Report on the Audit of the Combining Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the combining financial statements, is complete and accurate.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Guardian Angels Employer Sponsored Plan (401(a) Plan) and Guardian Angels 403(b) Retirement Plan (403(b) Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plans documents for a more complete description of the Plans' provisions. The plans are sponsored by Guardian Angels Health Services, Inc. (Employer).

General, Eligibility, and Contributions – 401(a) Plan

The 401(a) Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1982. The 401(a) Plan has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The 401(a) Plan was last amended and restated effective May 15, 2024 to a pre-approved plan document and also to modify retirement age provisions, to allow in-service distributions at age 62 and to add trustees. Prior to December 31, 2020, employees were eligible for the 401(a) Plan upon attainment of age 18 and completion of one year of service. Guardian Angels of Elk River, Inc. is a participating employer in the 401(a) Plan. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective at the end of business on December 31, 2020, the 401(a) Plan was amended to freeze the 401(a) Plan. No further employees are eligible for the 401(a) Plan, no future contributions will be made to the 401(a) Plan, and each participant became 100% vested in their employer contribution balances in the 401(a) Plan.

Subsequent to Plan year-end, on March 26, 2025, the Board of Directors elected to terminate the 401(a) Plan effective July 1, 2025. No liquidation benefits have been distributed until further execution of the steps under the plan termination. There is no effect on vesting as participants were already 100% vested.

General, Eligibility, and Contributions – 403(b) Plan

The 403(b) Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1995. The 403(b) Plan has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was last restated effective January 1, 2021 as a result of the freeze of the 401(a) Plan. The 403(b) Plan was last amended effective January 1, 2023 to add an automatic escalation feature. Employees are eligible to participate in the deferral portion of the 403(b) Plan immediately upon date of hire. Effective January 1, 2021, employees are eligible to participate in the Employer contributions portion of the 403(b) Plan upon attaining age 18 and completing one year of service. The 403(b) Plan generally excludes employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement unless the employee belongs to the SEIU Minnesota Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses bargaining unit. Guardian Angels of Elk River, Inc. is a participating employer in the 403(b) Plan. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have up to 100% of their compensation contributed as pre-tax 403(b) or Roth contributions to the Plan. The 403(b) Plan allows participants age 50 and older to make catch-up contributions. The 403(b) Plan also allows participants with 15 years of service to make additional catch-up contributions in amounts up to \$3,000 per year, subject to a lifetime limitation of \$15,000.

General, Eligibility, and Contributions – 403(b) Plan (Continued)

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees, are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation, and their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Employer may, at its discretion, elect to make a matching or nonelective contribution to the 403(b) Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer matching contribution was equal to 100% of deferrals up to a maximum of 2% of eligible compensation, and the Employer nonelective contribution was equal to 3% of eligible compensation. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's contributions, and an allocation of Plans' earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plans. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Employer contributions made prior to December 31, 2020 into the 401(a) Plan became 100% vested effective December 31, 2020 with the freeze of the 401(a) Plan. Employer contributions on and after January 1, 2021 into the 403(b) Plan, plus actual earnings thereon, vest at a rate of 20% per year. A participant is fully vested following the completion of five years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, participants shall become 100% vested in their account upon attaining normal retirement (age 62), death, or disability.

Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts in the 403(b) Plan totaled \$175- and \$-0- as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. In the 403(b) Plan, forfeitures in the amount of \$31,179 were used to reduce Employer contributions, \$4,949 in forfeitures were used to restore participant accounts, and \$9,004 of forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, early retirement date or normal retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump-sum distribution or installments. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance is less than \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to January 1, 2024), the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. Account balances between \$1,000 and \$7,000 are rolled over into an IRA if no other election is made by the participants. The Plans allow for in-service distributions, subject to Plan provisions. The 403(b) Plan allows for hardship distributions, subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The combining financial statements of the Plans are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Because of the close symmetry of the 401(a) Plan and 403(b) Plan, the financial statements are presented with combining and combined columnar information on the combining statements of net assets available for benefits and the combining statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. These statements are presented in this format to conform to the certified statements of the custodian. The supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) are presented separately for each Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the combined financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plans' investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plans' Finance Committee determines the Plans' valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plans' gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plans' expenses are paid either by the Plans or the Employer, as provided by the Plan documents. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plans that are paid directly by the Employer are excluded from these combining financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plans that are paid by the Plans are recorded as deductions in the accompanying combining statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plans have evaluated subsequent events through August 25, 2025, the date the combining financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

American United Life Insurance Company, the insurance company, has supplied the Plans' administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying combining statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the combining statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plans have the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Insurance Company Stable Value Account: Investments in the insurance company stable value accounts are valued by American United Life Insurance Company (AUL) at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit-worthiness of the issuer.

NOTE 5 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plans have deposit contracts with AUL. AUL maintains the contributions in a fixed interest account, a stable value account and pooled separate accounts. The fixed interest account and the stable value account are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Due to the transfer restrictions within the contract, they are not deemed to be fully benefit-responsive and is valued at fair value which is deemed to approximate contract value by AUL.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

The Employer has the right under the Plans to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plans subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants become 100% vested in their account.

NOTE 7 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plans invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the combining statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 PLAN TAX STATUS

The 401(a) Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

The 403(b) Plan has adopted a volume submitter plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the form of the volume submitter plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the volume submitter plan document the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plans and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plans have taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plans are subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The investments are managed by American United Life Insurance Company, the insurance company. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Certain fees incurred by the Plans for investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
