pretax and Roth 401(k) contributions cannot exceed the maximum annual amount allowed by law.

**Participant Investment Account Options**

The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and money market funds as investment options for participants. Each investment option has its own investment strategy, which can be obtained through the prospectus of the respective fund. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer safe harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon.

The Company's discretionary contributions and the earnings or losses thereon not fully vested when contributed will vest as follows:

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balances reduced by the highest outstanding note receivable balance in the participant's account during the prior 12-month period. Participants may have a maximum of one note receivable outstanding at any given time. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or various installment annuities. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

The Plan allows in-service distributions and partial distributions to participants age 59½ or older who have not terminated employment with the plan sponsor. The Plan also provides for hardship withdrawals for defined hardship events. The Plan allows in-plan Roth conversions. Furthermore, the Plan allows for terminated participant vested account balances of \$1,000 or less to be automatically distributed. The IRS has required minimum distributions once a participant reaches age 70½ during the previous plan year and is no longer employed by the Company.

**Forfeitures**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$4,911 and \$19,445, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to reduce Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan applied \$20,268 and \$0, respectively, of forfeited non-vested accounts to reduce employer contributions.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussions of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are not included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**NOTE 3 - INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE**

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule are complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Schedule of assets (held at end of year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds and money market funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds and money market funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily Net Asset Value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds and money market funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

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**NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain plan assets are shares of mutual funds and money market funds managed by Fidelity or its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines. The Plan made direct payments to Fidelity of \$8,101 and \$3,192, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. In addition, the Plan provides for loans to participants, which are also party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. The Company paid certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan. These transactions, as well as participant notes receivable, also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

**NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION**

While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan document and ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

**NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted the Fidelity Volume Submitter Defined Contribution Plan. The IRS has determined that the volume submitter 401(k) savings plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC and informed the trustee of such in a letter dated June 30, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Administrator believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, 39% and 37% of the Plan's investments were invested in three mutual funds, respectively.

The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

#### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors’ report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on these financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

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**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Discovery Natural Resources LLC Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Discovery Natural Resources, LLC (the "Company"). The Plan is available to all employees on the first day of the month following their hire date. Employees who are under a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, or nonresident aliens and all irregular employees, including, without limitation, seasonal employees, student interns, and employees under student cooperative programs, are not eligible to participate in the Plan unless they complete 1,000 hours of service in a year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan is administered by the plan administrator. The plan administrator has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The plan administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Company administers the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") serves as trustee, manages plan assets, and maintains the Plan's records.

Effective February 1, 2023, the Plan amended to allow for a change in investment options. The amendment also shifts the responsibility of approving hardship withdrawals from the Company to Fidelity. Effective October 1, 2024, the Plan amended to expand rollover contribution eligibility for employees who have yet to satisfy all eligibility requirements. Further the Plan amended to allow in-plan Roth conversions.

**Contributions**

Participants may make before-tax contributions up to 60 percent of their annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. This maximum percentage may be reduced by the plan administrator in certain circumstances. Eligible employees who have reached age 50 during the plan year may elect to make catch-up contributions, as limited by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). The Plan also permits rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans. Employee contributions to the Plan are made through regular payroll deductions.

The Plan is operating pursuant to the safe harbor provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k)(12). The Company's safe harbor matching contributions are on an annual basis and will equal 100 percent of elective deferrals up to 6 percent of plan compensation. The Company has the right to designate all or a portion of the matching safe harbor contributions as qualified. To the extent matching contributions are so designated, they are nonforfeitable and may not be withdrawn from the Plan prior to separation from service or attainment of age 59½. Safe harbor contributions totaled \$1,116,666 and \$998,205 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Newly eligible employees who do not affirmatively elect to have a specific deferral percentage contributed or opt out of deferring into the Plan will automatically have 3 percent of their eligible compensation deferred into the Plan, escalating yearly by 1 percent on April 1 of each year until deferral reaches 6 percent of their salary.

**Contributions (Continued)**

The Company has the option to contribute a discretionary profit-sharing contribution in an amount to be determined by the Company. In order to be eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contribution, the employee must be employed on the last day of the plan year and have met all other eligibility requirements. The Company declared \$796,090 and \$534,837, in discretionary contribution, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participants are eligible to defer, on an after-tax basis through regular payroll deductions, a portion of eligible compensation as Roth 401(k) deductions. Provided requirements are met, withdrawals of contributions, and any earnings are tax free to the participant. A participant's combined pretax and Roth 401(k) contributions cannot exceed the maximum annual amount allowed by law.

**Participant Investment Account Options**

The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and money market funds as investment options for participants. Each investment option has its own investment strategy, which can be obtained through the prospectus of the respective fund. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer safe harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon.

The Company's discretionary contributions and the earnings or losses thereon not fully vested when contributed will vest as follows:

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balances reduced by the highest outstanding note receivable balance in the participant's account during the prior 12-month period. Participants may have a maximum of one note receivable outstanding at any given time. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or various installment annuities. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

The Plan allows in-service distributions and partial distributions to participants age 59½ or older who have not terminated employment with the plan sponsor. The Plan also provides for hardship withdrawals for defined hardship events. The Plan allows in-plan Roth conversions. Furthermore, the Plan allows for terminated participant vested account balances of \$1,000 or less to be automatically distributed. The IRS has required minimum distributions once a participant reaches age 70½ during the previous plan year and is no longer employed by the Company.

**Forfeitures**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$4,911 and \$19,445, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to reduce Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan applied \$20,268 and \$0, respectively, of forfeited non-vested accounts to reduce employer contributions.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussions of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are not included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**NOTE 3 - INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE**

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule are complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Schedule of assets (held at end of year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds and money market funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds and money market funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily Net Asset Value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds and money market funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

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**NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain plan assets are shares of mutual funds and money market funds managed by Fidelity or its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines. The Plan made direct payments to Fidelity of \$8,101 and \$3,192, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. In addition, the Plan provides for loans to participants, which are also party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. The Company paid certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan. These transactions, as well as participant notes receivable, also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

**NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION**

While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan document and ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

**NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted the Fidelity Volume Submitter Defined Contribution Plan. The IRS has determined that the volume submitter 401(k) savings plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC and informed the trustee of such in a letter dated June 30, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Administrator believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, 39% and 37% of the Plan's investments were invested in three mutual funds, respectively.
