### **Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

## Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

### **1. Plan Description**

The following description of Milo's Tea Company, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreements for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Milo's Tea Company, Inc. (the Company) who have three months of service and are age 19 or older. The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Company's Board of Directors. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Effective January 1, 2020, the Plan changed the service requirement for eligibility from one year of service to three months of service and allowed participants of the Plan to take a loan from their account based on provisions in the Plan agreements.

#### **Contributions**

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan agreements. Participants are also permitted to contribute Roth after-tax deferrals to the Plan. A participant may elect to make all pre-tax, all Roth or combination deferrals each pay period. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers). The Company annually contributes to participants who are 19 years of age or older and have completed at least one year of service an amount equal to the sum of 100% of the amount of the participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of the participant's compensation, as defined, plus 50% of the amount of the participant's elective deferrals that exceed 3% of the participant's compensation but do not exceed 5% of the participant's compensation. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

#### **Investment Options**

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct all contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan administrator in 1% increments. Participants may change their investment options daily.

### 1. Plan Description (continued)

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contribution and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and in the Company's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

#### Payment of Benefits

The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, reaches retirement age, or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains age 59½. Benefits are payable in lump-sum payments with certain exceptions allowed.

#### Participant Loans

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. Loan terms range up to five years or over a reasonable period of time for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, as established by the Plan administrator at the time of the loan. The loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participant's accounts and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. These rates range from 5.25% to 10.50% on loans outstanding at December 31, 2024, and mature through 2030. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. If the loan is not repaid, it will automatically be treated as a distribution to the participant after three months.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

### **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded when earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are recorded when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make the scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant to be in default, the participant's note receivable is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded based on the terms of the Plan. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024.

#### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to the administration of notes receivable that are charged directly to the participant's account and certain recordkeeping fees paid by the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through September 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### 3. Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants reported and disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (Custodian).

### 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

*Level 1:* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2:* Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets

- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3:* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### **Pooled Separate Accounts**

Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares in each account held by the Plan at year end. The net asset value is not a publicly-quoted price in an active market. The NAV, as provided by the insurance carrier, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value.

- (a) The John Hancock Multimanager Lifetime funds in this category seek a high total return through the fund's target retirement date, with a greater focus on income beyond the target date. Total return is the combination of income and capital appreciation, interest, capital gains, dividends, and distributions realized over a given period of time. The fund is a “fund of funds” as it invests its assets in a combination of the Franklin Income Fund, Franklin Mutual Shares Fund and Templeton Growth Fund (underlying funds) on a fixed percentage basis. It makes equal allocations to each of the underlying funds. The John Hancock Multimanager Lifestyle Growth Fund – G.I.F.L. in this category seeks long-term growth of capital, with current income as a secondary consideration. The fund invests approximately 20% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in fixed-income securities and approximately 80% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in equity securities. The John Hancock Multimanager Lifestyle Balanced Fund – G.I.F.L. in this category seeks a balance between a high level of current income and growth of capital, with a greater emphasis on growth of capital. The fund normally invests approximately 40% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in fixed- income securities and approximately 60% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in equity securities.
- (c) The equity income and growth funds in this category seek to provide long-term growth of capital as well as substantial dividend income by investing primarily in U.S. equity securities. The value fund in this category seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in equity securities selected on the basis of fundamental investment research for their long-term appreciation potential and which are considered undervalued by fund managers. The disciplined value fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital and income by primarily investing in equity securities. The John Hancock 500 Index Fund in this category attempts to approximate the aggregate total return of a broad-based US domestic equity market index. The fund invests in at least 80% of its net assets at the time of investment in the common stocks that are included in the S&P 500 Index and securities. The Fundamental All Cap Core Fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital. The Capital Appreciation Fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital. The fund invests at least 65% of its total assets in equity and equity-related securities of companies, at the time of investment, that exceed \$1 billion in market capitalization and that the manager believes have above average growth prospects. The Fundamental Investors Fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital and income. The fund invests primarily in common stocks of companies that appear to offer superior opportunities for capital growth and most of which have a history of paying dividends. The Fidelity Contra Fund in this category seeks capital appreciation. It invests primarily in common stocks, particularly securities of companies whose values the advisor believes are not fully recognized by the public. Washington Mutual Investors Fund in this category seeks to produce income and to

provide the opportunity for growth of principal consistent with sound common stock investing. The fund invests primarily in common stocks of established companies that are listed on, or meet the financial listing requirements of, the New York Stock Exchange and have a strong record of earnings and dividends. The MFS Massachusetts Investors Fund in this category seeks capital appreciation by primarily investing in equity securities. While it may invest the fund's assets in companies of any size, the fund primarily invests in companies with large capitalizations.

