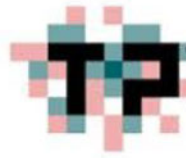

## **INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT**

To The Trustees

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Drive Devilbiss Healthcare 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). ## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

### NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Drive Devilbiss Healthcare 401(k) Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Medical Depot, Inc. d/b/a Drive DeVilbiss Healthcare (the “Company”) covering substantially all employees of the company who have completed 90 consecutive days of service with the Company and are age 18 or older. An employee may enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or following the date on which the employee meets the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan’s Board of Trustees.

#### Change in Trustee and Custodian

Effective November 10, 2023, Empower Retirement, LLC (“Empower”) became the Plan’s trustee and custodian. Investments in funds managed by John Hancock Retirement Services (“John Hancock”) prior to November 10, 2023 were transferred to funds managed by Empower on the conversion date.

#### Plan Amendments and Other Plan Changes

In November 2023, the Plan was amended to revise the definition of excluded employees not eligible to participate in the Plan.

#### Contributions

Participants may contribute from 1% up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions, as well as Company contributions, into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision, whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions are invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants may increase or decrease their contributions on a monthly basis. Participants may stop contributing at any time.

### NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN – CONTINUED

#### Contributions (continued)

The Company may make an annual matching contribution in a discretionary amount equal to a uniform percentage of the amount contributed by each participant. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 50 percent of the first 5 percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Participants that are members of a union also receive a matching contribution from the Company equal to 100 percent of the participant's salary deferrals that do not exceed 3 percent of the participant's eligible compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the total matching contribution was \$1,518,673. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of directors. There was no discretionary profit-sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution (if any) and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

The Company's profit-sharing contributions to the Plan are allocated among all of the participants who have completed a year of service, as defined within the Plan document, and are actively employed on the last day of the Plan year.

#### Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching or profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service. In addition, Union employees covered by a good faith bargaining agreement that provides for coverage in the Plan will continue to be 100% vested in Company matching contributions regardless of their date of entry into the Plan.

One hundred percent of the amount credited to participants who are presently employed shall become fully vested in their account balance upon: (1) death; or (2) the effective date of termination of employment by reason of disability.

### NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN – CONTINUED

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The maximum number of outstanding loans at any time is two per participant. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus one percent. Loans are generally repaid within five years of the date on which the loan's funds are disbursed. If the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence, the repayment can be longer than five years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, loan interest rates ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%.

#### Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or in installments over a period of time not more than the participant's or beneficiary's life expectancy determined at time of distribution. The normal retirement age under the Plan is 65. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Prior to termination of service, participants who have attained age 59-1/2 may withdraw all or any portion of the value of salary reduction contributions and vested Company contributions made on their behalf.

Participants' benefits are included in deductions from net assets during the period when vested members reach the normal retirement date and are paid, unless the participants continue in service after reaching the normal retirement date and postpone payment of accrued benefits until the deferred retirement date or otherwise terminate employment. Following severance of employment, the Company may distribute participant balances less than \$5,000 as soon as administratively feasible.

#### Hardship Withdrawals

Hardship withdrawals by Plan participants may be made upon written request to, and upon approval of, the Plan Trustees. If approved, the distribution can be made out of the elective deferral, Roth elective deferral and rollover contribution accounts of the participant and shall be limited to the amount of the contributions to such account. No amount of income on such contributions may be withdrawn. All requests must be made in writing. Salary deferral contributions of participants who obtain a hardship withdrawal will be suspended for six months after the hardship withdrawal.

##### Forfeited Accounts

The forfeiture account is comprised of amounts formerly allocated to individual accounts of participants upon the participant's separation of service. The forfeited amount is the nonvested portion of the employer contribution. The forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$20,143 and \$34,133 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These amounts are used to reduce contributions made by the Company. Employer contributions were reduced by \$72,162 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

##### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on an accrual basis of accounting.

#### NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

##### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies using information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, including administrative, professional, and advisory fees, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated all events that occurred after December 31, 2024 but before the financial statements were available to be issued, September 12, 2025, to determine if they must be reported. Management determined that there were no reportable subsequent events to be disclosed.

### NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024.

*Mutual funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Collective trust funds* – Valued at the NAV as the practical expedient of underlying investments of participant units held by the Plan as of the last trading day of the period as reported by the managers of the trust. Investments that use NAV as a practical expedient to measure fair value have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy in accordance with FASB ASC 820-10.

#### NOTE D – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

Effective November 10, 2023, the Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower, the Guarantee Income Fund (“GIF”). Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that causes a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or (5) premature termination of the contract. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

#### NOTE E – RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The guaranteed income fund is managed by Empower, the Plan’s custodian and trustee. Therefore, transactions with Empower qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant’s account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Company performs certain administrative functions on behalf of the Plan, for which no fees are charged.

#### NOTE F – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

#### NOTE G – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower (the trustee of the Plan). The contract value of the guaranteed investment contract was certified by the trustee.

#### NOTE H – TAX STATUS

The Plan operates under a non-standardized pre-approved plan document sponsored by Empower that has received an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022 from the IRS as to the plan's qualified status. The opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

#### NOTE I – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

### NOTE J – DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

During 2023, the Company determined that between 2021 and 2023, the employer matching contribution was incorrectly calculated, resulting in both insufficient matching contributions for certain participants and excess matching contributions for certain participants. The Company also determined that certain participants were not automatically enrolled/automatically increased within the Plan upon satisfying eligibility requirements or incorrectly withheld. The Company has compensated participants for lost earnings resulting from these errors as part of the corrective action during 2024. Insufficient matching contributions, including lost earnings, totaled \$37,051. Excess matching contributions, including lost earnings, totaled \$20,045, which were withdrawn from the Plan. Delinquent participant contributions due to improper enrollment totaled \$1,703, including lost earnings. Contribution percent corrections totaled \$12,667.

In 2024, the Company determined that an employer matching contribution was incorrectly calculated, resulting in insufficient matching contributions and lost earnings totaling \$3,044 for a participant.

These errors, which totaled \$34,420, were corrected outside of the Department of Labor Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program in 2024 and are included in the supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions.
