**1. Description of the Plan**

The following description of the VCheck Global LLC Retirement Savings Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provision. The Plan covers eligible employees of VCheck Global, LLC (the “Company”):

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees, not covered under certain collective bargaining agreements, who have completed three months of service and have attained age 18. Residents of Puerto Rico are excluded. The first possible entry date is the 1<sup>st</sup> day of each month following 3 months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

While the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company may terminate the Plan at any time.

**Compensation and Employee Contributions**

A participant may contribute up to 90% of total eligible compensation, subject to certain IRC limitations. Generally, eligible compensation for computing contributions under the Plan is the taxable compensation per the employee W2, excluding reimbursements, deferred compensation and other salary reduction contributions to Employer plans.

**Employer Contributions**

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions up to 100% of the first 4% contribution made by the Employee. This discretionary contribution was made on a biweekly frequency in 2024 and 2023 and was \$349,769 and \$313,683, respectively.

The Plan has a discretionary employer profit sharing contribution option which is a uniform percentage of eligible Plan compensation. No contributions have been made under this option.

**Participant Accounts**

Participants may elect to invest their contributions in any of the funds selected by the Company in accordance with the objectives stated in the Plan. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of the Company contributions, Company matching contributions and Plan earnings and losses, if any.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in all participant contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are immediately vested in the Company discretionary match.

Upon retirement, disability or death of a participant, the participant shall be deemed to be 100% vested in his entire account regardless of length of service. Forfeitures of non-vested account balances, if any, can be used to reduce the Company's contributions to the Plan. \$1,959 of the forfeiture account was used to fund administrative expenses in 2024 and was not used in 2023. The total forfeitures unused at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$0 and \$1,943 respectively.

**Distributions and withdrawals**

In the event of retirement, death, permanent disability or attainment of age 65, participants may make distributions either in a lump sum or in periodic payments over a period not to exceed life expectancy, as defined. A participant may also elect to receive in service distributions upon attainment of age 59 ½.

Distributions of automatic deferral amounts can be withdrawn within 90 days of the first automatic salary deferral made.

Participants may withdraw the sum of their salary reduction contributions due to hardship, medical care expenses, costs related to the purchase of a principal residence, payment of certain eligible tuition fees and certain other immediate and heavy financial needs as published by the Internal Revenue Service.

All distributions and withdrawals are subject to approval by the trustee.

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**Loans to participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the value of the participant's vested interest in the participant's account. Only one loan is allowed at a time and any existing loan has to be repaid prior to the funding of a new loan. Loan duration can range from 1 to 5 years and are due in full on termination. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at Prime plus 1%, fixed and as of December 31, 2024 the loan interest charged varies from 5.25% through 9.50%. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. Loan repayments are made directly from the participant to the Plan.

**Administrative Expenses**

The Plan pays for substantially all of the direct administrative expenses of the Plan.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on an accrual basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options by the participants in any of several combinations of stocks, bonds and mutual funds. Investments in mutual funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain mutual funds and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of the mutual funds, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement

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of net assets available for plan benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Related Party Transactions**

There are certain Plan investments that represent shares of mutual funds that are managed by Fidelity Investments (“Fidelity”). Transactions in these funds qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Equity and bond mutual funds are valued at the net unit value as reported by the Trustee at the Plan’s year-end. Shares of registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent net asset value as of the Plan’s year-end. Money market funds are valued at cost, which approximates fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend is recorded as received and included within net appreciation in fair value of investments. Capital gain distributions are included in dividend income. The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments.

**3. Information Certified by the Trustee**

All Plan assets and investment transactions, except for participant loan balances, contributions received and receivable have been certified by Fidelity as being complete and accurate for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

As permitted by Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, no auditing procedures were performed on the above information other than comparison with the information contained in the financial statements and schedules.