- (d) The Vanguard Short-Term Federal Fund in this category seeks current income while maintaining limited price volatility. The fund invests at least 80% of its assets in short-term bonds issued or guaranteed by the U.S. government and its agencies and instrumentalities, many of which are not backed by the full faith and credit of the U.S. government. It is expected to maintain a dollar-weighted average maturity of 1 to 4 years. The Strategic Income Opportunities Fund in this category seeks a high level of current income. The fund normally invests primarily in the following types of securities: foreign government and corporate debt securities from developed and emerging markets, U.S. government and agency securities, and high-yield bonds. It may also invest in preferred stock and other types of debt securities. There is no limit on the fund's average maturity.
- (e) The index funds in this category seek to approximate the aggregate total return of a mid cap U.S. domestic equity market index. The value funds in this category seek capital appreciation by primarily investing in the equity securities of mid-sized companies with public stock market capitalizations within the range of the market capitalization of companies comprising the CRSP U.S. Mid Cap Value Index in the same proportions as represented by the index at the time of investment. The growth funds in this category seek long-term capital appreciation by primarily investing in the equity securities of mid cap companies whose earnings are expected to grow at a faster rate than the average company. The advisor attempts to replicate the CRSP U.S. Mid Cap Growth Index by investing all, or substantially all, of its assets in the stocks that make up the index, holding each stock in approximately the same proportion as its weighting in the index. The leveraged company fund in this category seeks capital appreciation by primarily investing in equity securities of leveraged companies. The American Century Heritage Fund in this category seeks long-term capital growth. The fund normally invests in stocks of medium-sized companies that the advisor believes will increase in value over time.

- (f) The value fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in the equity securities of smaller-sized companies with public stock market capitalizations within the range of the market capitalization of companies constituting the Russell 2000 Value Index at the time of investment. The growth funds in this category seek long-term growth of capital by investing primarily in equity securities of smaller-sized companies that the fund managers believe will increase in value over time. DFA U.S. Targeted Value fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation. The fund purchases a broad and diverse group of the readily marketable securities of U.S. small and mid cap companies that the advisor determines to be value stocks with higher profitability. The Keeley Small Cap Value Fund in this category seeks capital appreciation. The fund invests in equity securities of companies with a small market capitalization and that currently pay, or are reasonably expected to pay, dividends to shareholders. The Vanguard Small Cap Growth Index Fund in this category attempts to invest in securities comprising the CRSP US Small Cap Growth Index in the same proportions as they are represented in that Index. The Vanguard Small Cap Value Index Fund in this category attempts to invest in securities comprising the CRSP US Small Cap Value Index in the same proportions as they are represented in that Index. The Royce Opportunity Fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital by investing in equity securities of small and micro-cap companies with stock market capitalizations up to \$3 billion in an attempt to take advantage of what the advisor believes are opportunistic situations for undervalued securities. The Vanguard Explorer Fund in this category seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation by investing in stocks of small and mid-size companies that tend to be unseasoned but are considered to have superior growth potential.
- (g) The growth funds in this category seek long-term growth of capital by investing primarily in equity securities outside of the United States of America, including emerging markets. The John Hancock International Small Cap Fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation by investing in equity securities of smaller companies outside the U.S., including emerging markets, which have total stock market capitalizations or annual revenues of \$4 billion or less. DFA International Value Fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation by purchasing securities of large companies associated with developed market countries that have been designated as approved markets. The Franklin Mutual Global Discovery Fund in this category seeks capital appreciation. The fund invests primarily in equity securities of U.S. and foreign companies that the investment manager believes are available at market prices less than their value based on certain recognized or objective criteria (intrinsic value). The Invesco Oppenheimer Global Fund and Templeton World Fund in this category seek long-term capital growth. The funds invest mainly in

common stock of U.S. and foreign companies, including developed or emerging markets. The American Funds New Perspective Fund in this category seeks long-term growth of capital and future income as a secondary objective. The fund seeks to take advantage of investment opportunities generated by changes in international trade patterns and economic and political relationships by investing in common stocks of companies located around the world. The fund invests in common stocks with the potential for growth and common stocks with the potential to pay dividends in the future.

- (h) The funds in this category seek long-term capital appreciation. The fund invests at least 80% of its net assets in equity securities of companies engaged in the research, development, production, or distribution of products or services related to health care, medicine, or the life sciences and companies expected to benefit from the development and use of science and/or technology.
- (i) The asset strategy funds in this category seek to provide total return through a combination of capital appreciation and current income. The balanced funds in this category seek to provide current income, long-term growth of capital and income, and preservation of capital. The income funds in this category seek to provide current income first and capital growth second. The allocation funds in this category seek the highest level of total return consistent with their asset mix. The funds' asset allocation strategies diversify investments among equity securities, bonds and money instruments in an amount dependent upon whether they are classified as aggressive, moderate or conservative.
- (j) The funds in this category seek growth of capital. The funds invest at least 80% of their net assets in gold and other equity securities of companies that are principally engaged in financial services.
- (k) The fund in this category seeks capital growth and current income. The fund invests at least 80% of its net assets in equity securities of companies in the utilities industry.
- (l) The fund in this category seeks to provide a high total investment return through a combination of capital appreciation and current income. The fund invests in equity securities issued by real estate investment trusts and companies engaged in the real estate industry.

- (m) The fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation. The funds invest at least 80% of their net assets in equity securities of companies that are principally engaged in activities in the energy industry, such as the exploration, production, and transmission of energy or energy fuels; the making and servicing of component products for such activities; energy research; and energy conservation or pollution control.
- (n) The Invesco Oppenheimer Developing Markets Fund in this category seeks capital appreciation by investing in common stocks of issuers in developing and emerging markets throughout the world. The American Funds New World Fund in this category seeks long-term capital appreciation by primarily investing in common stocks of companies with significant exposure to countries with developing economies and/or markets.

To assess the appropriate classification of investments within the fair value hierarchy, the availability of market data is monitored. Changes in economic conditions or valuation techniques may require the transfer of investments from one fair value level to another.

The Plan evaluates the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the investment and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits.

#### 5. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan holds units of pooled separate accounts managed by the Custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

#### 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

### **7. Tax Status**

The underlying prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the written form of the underlying prototype document is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code, and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### **8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
