Opinion

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

General

The Katten Muchin Rosenman LLP Welfare Benefit Plan (the Plan) was established to offer welfare benefit coverage to eligible partners, counsel attorneys, associates, and staff members (and their dependents) of Katten Muchin Rosenman LLP (the Firm), as detailed in the Plan document.

In general, the Plan provides participants specified medical, dental, vision, health care flexible spending account (Health FSA), employee assistance program, life, long-term disability, and accidental death and dismemberment benefits. The Firm is self-insured for all medical and prescription drug benefits, subject to individual and aggregate limits, and health care flexible spending account benefits. The remaining benefits are provided through insurance programs contracted by the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Plan and Trust Termination

Effective November 21, 2024, the Executive Committee of the Firm approved the termination of the Plan's voluntary employees' beneficiary association (VEBA) trust. The trust's assets that were held by JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A (the Plan's Custodian) were applied to claims for eligible participants and beneficiaries, which resulted in an ending balance within the JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. money market account of \$0 as of December 31, 2024.

In addition, although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Firm reserves the right to modify or discontinue the Plan at any time.

Contributions

With respect to employees, the Plan is funded partially from employer contributions in such amounts as are determined by the Firm's Executive Committee (or its delegate) as reasonably estimated to provide the employer's portion of the cost of the participants' benefit programs. Contributions provided by the employer are limited to the Plan's qualified costs for the year, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Such contributions are made for the sole purpose of providing benefits to participants and their beneficiaries and to defray the reasonable expenses of administering the Plan and are never to inure to the benefit of the Firm. Any deficiency of the Plan's net assets over claim obligations is funded by the Firm on a pay-as-you-go basis. Partners pay the full cost of coverage for themselves and their dependents with no employer contribution.

Contributions from employees are made to the Plan for a specified portion of insurance premium costs. Terminated employees and other qualified beneficiaries may elect to continue their coverage (as provided under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 regulations) by making contributions to cover the full cost of their insurance premiums. Certain retired partners and employees are also permitted to continue coverage for themselves and their dependents by making contributions to cover the full cost of their insurance premiums.

The Health FSA is part of both the Plan and the Firm's IRC Section 125 Cafeteria Plan (Cafeteria Plan). As such, only employees are eligible for the Health FSA and partners are not eligible. Under the Cafeteria Plan's provisions, employees may make annual elections to reduce their salaries by up to \$3,200 and \$3,050 in 2024 and 2023, respectively, to contribute to the Health FSA for reimbursement of medical, dental and vision expenses not covered by the Plan, including deductibles and coinsurance. The Cafeteria Plan also provides for a dependent care flexible spending account and Health Savings Account contributions that are not part of the Plan. Employees could roll over to the next Plan year up to \$640 and \$610 of unused

Health FSA balances in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Employee salary reductions of \$413,863 for 2024 are included in participant contributions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis. The unused flexible spending account balance was approximately \$43,696 and \$65,395 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). Under the modified cash basis of accounting, contributions and income are recorded when received, and distributions and expenses are recorded when paid.

Had the financial statements been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with U.S. GAAP, obligations for claims payable, claims incurred but not reported, and premiums due to insurers of \$2,679,491 and \$3,589,709 would have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Stop Loss

The Plan entered a stop-loss arrangement to limit its exposure for self-insured benefits in the event that medical claims paid exceed approximately \$200,000 per individual case. Benefits that exceed these amounts are reimbursed to the Plan by the insurance company during the subsequent year. Premiums for stop loss insurance are included in premium payments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop loss refunds totaled \$1,977,547 for 2024 and are presented net with claims paid in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Prescription Drug Credits

The Plan utilizes a Pharmacy Benefits Manager (PBM) which periodically makes refunds to the Plan based on the Plan's actual utilization pattern of specific drugs. Rebates, or credits, from the Plan's Express Scripts are recorded when received. Credits received during the year are offset against claims paid. Total credits received in 2024 totaled \$2,041,229.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments

The Plan's investment consists of a deposit held in a money market savings account and is stated at cost, which equals fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received. See Note C for description of fair value measurements.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses which consist of primarily fees paid to third-party claims administrators and trustees associated with the Plan are paid by the Plan unless paid by the Firm at its discretion.

Self-Insured Benefits

The claims for self-insured benefits are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under an administrative services only (ASO) arrangement. The claims processors pay claims directly to or on behalf of participants and are then reimbursed by either the Plan's voluntary employees' beneficiary association (VEBA) trust or the general assets of the Firm. Despite the Plan's utilization of third-party claims processors, ultimate responsibility for payment to providers and participants is retained by the Firm.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board issued guidance that establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

However, the determination of what constitutes observable requires judgment by the Plan's Management. Plan Management considers observable data to be market data that is readily available, regularly distributed or updated, reliable and verifiable, not proprietary, and provided by multiple independent sources that are actively involved in the relevant market. The categorization of an investment within the fair value hierarchy is based on the pricing transparency of the investment and does not necessarily correspond to Plan Management's perceived risk of that investment.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value: Money market account - Recorded at cost, which approximates fair value.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, while Plan Management believes the Plan's valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan's assets, with level 1 fair value hierarchy, were \$0 and \$2,300,791 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE D - CONCENTRATION

The Plan maintains its cash balances in one financial institution in Chicago, Illinois, which at times may exceed federally insured limits. The Plan Administrator believes that the financial institution in which these funds are deposited is secure and that the Plan is not exposed to any significant credit risk on these balances.

NOTE E - TAX STATUS

In May 1984, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued a letter stating that the trust is qualified pursuant to Section 501(c)(9) as a VEBA and, accordingly, the trust's investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan and trust are required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. The Firm believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan Management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE F - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's investment was managed by JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. (JPMorgan) during 2024 and 2023. JPMorgan is the Plan's Custodian. As described in Note A, the Plan has several arrangements with service providers. These transactions between the Plan and JPMorgan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan engaged in a nonexempt prohibited transaction with a party in interest under Section 406(a) of ERISA, specifically related to delayed funding into the Plan's VEBA trust for a prescription drug rebate received by the Plan Sponsor from the Plan's pharmacy benefit manager within the 2024 Plan year totaling \$21,706.

The Plan Sponsor discovered the error in November 2024 and implemented a prompt correction, which included: (1) contributing the \$21,706 in prescription drug rebates to the VEBA on November 07, 2024; and (2) calculating lost earnings on the delayed contributions using the Department of Labor's VFCP online calculator and depositing lost earnings in the amount of \$854 to the VEBA on November 21, 2024.

NOTE G - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan Management evaluated subsequent events through August 20, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Plan Management is not aware of any subsequent events that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
