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### 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Excella, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which was established by Excella LLC (the Company), mostly recently amended during September 2022 to adopt CARES Act provisions. The Plan covers all employees of the Company, other than employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement for which retirement benefits have been the subject of good faith bargaining and any employee who is a non-resident alien who received no earned income which constitutes income from services performed within the United States. Upon attaining 21 years of age, employees are eligible to enter the Plan immediately. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### Participant Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation on a pre-tax basis or after-tax (Roth) basis, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the maximum allowable contributions under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), which totaled \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year may make additional pre-tax catch-up contributions, subject to limitations imposed by the Code. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the maximum allowable amount for catch up contributions totaled \$7,500. Participants are permitted to make rollover contributions to the Plan.

#### Company Contributions

The Company may make discretionary elective contributions equal to 50% of participant pre-tax contributions, not to exceed 7% of participant compensation for the Plan year. Company discretionary elective contributions, net of forfeitures applied, totaled \$1,288,204, for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company may also make discretionary non-elective contributions to participants. The Company did not make non-elective contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions in accordance with the investment options selected by the participant. Plan earnings, losses, and administrative expenses are allocated to participant accounts based upon the balance in each account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account balance.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow up to 50% of their vested account balances, not to exceed \$50,000, without regard to the intended use of the funds. The notes are collateralized by a participant's vested account balance. The minimum amount that may be borrowed is \$1,000 and participants may only have one note outstanding at any time during a Plan year. Note repayments are to be made each pay period through payroll deductions. The interest rate for the duration of a note is comparable to those offered by financial institutions at the time of note origination. Notes for reasons other than the purchase of a primary residence are to be repaid within five years. Notes issued for the purchase of a primary residence are to be repaid within thirty years.

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### 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN – cont’d.

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Participants vest in Company matching contributions and any additional discretionary contributions and earnings thereon based upon years of service according to the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 1	20%
1	25%
2	50%
3 or more	100%

A year of service is a Plan year in which an employee performs at least 1,000 hours of service. Participants become fully vested upon attainment of normal retirement age, disability, or death.

#### Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Company contributions may be applied to reduce future Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures applied to reduce employer contributions totaled \$108,018, while forfeitures applied to pay administrative expenses totaled \$15,969. Forfeitures available to the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$48,434 and \$11,114, respectively.

#### Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, retirement, death, disability, or attainment of age 59½, a participant or his or her beneficiary, in the event of death, is entitled to a distribution of his or her vested account balance. Prior to retirement, distributions from the Plan are payable in the form of a lump sum payment. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts contributed may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. Certain income tax and penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59½. Vested accounts for terminated participants with balances less than \$7,000 will be distributed from the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no net assets of the Plan allocated to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not received such distributions prior to year-end.

#### Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are required to be paid by the Plan with assets of the Plan unless the Company, at its discretion, elects to pay them. Plan expenses totaling \$134,770 during the year ended December 31, 2024 were paid directly by the Plan. Loan and distribution fees are paid by the Plan and its participants. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

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### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for investments in financial instruments that are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities may occur in the near term and materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net realized and unrealized appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Fair Value Measurement**

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets' or liabilities' fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

*Interest-bearing cash:* Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value.

*Interests in registered investment companies:* Valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the funds are traded.

*Guaranteed investment account:* Valued by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit worthiness of the issuer. Since participants may transact at contract value or surrender value, the fair value is determined annually for financial statement reporting purposes only. In determining the reasonableness of the methodology, Plan management evaluated a variety of factors including existing contract provisions (crediting rate and minimum rate), economic conditions and contract value.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes are treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated for disclosure any subsequent events through August 27, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and determined there were no material events that warrant disclosure.

### 3. INVESTMENTS

All investment information contained in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including assets held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and interest and dividend income and net realized and unrealized appreciation in fair value of investments for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from the information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company and The Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

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### 4. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### 5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Fidelity Management Trust Company and The Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, who act as Trustees to the Plan. The Plan loans funds to its participants according to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. The Company provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. All such transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

### 6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Pre-Approved Defined Contribution Plan document on which the plan was designed, received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Subsequent to the opinion letter, the Plan was amended and restated. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

ASC 740, *Income Taxes*, prescribes a recognition threshold and a measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return as well as guidance on de-recognition, classification, interest and penalties, and financial statement reporting disclosures. For these benefits to be recognized, a tax position must be more-likely-than-not to be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. As the Plan is tax exempt and had no unrelated business taxable income, the provisions of ASC 740 do not have an impact on the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan recognizes interest and penalties accrued on any unrecognized tax exposures as a component of income tax expense. The Plan does not have any amounts accrued relating to interest and penalties as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS and Department of Labor; however there are currently no audits in progress for any open tax periods.

