Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for at least one year following the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule, Schedule H, line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. Retirement Savings and Pension Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective May 1, 1968. The Plan covers substantially all employees, excluding non-resident aliens, leased employees, collectively bargained employees, union employees, employees classified as N1, N2, T1, T2, TS1, PM1, PM2, PM3, PM4, PM5, CO1, and any employee who is classified as a senior consultant employees, of Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. (the "Company" or "Sponsor") who have completed 30 days of service. The Plan was most recently amended effective May 19, 2023, to add prior service credit for employees under Kimley-Horn of Puerto Rico, LLC and amend the included classes of eligible employees to include employees of Kimley-Horn of Puerto Rico, LLC. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). There is no age requirement to be eligible for the Plan. Participants are eligible for the discretionary Sponsor match and profit sharing contributions following one year of employment. Generally, participants must have also completed 1,000 hours of service, as defined by the Plan, and be employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to receive the discretionary Sponsor match and profit sharing contributions. However, participants who retired, died, or became disabled while in service during the Plan year would be eligible for the Sponsor match and profit sharing contributions through their last day of service with the Plan. The Retirement Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's Retirement Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's Retirement Committee.

Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, up to the maximum limits of \$23,000 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to \$7,500. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in default investment provisions until changed by the participant. The Company contributes a discretionary match of 200% of the first 4% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Retirement Committee. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the discretionary profit sharing contributions were \$80,802,497, net of forfeitures. Additional discretionary amounts may be contributed by the Company at the option of the Retirement Committee. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company approved a \$85,408,298 discretionary contribution to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, and allocations of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options – Participants may direct contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan administrator. Participants may change their investment options at any time throughout the year via direct phone and internet access to the third party administrator.

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Sponsor's discretionary-matching contribution and Sponsor's discretionary profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest rates that range from 4.25% to 9.50%. The loan interest rate, determined at date of loan origination, is set at the commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms of loans may not exceed five years. Participants are limited to one outstanding loan.

Benefits and Payments – On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installment payments as provided in the Plan document. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$7,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of lump sum cash payment. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

Forfeitures – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$4,836,307 and \$3,004,822, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay plan administrative expenses and to restore a participant's account if the participant resumes service prior to experiencing a forfeiture break in service. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$2,983,437 and plan administrative expenses were reduced by \$166,648, from forfeited nonvested accounts, in accordance with plan provisions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant note receivable balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded as defaulted distribution based upon terms of the Plan document

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administration Expenses – As provided by the Plan document, certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan and allocated to the participants and the remainder is paid by the Sponsor. Certain expenses associated with the administration of the Plan are paid through offsets and/or payments which may be attributable to the annual operating expenses of one or more of the Plan's designated investment options. Certain of these payments are credited to the Plan and are available to pay future Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Sponsor paid \$91,475 and \$93,690, respectively, in Plan administrative expenses which were reimbursed by the Plan subsequent to each year-end

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under U.S. GAAP are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following are descriptions of the methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methods used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is a quoted price in an active market and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common/Collective Trusts – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using NAV provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. As the investments are valued at NAV as a practical expedient, the common/collective trusts are not classified within the fair value hierarchy.

The investment objectives of the common/collective trusts are to maximize current income consistent with the maintenance of principal. The common/collective trusts attempt to achieve these objectives by investing primarily in guaranteed investment contracts issued by insurance companies; investment contracts issued by banks; structured or synthetic investment contracts issued by banks, insurance companies, and other issuers, as well as the securities supporting such synthetic investment contracts (underlying assets); separate account contracts; and other similar instruments that are intended to maintain a constant net asset value.

The Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants; however, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Information Certified by the Qualified Institution

- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividend income, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and revenue sharing and other income as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

5. Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of a mutual fund and common collective trusts managed by the Trustee. CAPTRUST Financial Advisors is the investment advisor and co-fiduciary. Cherry Bekaert LLP provided independent audit services to the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid to the Trustee, CAPTRUST Financial Advisors, and Cherry Bekaert LLP by the Plan totaled \$619,100 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their account balances.

7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. The pre-approved plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated August 19, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.
