Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying 2021 financial statements of Unisys Supplemental Unemployment Benefits Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The 2021 financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended, including the related notes (collectively referred to as the "2021 financial statements").

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's 2021 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying 2021 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.
- the information in the accompanying 2021 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant

ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

As discussed in Note 2 to the financial statements, the financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Other Matter – 2020 Financial Statements

We were engaged to audit the 2020 financial statements of the Plan, which comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2020, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended. As permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the plan administrator instructed us not to perform, and we did not perform, any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by a qualified institution. In our report dated October 1, 2021, we indicated that (a) because of the significance of the information that we did not audit, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion and accordingly, we did not express an opinion on the 2020 financial statements, and (b) the form and content of the information included in the 2020 financial statements, other than that derived from the certified information, were presented in compliance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2, and for determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report

that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with US GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with US GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

(1) Description of the Plan

The following description of the Unisys Supplemental Unemployment Benefits Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the summary plan description and plan document (and any subsequent summaries of material modifications and amendments) for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a noncontributory welfare benefit plan that is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

(a) *Eligibility*

Employees are eligible for payments under the Plan if, immediately before the receipt of notice of an involuntary workforce reduction or layoff, the employee was a nonbargaining U.S. employee in an active employment status as a regular full-time or part-time employee of Unisys Corporation, other than the Unisys Technical Services Division (the Company).

In order to receive benefits for the duration to which a participant is entitled, the participant must periodically confirm with the Plan's recordkeeper that he or she continues to meet the eligibility requirements, which is continued unemployment.

(b) *Contributions*

Contributions to the Plan, which are funded weekly by the Company, are invested by the Plan in assets held in a trust (the Trust). The Bank of New York Mellon (the Trustee) invests the funds as set forth in the trust agreement. Contributions are determined based upon anticipated weekly payments.

(c) *Benefit Payments*

The Plan provides for the payment of supplemental unemployment benefits. The benefit paid is generally equal to the participant's weekly base rate of pay as of the effective date of the workforce reduction or layoff, subject to certain adjustments.

Benefits paid by the Plan are reduced by the participant's initial state unemployment compensation benefit. The duration of benefits is based on the number of completed whole years of service between the participant's most recent date of hire or rehire (except in certain instances, as defined in the Plan) and the participant's separation date. All participants in the Plan receive one week of benefits for each completed whole year of service, with a minimum amount of two weeks, and a maximum amount of 26 weeks.

(d) *Plan Termination*

The Company may amend or terminate the Plan at any time. Upon termination, the remaining assets shall be used until exhausted to make required benefit payments.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) *Basis of Accounting*

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are presented on the modified cash basis of accounting. Expenses are recorded when paid, and contributions are recorded when received.

(b) *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurement. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received.

(c) *Benefit Payments*

Benefit payments are recorded on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits when paid to participants.

(d) *Administrative Expenses*

All reasonable expenses related to the administration and operation of the Plan (including, but not limited to, payment for outside legal, accounting, and other necessary services), to the extent not paid by the Company, are payable from the Trust. The Plan Sponsor pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the plan.

(e) *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements requires the Plan to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amount of assets reported in the financial statements and benefit obligations and changes therein disclosed in the accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) *Subsequent Events*

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through December 19, 2022, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Certified Financial Information

The Trustee holds the Plan's investments and executes investment transactions. All of the investment balances and related investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements (modified cash basis) and supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2021 and 2020, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee. Information in the notes to the financial statements, and the accompanying supplemental schedules were also certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that encourages the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value, but allows for unobservable inputs when observable inputs do not exist. The following provides a description of the three levels of inputs used to measure fair value under FASB ASC 820 and the types of Plan investments.

Level 1 – Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Company can access at the measurement date.

Registered Investment Companies

These investments are valued using the readily determinable fair value (RDFV) provided by the Trustee. The fair value per share is published and is the basis for current transactions.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.

The Plan has no Level 2 investments.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The Plan has no Level 3 investments.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

(6) Income Tax Status

The Trust funding the Plan has received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated August 4, 2006, stating that the Trust is tax exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)(17) of the Internal Revenue Code, as a supplemental unemployment benefits trust. The Plan and Trust are required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status of the Trust. The Plan has been amended since receiving the exemption letter. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan and Trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the related Trust is tax exempt.

The Plan Administrator has not identified any uncertain tax positions which would require adjustment to or disclosure in the Plan's financial statements as of December 31, 2021 or 2020. The IRS has the ability to examine the Plan's tax return filings for all open tax years, which is generally the three prior years; however, there are currently no audits for any open tax periods in progress.
