Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Emerus Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Emerus Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective January 1, 2015, as restated November 1, 2022. The Plan covers all employees of Emerus Holdings, Inc. and Subsidiaries (the Company, Employer, or Plan Administrator) who are age 21 or older. The Plan is a defined contribution plan and excludes leased employees, collectively-bargained employees, non-resident aliens who do not have U.S. source income, employees who are residents of Puerto Rico, covered employees acquired in an asset or stock acquisition, merger or similar transaction described in Code Section 410(b)(6)(C) excluded until the Employer extends coverage to them, and directors acting solely in that capacity, and any employee that is not paid from U.S. payroll employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Retirement Plan Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

During 2024, the Plan was amended to extend coverage to Christiana Care Emerus, LLC and WellSpan Health Neighborhood Hospitals, LLC as participating employers in the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions of 100% of each participant's elective deferrals up to 4% of eligible compensation. The Company may contribute an additional discretionary match. Discretionary profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Plan Sponsor. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no discretionary contributions to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company safe harbor matching contributions, allocations of the Company's discretionary contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, rollover contributions, the Company's safe harbor contributions and discretionary contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$1,774 and \$599, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and pay administrative expenses, as determined by the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Company contributions and administrative expenses were reduced by \$23 and \$775, respectively, from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined by plan admin based on the prevailing prime rate as of the date that precedes the loan request date, is set at 1 percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range up to five years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the note repayment period may not extend beyond ten years. Participants are allowed two outstanding notes.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installment payments as provided in the plan document. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of lump-sum cash payment. A participant may request a withdrawal from the Plan while still under employment of the Company at any time or upon attainment of age 59 1/2. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes to Financial Statements - Continued

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and T. Rowe Price Trust Company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Common Trust Funds

Investments in the common trust funds are required to be reported at fair value. These funds are composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts held by the fund's trustee. These contracts are not considered fully benefit-responsive to the Plan as the underlying contracts are not direct investments between the Plan and the issuer. The Plan has elected to value these funds using net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient to determine fair value.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the participant note balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation. Contributions from the Company, if any, are recorded based on the provisions of the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Recent Legislative Developments

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and is awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the IRS and Department of Labor. The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Recent Accounting Standards

The AICPA Financial Reporting Executive Committee (FinREC) approved enhance accounting updates related to accounting for revenue sharing arrangements in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) ASC No. 606, *Revenue from Contracts with Customers*. Revenue sharing amounts are not considered revenue under ASC No. 606 due to the fact that they are intended to reduce administrative costs for the plan and are not paid to the plan for delivering or producing goods, rendering services or undertaking other activities for the investment manager. A plan should consider all relevant facts and circumstances, including the terms of the agreement to determine the appropriate presentation of revenue sharing amounts. The presentation should be applied on a consistent basis. The adoption did not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through August 7, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. All subsequent events, if any, requiring recognition as of December 31, 2024, have been incorporated into these financial statements.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Investments measured at net asset value: Consisting of common trust funds, valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methodologies described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methodologies are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, T. Rowe Price Trust Company (T. Rowe), the Trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

5. Related-Party and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in the fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment.

T. Rowe receives revenue from investment fund service providers for services T. Rowe provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to T. Rowe for its administrative services to the Plan. If the revenue received by T. Rowe from such investment fund service providers exceeds the amount owed for its services, T. Rowe remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. The Plan or Plan Sponsor may make a payment to T. Rowe for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Revenue Share Income

The Plan maintains an unallocated ERISA budget account which holds ERISA budget account credits transferred to the Plan by the Plan's service provider in accordance with an ERISA Budget Account Agreement. For each year in which an ERISA Budget Account Agreement is in effect with a service provider, the Plan Administrator may, in its discretion, direct the service provider to either pay reasonable Plan administrative expenses with the ERISA budget account credits or allocate the ERISA budget account credits among the accounts of the participants with a balance in the Plan. December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of the ERISA budget account totaled \$107,381 and \$53,928 respectively.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, credits transferred to the ERISA budget account were \$49,400, and are recorded as other revenue on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Plan administrative expenses were reduced by \$232 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc.. The pre-approved plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated August 18, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and; therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

For the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances of \$1,174,110 were identified on the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions in a prior year and were not corrected prior to January 1, 2024. The prior year untimely remittances were corrected outside of the Department of Labor Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program in 2024. Additionally, the Company has compensated participants for lost earnings resulting from the delay in contributions.
