(1) DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

Analytic Stress Relieving, Inc. (the Company) maintains a defined contribution pension plan for the benefit of the employees of the Company. The following description of the Analytic Stress Relieving, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Company who are not represented by a bargaining unit, are not a nonresident alien, have six months of entry service, and are age 18 or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan up to the maximum annual dollar limit which is set by law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The maximum catch-up contribution for 2024 is \$7,500. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Matching and profit-sharing contributions are made at the discretion of the Company. The Company matches participants' elective contributions at the rate of 50% of the first 6% of compensation deferred by the participant. Matching contributions are limited to the maximum amount deductible under applicable provisions of the Code. There were no profit-sharing contributions made for 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contribution, investment earnings, and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portions of a participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contributions and discretionary profit-sharing contributions of their accounts is based on years of continuous service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant loans fund. Loan terms range from 1 - 5 years, are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator, ranging from 5.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon attainment of age 59 1/2 or upon disability, death, retirement, or termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installments in substantially equal amounts over a period of time, as defined by the Plan agreement. Hardship distributions will be distributed as a lump sum.

Forfeitures

Upon termination of employment, participants forfeit their non-vested balances. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions. The unallocated forfeiture balance as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was approximately \$9,115 and \$1,011, respectively, and forfeitures used to reduce employer matching contributions for 2024 and 2023 were approximately \$15,187 and \$2,547, respectively.

Hardship Withdrawals

Participants may withdraw their employee contributions in the event of hardship as defined in the Plan agreement. Employer matching and profit-sharing contributions are not allowed to be withdrawn in the event of hardship.

(2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP). All assets of the Plan are held by Reliance Trust Company and are participant driven.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, trustee and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The statement of changes in net assets available for benefits presents the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments which consists of realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal value plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants on March 11, 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Expenses include fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and certain record-keeping fees paid by the Plan. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Date of Management's Review

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 4, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in the active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments.

When available, the Plan measures the fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of the fair value.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

(4) NET ASSET VALUE (NAV) AS FAIR VALUE

Common collective trust funds are comprised of units in such collective trust funds that are not publicly traded. The underlying assets in these funds are valued where applicable on exchanges and price quotes for the assets held by these funds are readily available. When current market prices or quotations are not available, valuations are determined using valuation models adopted by the Custodian or other inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data. Common collective trust funds are valued at their net asset value (NAV) on the last day of the calendar year of the period; as a result, these investments are not classified within the fair value hierarchy.

The Invesco Stable Asset Fund (the “SA Fund”) includes security-backed investment contracts including synthetic investment contracts, guaranteed investment contracts and cash equivalents. The SA Fund is designed to preserve principal, provide a stable interest rate and provide daily liquidity at Net Asset Value (NAV) for participant withdrawals and transfers. The fair value of the SA Fund presented in the Plan’s financial statements is measured at NAV per share provided by the Trustee as a practical expedient. There are no unfunded commitments to the SA Fund.

Stable value funds invest in investment contracts and security-backed contracts. An investment contract is a contract issued by a financial institution to provide a stated rate of return to the buyer of the contract for a specified period of time. A security-backed contract has similar characteristics as a traditional investment contract and is comprised of two parts: the first part is a fixed-income security or portfolio of fixed-income securities; the second part is a contract value guarantee (“wrapper”) provided by a third party. Wrappers provide contract value payments for certain participant-initiated withdrawals and transfers, a floor crediting rate, and a return of fully accrued contract value at maturity. The issuer of the wrapper contract provides for withdrawals at the fund’s NAV for any normal benefit responsive requirements. In certain circumstances, the amount withdrawn from the wrapper contract would be payable at an amount less than NAV.

These events include termination of the Plan, a material adverse change to the provisions of the Plan, or the employer elects to withdraw from a wrapper contract. The Plan Administrator is not aware of the occurrence or likely occurrence of any such events, which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at NAV with participants.

Participant transactions (purchases and sales) with the SA Fund may occur daily at NAV, subject to limitations on transfer to a competing investment vehicle. The Plan’s continuing ability to transact with the SA Fund at NAV may be restricted or limited upon occurrence of certain Fund-level or Plan-level conditions or events, or with respect to transactions not initiated by the Plan participants. For example, the Company may decide to terminate the Plan’s offering of the SA Fund as a Plan investment option and fully withdraw all invested balances from the Funds. The Plan is restricted from withdrawing all assets from the SA Fund for a period of 12 months upon notification by the Company of its intent to do so under the terms of the participation agreement.

(5) EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

Contributions received from participants for 2024 are net of payments of \$66,972 made in 2024 to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral and match contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. That amount is also included in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024.

For the year ended December 31, 2023, excess contributions payable were \$14,563 based on the compliance testing results. However, upon payment, the amount included an additional \$372, which is included as corrective distributions in the Statement of Changes Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

(6) RELATED PARTY/PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ADP provides recordkeeping and administrative services related to plan administration, monitoring of plan and participant transactions, and the maintenance of covered plan and participant accounts, records, and statements. These services qualify the provider as a party-in-interest. Regions Bank provides investment and financial advisory services related to Plan assets. These transactions also qualify as party-in-interest.

(7) PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

(8) TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a prototype plan document and trust sponsored by Reliance Trust Company. The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the prototype plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Management has analyzed the Plan's tax positions taken on Federal income tax returns for all open tax years (current and prior three years) and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, no provision for income tax is required in the Plan's financial statements. (8) TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was enacted, encompassing a suite of retirement provisions colloquially termed "SECURE 2.0." This legislative package builds upon the foundational reforms introduced by the 2019 SECURE Act, with a central aim of expanding participation in the retirement ecosystem and enhancing avenues for asset accumulation. The provisions set forth by SECURE 2.0 will be progressively effective from 2023 onwards.

The Act presents a blend of mandatory and elective provisions. Plan and Organization management will evaluate and decide upon the elective components in alignment with the Plan's objectives and the best interests of participants and the Organization. As of the report date, the Plan has not been formally amended to incorporate the provisions of SECURE 2.0. However, the Plan is operating in compliance with all mandatory elements as prescribed by the Act.
