Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Tennessee Cancer Specialists, PLLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2024 through November 24, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

(1) Description of plan

The following description of the Tennessee Cancer Specialists, PLLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

In connection with the sale of the operations of Tennessee Cancer Specialists, PLLC (the "Plan Sponsor") in August 2024, the decision was made to merge the Plan effective November 24, 2024. As such, all contributions to the Plan ceased as of October 23, 2024. All of the Plan's funds were transferred by November 24, 2024. The Plan's participants then became eligible to participate in the US Oncology Clinical Practice 401(k) Plan ("USON CP Plan"). The Plan was merged into the USON CP Plan and all participant account balances and final Plan assets were transferred as of November 24, 2024, except for the matter described in Note (10).

(a) General

The Plan was a defined contribution plan which was adopted to provide retirement benefits for employees of the Plan Sponsor. The Plan covered substantially all employees who were age twenty-one or older and had completed one year of service (the "participants"). The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

(b) Contributions

Prior to the merger, participants could elect to contribute up to 100% of eligible compensation to the Plan which were after-tax Roth deferrals or pre-tax deferrals deductible by the participants for federal income tax purposes under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants directed the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan or self-directed investments. Participant contributions could not exceed the maximum annual amount as determined by the IRC.

The Plan Sponsor provided a safe harbor matching contribution of 100% for the first 3% of compensation contributed by a participant and 50% for the next 2% of salary contributed by the participant. The Plan also provided that the Plan Sponsor could make a discretionary profit sharing contribution each year; the Plan Sponsor made a profit sharing contribution of \$556,198 in 2024. Participants had to be twenty-one years of age and had to have completed two years of service to be eligible for the discretionary profit sharing contributions. Total contributions to the Plan for the year for each participant, as determined above, could not exceed a maximum amount set annually by law.

(c) Participant accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the Plan Sponsor matching contributions as calculated above and participant contributions. Each participant's account was credited or charged the actual earnings (losses) of the investment options selected by the participant and an allocation of the discretionary profit sharing contribution and administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant's compensation or account balances as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account.

(d) Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in all contributions.

(e) Notes receivable from participants

Participants could borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes receivable from participants were secured by the balance in the participant's vested accounts and bore interest at fixed rates which were commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. Principal and interest were collected ratably through payroll deductions.

(f) Payment of benefits

Benefits became payable upon the participant's death, disability, retirement, termination of service, or attainment of age 59½. On termination of service, a participant could elect to receive either installment payments or a lump sum amount if his or her account balances exceeded \$1,000. Account balances that were less than \$1,000 were distributed as a lump sum.

(g) Hardship withdrawals

The Plan permitted distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined in the plan agreement. These distributions were taxable and subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant was younger than age 59½. Hardship withdrawals were limited to the participant's rollover and elective account balances.

(h) Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan were paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and were excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration and recordkeeping were paid with assets of the Plan and charged to the participants' accounts and included in administrative expenses. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services were included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Notes to the Financial Statements

November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

(b) Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments were reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note (4) for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income was recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

(c) Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants were classified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

(d) Payment of benefits

Benefits were recorded when paid.

(e) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Events occurring after report date

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between November 24, 2024 and September 8, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

(3) Certified information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants presented and disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including the fair value of investments and notes receivable from participants held at November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest on notes receivable from participants for the period from January 1, 2024 through November 24, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Ascensus, LLC as an agent for Ascensus Trust Company, ("Ascensus"). Self-directed investments held at December 31, 2023, and related net depreciation in fair value totaling \$(85,971) for the period from January 1, 2024 through November 24, 2024 were not certified by Ascensus (netted against the certified amount for "net appreciation in fair value of investments").

(4) Fair value measurements

Fair value is a market-based measurement, not an entity-specific measurement. Therefore, a fair value measurement should be determined based on the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. As a basis for considering market participant assumptions in fair value measurements, fair value accounting standards establish a fair value hierarchy that distinguishes between market participant assumptions based on market data obtained from sources independent of the reporting entity including quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1), or significant other observable inputs (Level 2) and the reporting entity's own assumptions about market participant assumptions (Level 3). The Plan did not have any fair value measurements using significant unobservable inputs (Level 3) as of November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

- (i) *Mutual funds*: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end in an active market.
- (ii) *Self-directed investments*: The self-directed investments consist primarily of common stocks, exchange traded funds, and money market funds which are valued at the closing price reported on the active market or the NAV of the shares held.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(5) Income tax status

The Plan Sponsor adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on November 30, 2020, which stated that the form of the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan is acceptable under the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan itself had not received a determination letter from the IRS stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC. However, the plan administrator believes that the adopted non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan was designed and operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and was therefore, qualified and exempt from taxation.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and had concluded that as of November 24, 2024 and December 31, 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(6) Untimely remittance of participant contributions

The Plan Sponsor was required by Department of Labor regulation to remit participant contributions and participant loan repayments as soon as practicable, but no later than the fifteenth business day following the end of the month in which the amounts were withheld from wages. For certain contributions withheld during 2019, 2020, and 2021, the funds were not remitted timely. The funds were remitted during their respective year and imputed lost earnings applicable to these contributions were calculated and contributed to the Plan during September 2024.

(7) Related party and party-in-interest transactions

As described in Note (1), the Plan paid expenses to various service providers which qualify as parties-in-interest transactions under ERISA. The Plan also held notes receivable from participants, which also qualified as party-in-interest transactions.
