We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of United Network for Organ Sharing 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1—Plan description

The following description of the United Network for Organ Sharing 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General— The Plan was established on January 1, 1998, and was most recently amended June 1, 2024 to increase the automatic deferral escalation maximum to 15% and amend the definition of eligible compensation for matching contributions. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of United Network for Organ Sharing (the “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”).

Plan Administration – The Company is the Plan sponsor and Plan administrator. The Finance Committee of the Board of Directors of the Company controls and manages the operations and administration of the Plan. Principal Life Insurance and Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a/ Principal Trust Company (collectively, the “Custodians”) serve as Custodians of the Plan. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company, who receive no compensation from the Plan. The Company may reimburse the Plan for any administrative expenses incurred.

Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount allowed by law of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations. Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan. The Company will deduct 6% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, unless the participant elects otherwise. The Plan also includes an automatic escalation feature, where participant deferrals will automatically increase by 1% each year until a maximum of 15%, unless the participant elects otherwise. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 401(k) (pretax) or Roth 401(k) (after-tax). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts. The Company provides a retirement contribution at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. For 2024, the discretionary contribution was \$2,016,087 of which \$268,531 in forfeitures were used to reduce Company contributions. The Company may provide a matching contribution as determined at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. For 2024, the matching contribution was 100% of the first 6% of compensation deferred by each participant. Employer-matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 were \$2,629,364, of which \$329,999 in forfeitures were used to reduce Company contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations established by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”).

Investment Options – Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, a stable value collective trust fund, common collective trust funds, pooled separate accounts, and self-directed brokerage accounts as investment options for participants.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service with the Company as follows:

Note 1—Plan description (continued)

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of Company contributions and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, participant group, participant contributions, or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Repayment terms for the notes are for a maximum of five years, unless the purpose of the note is for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the Plan administrator may extend the repayment term beyond five years, with the note balance amortized in equal installments over the life of the note. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits – On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or annuity options as provided by the Plan. Hardship distributions are available from fully vested balances upon demonstration of financial hardship, with limitations defined in the Plan. In-service distributions are available after a participant reaches age 59½.

Forfeitures – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$16,469 and \$23,279, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions or to pay Plan expenses. During 2024, forfeitures of \$598,530 were used to reduce Company contributions and forfeitures of \$27 were used to pay Plan expenses.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Presentation – The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments in the Plan are reported at fair value U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Contributions Receivable – Any contributions due and payable by the Company are reflected as employer contributions receivable in the Plan's financial statements.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits paid to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses to be made from the Plan's assets. If expenses are paid using the Plan's assets, then the expenses will generally be allocated among the accounts of all participants in the Plan. Administrative expenses paid directly by the Plan sponsor include legal, third party administration, and accounting fees. Investment fees of individual funds are paid by the Plan.

Fair Value Measurements – U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset and liability, in an orderly transaction value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value.

U.S. GAAP defines three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy.

Mutual Funds – These public investment vehicles are valued using the net asset value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy based on the underlying assets of the account, which are traded on an active market.

Stable Value Collective Trust Fund – The Plan invests in a stable value collective investment trust ("CIT") fund for which the NAV is based on the contract value. CIT is valued using NAV which is not publicly quoted but is made available to investors through the qualified institution. NAV is the basis for current transactions, and CIT can be redeemed at NAV of a measurement date. Therefore, CIT has a readily determinable fair value and is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common Collective Trusts – Common collective trusts ("CCTs") invest in a collective trust fund as well as a variety of separate accounts and mutual funds. CCTs are valued using NAV which is not publicly quoted but is made available to investors through the qualified institution. NAV is the basis for current transactions, and CCT can be redeemed at NAV of a measurement date. Therefore, CCTs have a readily determinable fair value and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Each of the pooled separate accounts invest in a single mutual fund. The fair value of these funds is a publicly quoted pricing input used to determine the net asset value of the pooled separate account which, therefore, has a readily determinable fair value and is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Self-Directed Brokerage Account – Primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued by the Custodians on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

The Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants; however, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. As of December 31, 2024, there was no change in methodology used by the Plan.

Note 3—Information prepared and certified by qualified institutions (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodians of the Plan have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024.

- Investments, at fair value, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
- Interest and dividends and net appreciation in fair value of investments, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan’s independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to the certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 5—Tax status

The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the volume submitter plan that it is utilizing. The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS, stating the written form of the underlying volume submitter plan document is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and that any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6—Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7—Party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain expenses are paid to the Custodians of the Plan for investment management services. The Plan paid administrative fees to the Custodians totaling \$146,152 during 2024. These transactions are not deemed prohibited transactions because they are covered by the statutory administrative exemption from IRC's and ERISA's rules on prohibited transactions.

Note 8—Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9—Subsequent events

In accordance with U.S. GAAP related to subsequent events, the Plan has evaluated all events subsequent through September 4, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.
