### **Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements**

#### ***Opinion***

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 30, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended November 30, 2024 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust as of November 30, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended November 30, 2024 (in liquidation), in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). **NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan) (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Effective May 16, 2024, the Plan name changed to Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust.

**General**

Van's Aircraft, Inc. (Company) established the Plan effective January 1, 2003. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed the eligibility requirements including the completion of one year of service with 1,000 hours of service. An eligible employee will begin participation on the first day of each Plan year following the completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Plan purchased Company common stock using the proceeds of a note payable to the Company and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan (see Note 5). As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023 and for the period ended November 30, 2024 present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- (a) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (Allocated) and
- (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Contributions**

Each year, the Company may contribute to the Plan up to 25% of covered compensation as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions may be in the form of shares of common stock or cash. Contributions for each year are never less than the amount required to enable the Plan to discharge its current obligations, without regard to whether some or all of such contribution may fail to qualify for an income tax deduction by the Company. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Participant Accounts**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Plan earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

**Vesting**

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

**Voting Rights**

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Put Option**

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

**Diversification**

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

**Payment of Benefits**

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account and may take the form of a lump-sum distribution or annual installments over a period of five years, as determined by the Company. Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump-sum distribution of their account balance, without the participant's consent, if their vested balance does not exceed \$1,000. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in a cash and Company common stock.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Plan or the Plan Sponsor is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations. During period ended November 30, 2024, the Plan did not repurchase any shares.

**Forfeited Accounts**

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. There were no shares forfeited and allocated to remaining participants for the period ended November 30, 2024. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Company authorized the termination of the Plan effective May 16, 2024, and management determined liquidation is imminent. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the ongoing plan basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Allocations**

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The shares of Company common stock are valued at estimated fair value. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

As provided in the Plan document, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 4, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 INVESTMENTS**

In a series of transactions from 2003 to 2016, the Plan acquired 519,998 shares of the Company's outstanding common stock, some of which have been subsequently repurchased by the Company. Each group of shares acquired by the Plan was acquired at estimated fair value on the transaction date, as determined by independent appraisal. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of effective Plan termination date May 16, 2024 was \$0.00 per share and as of December 31, 2023 was \$0.09 per share.

During 2024, there were no shares released and allocated to participants. During 2023, 20,179 shares were released and allocated to participants.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

*Cash, Interest Bearing* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Interest Bearing Cash held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The interest bearing cash funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Mutual Funds* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Stock* – The fair value of the Sponsor Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 NOTES PAYABLE**

On May 10, 2016, the Plan entered into \$1,880,983 of term loan agreements with six shareholders of the Company. The proceeds of the loans were used to purchase the Company's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loans. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled. The cancellation of debt is recorded as an addition to net assets available for benefits in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Stock Ownership Committee shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such a sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan investments consist of the Company's common stock and various investment securities. These investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the trustee of the Plan.

The Plan is administered by Van's Aircraft, Inc. and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. A certain officer of the Company is Plan trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Plan invests in Company common stock and had indebtedness guaranteed by the Company. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As the Company is the Plan Sponsor, transactions involving Company common stock qualify as party-in-interest transactions. At November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the Plan held -0- and 276,845 shares of Company common stock, respectively, and the Plan received \$-0- dividends from this stock for the period ended November 30, 2024. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

### **Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements**

#### ***Opinion***

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 30, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended November 30, 2024 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust as of November 30, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended November 30, 2024 (in liquidation), in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### ***Basis for Opinion***

Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

***Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan) (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Effective May 16, 2024, the Plan name changed to Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust.

**General**

Van's Aircraft, Inc. (Company) established the Plan effective January 1, 2003. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed the eligibility requirements including the completion of one year of service with 1,000 hours of service. An eligible employee will begin participation on the first day of each Plan year following the completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Plan purchased Company common stock using the proceeds of a note payable to the Company and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan (see Note 5). As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023 and for the period ended November 30, 2024 present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- (a) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (Allocated) and
- (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Contributions**

Each year, the Company may contribute to the Plan up to 25% of covered compensation as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions may be in the form of shares of common stock or cash. Contributions for each year are never less than the amount required to enable the Plan to discharge its current obligations, without regard to whether some or all of such contribution may fail to qualify for an income tax deduction by the Company. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Participant Accounts**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Plan earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

**Vesting**

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

**Voting Rights**

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Put Option**

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

**Diversification**

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

**Payment of Benefits**

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account and may take the form of a lump-sum distribution or annual installments over a period of five years, as determined by the Company. Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump-sum distribution of their account balance, without the participant's consent, if their vested balance does not exceed \$1,000. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in a cash and Company common stock.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Plan or the Plan Sponsor is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations. During period ended November 30, 2024, the Plan did not repurchase any shares.

**Forfeited Accounts**

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. There were no shares forfeited and allocated to remaining participants for the period ended November 30, 2024. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Company authorized the termination of the Plan effective May 16, 2024, and management determined liquidation is imminent. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the ongoing plan basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Allocations**

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The shares of Company common stock are valued at estimated fair value. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

As provided in the Plan document, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 4, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 INVESTMENTS**

In a series of transactions from 2003 to 2016, the Plan acquired 519,998 shares of the Company's outstanding common stock, some of which have been subsequently repurchased by the Company. Each group of shares acquired by the Plan was acquired at estimated fair value on the transaction date, as determined by independent appraisal. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of effective Plan termination date May 16, 2024 was \$0.00 per share and as of December 31, 2023 was \$0.09 per share.