**4. Tax Status**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Fidelity Investments by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently

This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority level. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 2 or 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

**Level 1 Fair Value Measurements**

The fair value of the mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

**1. Description of the Plan**

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**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees, not covered under certain collective bargaining agreements, who have completed three months of service and have attained age 18. Residents of Puerto Rico are excluded. The first possible entry date is the 1<sup>st</sup> day of each month following 3 months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

While the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company may terminate the Plan at any time.

**Compensation and Employee Contributions**

A participant may contribute up to 90% of total eligible compensation, subject to certain IRC limitations. Generally, eligible compensation for computing contributions under the Plan is the taxable compensation per the employee W2, excluding reimbursements, deferred compensation and other salary reduction contributions to Employer plans.

**Employer Contributions**

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions up to 100% of the first 4% contribution made by the Employee. This discretionary contribution was made on a biweekly frequency in 2024 and 2023 and was \$349,769 and \$313,683, respectively.

The Plan has a discretionary employer profit sharing contribution option which is a uniform percentage of eligible Plan compensation. No contributions have been made under this option.

**Participant Accounts**

Participants may elect to invest their contributions in any of the funds selected by the Company in accordance with the objectives stated in the Plan. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of the Company contributions, Company matching contributions and Plan earnings and losses, if any.

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**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in all participant contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are immediately vested in the Company discretionary match.

Participants are vested as follows in the Company discretionary contributions as follows:

Upon retirement, disability or death of a participant, the participant shall be deemed to be 100% vested in his entire account regardless of length of service. Forfeitures of non-vested account balances, if any, can be used to reduce the Company's contributions to the Plan. \$1,959 of the forfeiture account was used to fund administrative expenses in 2024 and was not used in 2023. The total forfeitures unused at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$0 and \$1,943 respectively.

**Distributions and withdrawals**

In the event of retirement, death, permanent disability or attainment of age 65, participants may make distributions either in a lump sum or in periodic payments over a period not to exceed life expectancy, as defined. A participant may also elect to receive in service distributions upon attainment of age 59 ½.

Distributions of automatic deferral amounts can be withdrawn within 90 days of the first automatic salary deferral made.

Participants may withdraw the sum of their salary reduction contributions due to hardship, medical care expenses, costs related to the purchase of a principal residence, payment of certain eligible tuition fees and certain other immediate and heavy financial needs as published by the Internal Revenue Service.

All distributions and withdrawals are subject to approval by the trustee.

**Loans to participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the value of the participant's vested interest in the participant's account. Only one loan is allowed at a time and any existing loan has to be repaid prior to the funding of a new loan. Loan duration can range from 1 to 5 years and are due in full on termination. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at Prime plus 1%, fixed and as of December 31, 2024 the loan interest charged varies from 5.25% through 9.50%. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. Loan repayments are made directly from the participant to the Plan.

**Administrative Expenses**

The Plan pays for substantially all of the direct administrative expenses of the Plan.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on an accrual basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options by the participants in any of several combinations of stocks, bonds and mutual funds. Investments in mutual funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain mutual funds and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of the mutual funds, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement

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of net assets available for plan benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Related Party Transactions**

There are certain Plan investments that represent shares of mutual funds that are managed by Fidelity Investments (“Fidelity”). Transactions in these funds qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Equity and bond mutual funds are valued at the net unit value as reported by the Trustee at the Plan’s year-end. Shares of registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent net asset value as of the Plan’s year-end. Money market funds are valued at cost, which approximates fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend is recorded as received and included within net appreciation in fair value of investments. Capital gain distributions are included in dividend income. The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments.

**3. Information Certified by the Trustee**

All Plan assets and investment transactions, except for participant loan balances, contributions received and receivable have been certified by Fidelity as being complete and accurate for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

As permitted by Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, no auditing procedures were performed on the above information other than comparison with the information contained in the financial statements and schedules.

**4. Tax Status**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Fidelity Investments by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently

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designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2022.

**5. Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority level. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 2 or 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

**Level 1 Fair Value Measurements**

The fair value of the mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.
