### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Ross Employees' 401(k) Savings Plan and Trust ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, which was certified by the Custodians of the Plan, Charles Schwab Bank, a qualified institution, as of November 30, 2023 and for the period December 1, 2022 to December 31, 2023, and Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, as of November 30, 2024 and for the period January 1, 2024 to November 30, 2024, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Ross Employees' 401(k) Savings Plan and Trust (the "Plan") provides general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions.

Description

The Plan is a defined contribution plan adopted by Ross Environmental Services, Inc. ("RES"), Ross Incineration Services, Inc., Ross Transportation Services, Inc. and ManagTech, Inc., (collectively referred to as the "Sponsors"). The Plan is administered by RES (the "Plan Administrator"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Securities Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Change of Custodian

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended and Plan assets were transferred from its prior Custodian, Charles Schwab Bank, to Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Custodian"). After this date, Fidelity Management Trust Company operates as the Custodian of the plan and maintains related trust accounts.

Eligibility

All employees of the Sponsors are eligible to participate once they attain the age of 21 and complete 30 days of service. An individual may enter the Plan on the first day of the month following the date the requirements were met. Unless they elect to opt out, employees are auto enrolled into the Plan at a 6% contribution rate once they become eligible to participate.

Contributions

Participants can elect to contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax compensation as limited by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Contributions are made to the Plan and then allocated to the individual participants' accounts. The Plan allows participants to contribute, pre-tax, up to 100% of any bonus they may receive. The Plan provides for discretionary employer matching contributions, as authorized by the Sponsors. Effective December 1, 2016, the Plan was amended to become a safe harbor plan, implement auto enrollment at 6% once participants become eligible, and change the matching contributions calculation to 100% of the first 1% and 50% of the next 5% of employee deferrals. During 2021, the Plan was amended effective November 1, 2021 to change the matching contributions calculation to 100% up to 4.5% of employee deferrals. Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to change the matching contributions calculation to 100% up to 6.0% of employee deferrals. The Sponsors authorized matching contributions were \$1,389,268 and \$1,066,324 for the years ended November 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Effective December 1, 2020, the plan allows for Roth deferral elections to be made by participants in addition to the pre-tax deferral. The Plan also provides for discretionary profit sharing contributions, as authorized by the Sponsors. The Plan recorded \$100,000 and \$200,000 in discretionary profit sharing contributions for the years ended November 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows participants to apply for and obtain, from the balance of the participant's account, notes in an amount of no less than \$1,000 and limited to 50 percent of the participant's vested account balance provided such notes do not exceed \$50,000. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at Prime plus one percent at the time of the note. Payments of principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions and credited to the participant's account.

Notes are in default when payments are not made by the end of the calendar quarter following the quarter in which the payment was due, or the participant makes or furnishes any false representation or statement to the Plan. In the event of default, the entire outstanding note balance, consisting of the missed payments, remaining principal, and all accrued but unpaid interest, will remain as the participant's obligation. Participants have the opportunity to repay the loan or to resume current status by paying all missed payments. If distribution is or becomes available under the Plan, the participants vested balance will be offset by the outstanding loan balance and deemed a distribution as permitted by law.

Vesting

Employees are 100% vested in their elective deferral accounts at all times. All eligible participants will be 100% vested in employer contributions after two years. Forfeitures relating to matching contributions are added to the employer matching contributions and allocated as an additional matching contribution or may be applied toward Plan expenses.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of all elective and company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

A separate account is maintained for each participant in the Plan, inclusive of contributions, investments, investment gains and losses, withdrawals, transfers and both investment and administrative fees. Each participant's account is re-valued daily.

A participant may elect to invest contributions and transfers in any combination of the funds. Participants can change their investment direction or transfer funds directly through the Plan Administrator or via the Custodian's online website.

All dividends, interest and other proceeds received with regard to any fund will be reinvested automatically in the same fund.

Participant vested amounts are payable upon retirement, death, or other termination of employment. Distributions may be made in the form of a direct rollover, lump-sum cash distribution or periodic payments over the participant's lifetime. Distributions are to begin as soon as administratively feasible after the end of the fiscal quarter in which the distributable event occurs, but in no event, after the age of 70½. Terminated participants or retirees with an account balance of \$1,000 or less may not elect to remain in the Plan and will automatically receive a lump-sum distribution or rollover.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan pays expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan, unless paid by the Sponsors. Expenses paid to the Custodian are accounted for as a reduction in investment earnings.

Termination Provisions

Although the Sponsors have not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, they reserve the right to do so at any time. In the event of termination, the accounts of the participants will be distributed in a manner determined by the Plan Administrator and in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Fair Value Measurements

Fair value estimates are made at a specific point in time based on relevant market information about the financial instrument. These estimates are subjective in nature and involve uncertainties and matters of significant judgment and, therefore, cannot be determined with precision. Changes in assumptions could significantly affect the estimates.

Investment Valuation

The Plan's money market funds and mutual funds are stated at fair value at November 30, 2024 and 2023. Gains and losses on investments that were purchased, sold or held during the year are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Purchases and sales of securities are reported on a trade date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. In accordance with the policy of stating investments at market value, net appreciation (including gains and losses on assets sold during the year and unrealized gains and losses on assets held) for the year is reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

An investment in the Plan is the Standard Stable Asset Fund 3 (the "Fund"), which has entered into a benefit-responsive group annuity contract. Because the group annuity contract held by the Fund is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the manager of the Fund, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their

investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuers or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuers.

Certain employer-initiated events (e.g., divestitures, corporate relocations, layoffs, retirement incentive programs, partial or total Plan terminations) are not eligible for book value disbursements even from fully benefit-responsive contracts. These events may cause liquidation of all or a portion of the group annuity contract at a market value adjustment.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Income Taxes

Under the Income Taxes Topic of the FASB ASC, the Sponsors are required to identify potential uncertain tax positions taken, assess and quantify those positions and record reserves. As of and for the years ended November 30, 2024 and 2023, the Sponsors have identified no uncertain tax positions. The Plan files the United States Federal Form 5500 annually.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are participant-directed accounts that are held by the Custodian.

Fair value is a market-based measurement that is determined based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. As a basis for considering such assumptions, the Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 – Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets;
- Level 2 – Inputs, other than the quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 – Unobservable inputs in which there is little or no market data, which require the reporting entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of November 30, 2024 and 2023 are as follows:

- Money market funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual funds are traded and at the accumulated unit value of shares (amortized cost) held by the Plan at year end.
- Mutual funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual funds are traded.

The methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The IRS determined and informed the Sponsors by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan is qualified and the trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt, under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status and believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

NOTE 6 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of money market funds that are maintained by the Custodian. These transactions are considered party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included as a reduction of the return on each fund. There are also indirect fees deducted directly from the investment earnings of the Plan.