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

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### 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Excella, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which was established by Excella LLC (the Company), mostly recently amended during September 2022 to adopt CARES Act provisions. The Plan covers all employees of the Company, other than employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement for which retirement benefits have been the subject of good faith bargaining and any employee who is a non-resident alien who received no earned income which constitutes income from services performed within the United States. Upon attaining 21 years of age, employees are eligible to enter the Plan immediately. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### Participant Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation on a pre-tax basis or after-tax (Roth) basis, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the maximum allowable contributions under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), which totaled \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year may make additional pre-tax catch-up contributions, subject to limitations imposed by the Code. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the maximum allowable amount for catch up contributions totaled \$7,500. Participants are permitted to make rollover contributions to the Plan.

#### Company Contributions

The Company may make discretionary elective contributions equal to 50% of participant pre-tax contributions, not to exceed 7% of participant compensation for the Plan year. Company discretionary elective contributions, net of forfeitures applied, totaled \$1,288,204, for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company may also make discretionary non-elective contributions to participants. The Company did not make non-elective contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions in accordance with the investment options selected by the participant. Plan earnings, losses, and administrative expenses are allocated to participant accounts based upon the balance in each account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account balance.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow up to 50% of their vested account balances, not to exceed \$50,000, without regard to the intended use of the funds. The notes are collateralized by a participant's vested account balance. The minimum amount that may be borrowed is \$1,000 and participants may only have one note outstanding at any time during a Plan year. Note repayments are to be made each pay period through payroll deductions. The interest rate for the duration of a note is comparable to those offered by financial institutions at the time of note origination. Notes for reasons other than the purchase of a primary residence are to be repaid within five years. Notes issued for the purchase of a primary residence are to be repaid within thirty years.

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### 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN – cont'd.

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Participants vest in Company matching contributions and any additional discretionary contributions and earnings thereon based upon years of service according to the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 1	20%
1	25%
2	50%
3 or more	100%

A year of service is a Plan year in which an employee performs at least 1,000 hours of service. Participants become fully vested upon attainment of normal retirement age, disability, or death.

#### Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Company contributions may be applied to reduce future Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures applied to reduce employer contributions totaled \$108,018, while forfeitures applied to pay administrative expenses totaled \$15,969. Forfeitures available to the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$48,434 and \$11,114, respectively.

#### Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, retirement, death, disability, or attainment of age 59½, a participant or his or her beneficiary, in the event of death, is entitled to a distribution of his or her vested account balance. Prior to retirement, distributions from the Plan are payable in the form of a lump sum payment. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts contributed may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. Certain income tax and penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59½. Vested accounts for terminated participants with balances less than \$7,000 will be distributed from the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no net assets of the Plan allocated to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not received such distributions prior to year-end.

#### Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are required to be paid by the Plan with assets of the Plan unless the Company, at its discretion, elects to pay them. Plan expenses totaling \$134,770 during the year ended December 31, 2024 were paid directly by the Plan. Loan and distribution fees are paid by the Plan and its participants. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

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### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for investments in financial instruments that are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities may occur in the near term and materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net realized and unrealized appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Fair Value Measurement**

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1      Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

#### Fair Value Measurement – cont'd.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets' or liabilities' fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

*Interest-bearing cash:* Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value.

*Interests in registered investment companies:* Valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the funds are traded.

*Guaranteed investment account:* Valued by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit worthiness of the issuer. Since participants may transact at contract value or surrender value, the fair value is determined annually for financial statement reporting purposes only. In determining the reasonableness of the methodology, Plan management evaluated a variety of factors including existing contract provisions (crediting rate and minimum rate), economic conditions and contract value.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

### 3. INVESTMENTS

All investment information contained in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including assets held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and interest and dividend income and net realized and unrealized appreciation in fair value of investments for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from the information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company and The Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

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### 4. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### 5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Fidelity Management Trust Company and The Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, who act as Trustees to the Plan. The Plan loans funds to its participants according to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. The Company provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. All such transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

### 6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Pre-Approved Defined Contribution Plan document on which the plan was designed, received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Subsequent to the opinion letter, the Plan was amended and restated. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

ASC 740, *Income Taxes*, prescribes a recognition threshold and a measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return as well as guidance on de-recognition, classification, interest and penalties, and financial statement reporting disclosures. For these benefits to be recognized, a tax position must be more-likely-than-not to be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. As the Plan is tax exempt and had no unrelated business taxable income, the provisions of ASC 740 do not have an impact on the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan recognizes interest and penalties accrued on any unrecognized tax exposures as a component of income tax expense. The Plan does not have any amounts accrued relating to interest and penalties as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS and Department of Labor; however there are currently no audits in progress for any open tax periods.
