**(1) DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

Laborde Marine Management, LLC (the Company) maintains a defined contribution pension plan for the benefit of the employees of the Company. The following description of the Laborde Marine Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a single-employer defined contribution plan meeting the requirements of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code covering all eligible employees of the Company who are age eighteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participant contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Code limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trust and a money market account.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. This provision has a default deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. The deferral rate will increase each year by 1% up to 10% until participant elects to change the deferral rate.

The Company may, at its discretion, make contributions to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan elected to match 50% of a participant's contributions up to 4% with a maximum match of 2%.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Company's matching contribution, Plan earnings (losses), and charged with allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Plan earnings are allocated to individual participant accounts based on the value of each individual participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching portion is based on years of continuous service with a participant being 25% vested after one year and 100% vested after four years. However, employees hired prior to July 1, 2011, are 100% vested for grandfathered matching and profit sharing contributions; and employees hired prior to June 1, 2013 are 50% vested after one year and 100% vested after two years for discretionary match and discretionary profit sharing contributions. As of December 31, 2015, it was determined that a partial plan termination occurred and all participants in the Plan at that time became fully vested.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts up to 50% of their vested account balance, with the maximum loan not to exceed \$50,000. The minimum amount a participant can borrow is \$1,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 3.25% to 8.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through semi-monthly payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution or installment payment equal to the value of his or her vested account balance. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Benefit payments are distributed to participants or their beneficiaries as soon as practical.

**(2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting; however, benefits are recorded when paid.

**Contribution Receivables**

Contribution receivables are recorded for amounts that are outstanding from the Plan at year end. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no participant contribution receivables.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

**Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Forfeited Accounts**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$25,328 and \$2,426, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce future matching contributions of the Company. A total of \$15,448 and \$12,841 were used to pay Plan administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Date of Management's Review**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through August 29, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the mutual funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

**Administration Expenses**

The employer sponsor paid substantially all administrative fees on behalf of the Plan during the year either directly or through the use of forfeited employer contributions.

**(3) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in the active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures the fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of the fair value.

**Level 1 Fair Value Measurements**

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. The following tables set forth, by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investments at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

**(4) NET ASSET VALUE (NAV) AS FAIR VALUE**

Common collective trust funds are comprised of units in such collective trust funds that are not publicly traded. The underlying assets in these funds (common stock, preferred stock, collective investment funds, U.S. Government and Agency Obligations, debt instruments, insurance investment contracts, global wrap synthetic investment contracts, securities lending funds, repurchase agreements, futures contracts, and foreign currency contracts) are valued where applicable on exchanges and price quotes for the assets held by these funds are readily available. When current market prices or quotations are not available, valuations are determined using valuation models adopted by the Custodian or other inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data. Common collective trust funds are valued at their net asset value (NAV) on the last day of the calendar year of the period; as a result, these investments are not classified within the fair value hierarchy.

Investments in common collective trust funds are valued at the net value of participation units held by the Plan at year-end. The value of these units is determined by the Custodian based on the current market values of the underlying assets of the common collective trust fund as based on information reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statements of the common collective trust fund at year end. The Plan held collective trust funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023 as described below.

The objective of the Wilmington Trust, N.A. Stable Value Fund R1, common collective trust fund is to provide a guaranteed rate of return and a return of principal that is backed by Great-West Life and Annuity Insurance Company (Great-West) general investment account. Investment income is accrued as earned and is not distributed, but reinvested and unit values adjusted accordingly. This fund invests entirely in the Great-West Guaranteed Funding Agreements 599950-01 and 599954-01 which consists of separately managed investment portfolios directed by Wilmington Trust, N.A. This fund is a bank collective trust fund for which Wilmington Trust, N.A. serves as the trustee and investment manager. This fund is not FDIC-insured or registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. There are no unfunded commitments and no withdrawal restrictions.

The objective of the Great Gray Trust T. Rowe Price Retirement Date Trust Fee Class R1, common collective trust fund is designed for investors expecting to retire around the year indicated in each fund's name. The funds are managed to gradually become more conservative over time as they approach their target date. The investment risk of each target date fund changes over time as its asset allocation changes. They are subject to the volatility of the financial markets, including that of equity and fixed income investments in the U.S. and abroad, and may be subject to risks associated with investing in high-yield, small-cap, and foreign securities. Principal invested is not guaranteed at any time, including at or after their target dates.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes the valuation methodologies are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain investments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**(5) RELATED PARTY/PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity). Fidelity is the trustee of the Plan; therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**(6) PLAN TERMINATION**

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

**(7) TAX STATUS**

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the prototype plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The prototype plan document was adopted by the Plan on February 1, 2022 and amended in 2022.

Management has analyzed the Plan's tax positions taken on Federal income tax returns for all open tax years (current and prior three years) and has concluded that as of December 31, 2023, no provision for income tax is required in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan's Federal tax return for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired are subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service.

**(7) TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)**

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was enacted, encompassing a suite of retirement provisions colloquially termed "SECURE 2.0." This legislative package builds upon the foundational reforms introduced by the 2019 SECURE Act, with a central aim of expanding participation in the retirement ecosystem and enhancing avenues for asset accumulation. The provisions set forth by SECURE 2.0 will be progressively effective from 2023 onwards.

The Act presents a blend of mandatory and elective provisions. Plan and Company management will evaluate and decide upon the elective components in alignment with the Plan's objectives and the best interests of participants and the Company. As of the report date, the Plan has not been formally amended to incorporate the provisions of SECURE 2.0. However, the Plan is operating in compliance with all mandatory elements as prescribed by the Act.

**(8) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**(9) INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE**

As pursuant to CFR 2520.103-8 the Plan qualified for an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit in 2024 and 2023. Information relating to investment assets, investment transactions, investment earnings and Schedule of Assets (Held at Year End) was certified as complete and accurate by the trustee, Fidelity Management Trust Company, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024.
