### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Capital Cardiology Associates, P.C. Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

As discussed in Note 1a to the financial statements, effective January 1, 2025, the Plan's Trustees executed a Merger and Transfer Agreement to transfer and assign the Plan's assets to the Cardiology Management Holdings Retirement Plan (CMH Plan). All contributions to the Plan were discontinued as of January 1, 2025, and on January 31, 2025, participant balances were transferred to the CMH Plan. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## Note 1. Description of Plan

The Capital Cardiology Associates, P.C. Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan (Plan) was formed effective May 1, 2002. The Plan is sponsored by Capital Cardiology Associates, P.C. (Company) and was restated effective June 1, 2021.

The following is a brief description of the Plan and is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### a. Plan Merger

During July 2023, the Company was acquired by Cardiology Management Holdings, LLC. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan's Trustees executed a Merger and Transfer Agreement to transfer and assign the Plan's assets to the Cardiology Management Holdings Retirement Plan (CMH Plan). All contributions to the Plan were discontinued as of January 1, 2025, and on January 31, 2025, participant balances were transferred to the CMH Plan.

### b. General

The Plan is a profit sharing plan with a 401(k) feature, covering all eligible employees of Capital Cardiology Associates, P.C. and related employers (collectively referred to as the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

As of December 31, 2024, plan assets were held and administered by Fidelity Management Trust Company, Trustee of the Plan. Company contributions, participant elective deferrals, and participant accounts were also held by the Trustee, which invested cash received and income from investments based on written instructions from the Company and participants and made distributions to participants. The Company's Board of Directors and the Plan Trustee were responsible for oversight of the Plan and for determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

### c. Contributions

Each year, participants could contribute a percentage or fixed-dollar amount of their pretax annual compensation, subject to certain limitations as defined by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Effective November 2023, participants could also contribute after-tax Roth elective contributions to the Plan. The maximum participant deferral was \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who reached age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions up to a maximum of \$7,500 for both years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Participants could also contribute rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Company contributions included a 3% fully vested non-elective contribution, pursuant to a safe harbor election, and could also include (i) a matching contribution equal to a uniform percentage of salary deferrals not to exceed 4% of participant compensation, and (ii) a discretionary profit sharing contribution.

Discretionary profit sharing contributions, if any, were allocated among participants based on a group allocation formula. Contributions allocated to each group were discretionary and determined annually by the Board of Directors. Participants shared in the Company's discretionary profit sharing contribution regardless of their employment status at the end of the Plan year and the amount of service they completed during the Plan year.

The Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions totaled \$1,126,495 and \$1,864,319 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company's 3% non-elective safe harbor contribution was based on the employees' compensation for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and subject to the same compensation limit described above. The Company's non-elective safe harbor contributions totaled \$925,509 and \$901,947 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company did not make a discretionary matching contribution for the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Participants directed their contributions and Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

*d. Plan Eligibility*

In general, employees were eligible to participate in the Plan after reaching age 21 and completing one year of continuous service in which they worked at least 1,000 hours. After eligibility requirements were met, participants could enter the Plan at the next entry date. The entry dates of the Plan were January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. The normal retirement age was the later of age 65 or the fifth anniversary of the participant's employment commencement date.

*e. Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocable share of: (a) the Company's safe harbor non-elective contribution; (b) the Company's discretionary profit sharing and matching contributions (if any); (c) the Plan's investment earnings (losses), net of investment expenses; and (d) administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

*f. Vesting*

Participants were immediately 100% vested in their contributions and the Company's safe harbor non-elective contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions was based on years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested upon: (1) completing three years of credited service; (2) disability; (3) death; (4) normal retirement; or (5) termination of the Plan. If a participant's employment with the Company was terminated before their normal retirement age for any reason other than disability or death, the participant was entitled to an amount equal to the vested amount of his or her account balance. There was no partial vesting of benefits.

*g. Notes Receivable From Participants*

Participants could borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. In addition, the \$50,000 limit was reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance (of any previous loans made) in the previous 12 months. Participant notes were secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the local prevailing rate. Principal and interest were paid ratably through regular payroll deductions. In general, loans must be repaid within five years. Outstanding loans as of the date the Plan merged with the CMH Plan were automatically transferred to the CMH Plan.

*h. Payment of Benefits*

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant, or the beneficiary upon the participant's death, may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution, in installment payments, or as a rollover to another plan, or to defer the distribution to a later date. If the vested portion of a participant's account balance is less than \$5,000 (\$7,000 as of January 1, 2024) but greater than \$1,000, and the distribution takes place before the participant's normal retirement age, the amount will be distributed to an Individual Retirement Account for the participant's benefit as soon as possible following termination or disability, or to the beneficiary following their death. If the value of a participant's vested interest in their account is less than \$1,000, a lump-sum distribution will be made for the participant as soon as administratively feasible following termination, disability or retirement, or to the beneficiary following their death.

Prior to termination, a participant may receive a distribution in the event of undue financial hardship, subject to the provisions of the Plan. The Plan also provides for in-service distributions for participants who have reached age 59½, subject to the provisions of the Plan.

### *i. Forfeiture Accounts and Revenue Sharing Credits*

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$27,099 and \$24,305, respectively. Forfeitures are used to pay administrative expenses and reduce the Company's discretionary profit sharing contribution, if any. Forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses were \$231 and \$18,943 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions totaled approximately \$108,200 for the year ended December 31, 2024. There were no forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2023.

The Plan earns revenue-sharing credits from certain mutual funds based on the invested balances, which are included in Plan assets. The credits may be used to pay reasonable and permitted administrative expenses or be allocated to participant accounts. There were no credits used to pay Plan expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023. The balance in the Plan's revenue-sharing account was approximately \$700 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

## **Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### *a. Basis of Accounting*

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) for defined contribution plans.

### *b. Contributions*

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

### *c. Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### *d. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value, which is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. The Plan Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and Trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

#### e. Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are stated at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Loans treated as distributions totaled \$18,371 and \$978 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

#### f. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### g. Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and certain types of distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

#### h. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition or disclosure through September 5, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued (see Note 1a).

### Note 3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years then ended, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee of the Plan.

### Note 4. Investments and Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

*Level 1:* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2:* Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset.

*Level 3:* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common stock:* Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual security is traded. These securities are included within the self-directed brokerage accounts.

*Certificates of deposit:* Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value. Certificates of deposit are included within the self-directed brokerage accounts.

*Cash, held for investment:* The carrying amounts of cash approximate fair value because of the short maturity of these instruments. Cash held for investment is included within the self-directed brokerage accounts.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Accounts consist of mutual funds, common stock, certificates of deposit and cash held for investment.

*Common/collective trust fund:* The NAV, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Sales and redemptions of participant units are transacted at such NAVs and may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal (for up to 12 months) in order to ensure that the securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There were no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

## Note 6. Tax Status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## Note 7. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Company paid for certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan totaling approximately \$15,200 for the year ended December 31, 2024. There were no administrative expenses paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2023.

Certain Plan administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company who do not receive compensation for such functions from the Plan.

Several Plan investments are managed by the Trustee of the Plan.
