Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA



- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Note 1 - Description of the Plan:

The following description of the Deferred Salary Profit-Sharing Plan for the Employees of Wiss & Company (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA). Employees, as defined, of Wiss & Company, LLP (the "Firm") are eligible to participate on the first day of the month following one month of service and attaining the age of twenty-one. Temporary and seasonal employees whose regularly scheduled service is less than 1,000 hours and leased employees are excluded from participating in the Plan.

Plan Administration - The Plan is administered by the Firm. The Plan's assets are held by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC (the "Trustees"), who are responsible for the custody and management of the Plan's assets.

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants may elect to have their contributions be either pre-tax or after-tax (Roth). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Firm contributes a maximum of 25% of the first 6% of the base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. In addition, the Firm may choose to make an employer discretionary contribution to the Plan in which all eligible employees will receive a portion of the Firm's contribution. There were no employer discretionary contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their individual and Firm contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Firm's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of Benefits - Withdrawals are made on a lump sum basis or at the participant's option as a deferred annuity upon retirement, disability, termination or proof of hardship. If death occurs prior to retirement, the participant's account is paid to the designated beneficiary.

Forfeited Accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$6,478 and \$6,160 respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future administrative expenses or the Firm's match.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment contracts held by defined-contribution plans are required to be reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results, as determined at a later date, could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor, Trustees and insurance company. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Firm and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Recordkeeping fees, investment management fees and investment advisory fees are also included in administrative expenses. Other investment related expenses, commissions and fees are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Professional fees of the Plan are paid by the Firm.

Benefit Payments - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Hardships - The Plan provides for hardship withdrawals from participants' vested balances, not to exceed an amount required to meet an immediate need created by the hardship, and then only to the extent that such immediate need cannot be satisfied by other sources reasonably available to the participant. Permissible circumstances for hardship withdrawals include medical expenses, purchase of a home, tuition payments, amounts necessary to prevent eviction from the participants' personal residence, and such other circumstances as the Plan Administrator may determine in accordance with IRS rules and regulations as well as the Plan document.

Subsequent Events - The Plan Administrator has reviewed and evaluated all events and transactions from December 31, 2024 through September 11, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available for issuance. The effects of those events and transactions that provide additional pertinent information about conditions that existed at the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits date have been recognized in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 3 - Information Certified by the Trustees:

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustees of the Plan, a qualified institution, has certified that the following information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- a) Investments, as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available For Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- b) Notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- c) Investment income, as shown in the Statement of Changes In Net Assets Available For Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- d) Interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- e) Investment information included in Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 4 - Plan Termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Firm has the right to amend or terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Under no circumstances may the Firm take ownership of any of the Plan's assets as a result of such termination.

Note 5 - Fair Value Measurements:

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual Funds*: Valued at the closing price reported on their respective exchange.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Transfers Between Levels - The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period. For the year ended December 31, 2024 there were no significant transfers in or out of levels 1, 2 or 3.

Note 6 - Guaranteed Investment Contract:

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“Empower”), which maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. An event that limits the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer (for example, premature termination of the contracts by the Plan, layoffs, Plan termination, bankruptcy, mergers, and early retirement incentives) and that also limits the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants in the Plan must be probable of not occurring.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The average yield and crediting interest rates were approximately 1.41% and 1.23% for 2024 and 2023, respectively. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. Fair value, which approximates contract value, of the guaranteed investment contract was \$2,412,727 and \$2,386,416 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan’s failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) or the failure of the Trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC.
2. Premature termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan’s normal operations.

In addition, certain events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 7 - Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may obtain loans from the Plan for a minimum of \$1,000 and maximum of one-half of a participant's account balance, or \$50,000, whichever is less. Loans are collateralized by a participant's account balance. Loans are generally payable through payroll deductions within five years, unless the loan is used to acquire or construct a principal residence of the participant. Loans bear interest at prime plus 1%, (8.50% at December 31, 2024) per annum.

Note 8 - Tax Status:

The Plan was written on an IRS non-standardized pre-approved document, which obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020 in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress.

Note 9 – Risks and Uncertainties and Concentration of Investment Risk :

Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

The Plan may have indirect investments in securities with contractual cash flows, such as asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations and commercial mortgage backed securities, including securities backed by sub-prime mortgage loans. The value, liquidity and related (loss)/income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.

The Plan's investment in two funds comprised approximately 36% of total investments at December 31, 2024. The Plan's investment in one fund comprised approximately 24% of total investments at December 31, 2023.

Note 10 – Party-in-Interest Transactions:

Certain Plan investments are shares of a guaranteed account managed by Empower, therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules. In addition, one of the Plan's Trustees, Empower Trust Company, LLC, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Empower. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management fees and recordkeeping services totaled \$85,878 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