During 2024, there were no shares released and allocated to participants. During 2023, 20,179 shares were released and allocated to participants.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

*Cash, Interest Bearing* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Interest Bearing Cash held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The interest bearing cash funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Mutual Funds* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Stock* – The fair value of the Sponsor Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 NOTES PAYABLE**

On May 10, 2016, the Plan entered into \$1,880,983 of term loan agreements with six shareholders of the Company. The proceeds of the loans were used to purchase the Company's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loans. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled. The cancellation of debt is recorded as an addition to net assets available for benefits in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Stock Ownership Committee shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such a sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan investments consist of the Company's common stock and various investment securities. These investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the trustee of the Plan.

The Plan is administered by Van's Aircraft, Inc. and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. A certain officer of the Company is Plan trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Plan invests in Company common stock and had indebtedness guaranteed by the Company. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As the Company is the Plan Sponsor, transactions involving Company common stock qualify as party-in-interest transactions. At November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the Plan held -0- and 276,845 shares of Company common stock, respectively, and the Plan received \$-0- dividends from this stock for the period ended November 30, 2024. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 30, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended November 30, 2024 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (formerly known as Van's Aircraft, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan) (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Effective May 16, 2024, the Plan name changed to Van's Aircraft, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust.

**General**

Van's Aircraft, Inc. (Company) established the Plan effective January 1, 2003. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed the eligibility requirements including the completion of one year of service with 1,000 hours of service. An eligible employee will begin participation on the first day of each Plan year following the completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Plan purchased Company common stock using the proceeds of a note payable to the Company and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan (see Note 5). As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023 and for the period ended November 30, 2024 present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- (a) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (Allocated) and
- (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Contributions**

Each year, the Company may contribute to the Plan up to 25% of covered compensation as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions may be in the form of shares of common stock or cash. Contributions for each year are never less than the amount required to enable the Plan to discharge its current obligations, without regard to whether some or all of such contribution may fail to qualify for an income tax deduction by the Company. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Participant Accounts**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Plan earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

**Vesting**

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

**Voting Rights**

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Put Option**

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

**Diversification**

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

**Payment of Benefits**

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account and may take the form of a lump-sum distribution or annual installments over a period of five years, as determined by the Company. Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump-sum distribution of their account balance, without the participant's consent, if their vested balance does not exceed \$1,000. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in a cash and Company common stock.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Plan or the Plan Sponsor is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations. During period ended November 30, 2024, the Plan did not repurchase any shares.

**Forfeited Accounts**

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. There were no shares forfeited and allocated to remaining participants for the period ended November 30, 2024. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Company authorized the termination of the Plan effective May 16, 2024, and management determined liquidation is imminent. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the ongoing plan basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Allocations**

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The shares of Company common stock are valued at estimated fair value. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

As provided in the Plan document, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 4, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 INVESTMENTS**

In a series of transactions from 2003 to 2016, the Plan acquired 519,998 shares of the Company's outstanding common stock, some of which have been subsequently repurchased by the Company. Each group of shares acquired by the Plan was acquired at estimated fair value on the transaction date, as determined by independent appraisal. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of effective Plan termination date May 16, 2024 was \$0.00 per share and as of December 31, 2023 was \$0.09 per share.

During 2024, there were no shares released and allocated to participants. During 2023, 20,179 shares were released and allocated to participants.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

*Cash, Interest Bearing* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Interest Bearing Cash held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The interest bearing cash funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Mutual Funds* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Stock* – The fair value of the Sponsor Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 NOTES PAYABLE**

On May 10, 2016, the Plan entered into \$1,880,983 of term loan agreements with six shareholders of the Company. The proceeds of the loans were used to purchase the Company's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loans. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made.

As a result of the bankruptcy proceedings, the note payable was extinguished and all existing and outstanding equity interests (shares) were cancelled. The cancellation of debt is recorded as an addition to net assets available for benefits in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Stock Ownership Committee shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such a sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

On May 16, 2024, it was resolved to convert the ESOP to a profit-sharing plan and then immediately terminate the entirety of the Plan, as a result of the Plan Sponsor filing Chapter 11 Bankruptcy in December 2023. Due to the termination, the Plan was amended to fully vest all participants as of May 16, 2024, and all account balances in the ESOP were distributed by November 30, 2024.

**NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan investments consist of the Company's common stock and various investment securities. These investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the trustee of the Plan.

The Plan is administered by Van's Aircraft, Inc. and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. A certain officer of the Company is Plan trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Plan invests in Company common stock and had indebtedness guaranteed by the Company. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As the Company is the Plan Sponsor, transactions involving Company common stock qualify as party-in-interest transactions. At November 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the Plan held -0- and 276,845 shares of Company common stock, respectively, and the Plan received \$-0- dividends from this stock for the period ended November 30, 2024. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
