1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Menlo School Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective July 1, 1994, as restated January 1, 2020. The Plan covers all employees, excluding nonresident aliens, employees who normally work less than 20 hours per week, and student employees, of Menlo School (the "School"). Eligible employees become a participant on the first day of the month beginning after their date of hire. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). The School's Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute part of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The School contributes a discretionary match of 3% of the employee's eligible compensation. The School also makes a qualified safe-harbor contribution to each eligible participant's account equal to 9% of eligible compensation. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the School's matching and safe-harbor contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions and the School's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Plan Loans

Participants may borrow directly from the custodian, subject to certain limitations, by using a portion of their Plan account as security for the plan loan. These loans do not occur directly within a participant's account but rather through a designated custodian account. Outstanding plan loan balances were \$79,913 and \$99,009 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and are not reported within the accompanying financial statements of the Plan but serve as collateral against the outstanding plan loan balances. Interest on these loans is paid directly to the custodian.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined at the time of loan issuance, is set at 1 percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through automated clearinghouse payments (ACH payments) or other repayment methods agreed to. Terms range up to 5 years or up to 10 years if the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, termination, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum, installment payment, annuity, or ad-hoc distribution in the amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account as provided in the plan document. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of lump-sum, installments, annuity, and ad-hoc payments.

Plan Servicing Credits

The Plan periodically receives excess revenue based on the terms of the service agreement with the Custodian. Plan servicing credits are allocated to the participants' accounts either equally or prorated based on the participants' share of assets.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The School's Finance and Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan's investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 5 for discussion of contract value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the loan agreement.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the School. Expenses that are paid by the School are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through August 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There are no subsequent events through the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Information Certified by Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024. Accordingly, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association and College Retirement Equities Fund ("TIAA" or "TIAA-CREF"), the Custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental *Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year)* as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurement* ("FASB ASC 820"), are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the NAV of units of such pooled accounts held by the Plan at year end. The NAV, as provided by the investment manager of the fund, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Investments in pooled separate accounts provide for daily liquidity and have no unfunded commitments or redemption features or restrictions.

Non-benefit responsive fixed annuity contracts: The non-benefit responsive fixed annuity contracts consist of investments in the TIAA Traditional Annuity. The fair value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, less any withdrawals and administrative expenses. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange. Accordingly, transactions in similar investment instruments are not observable. These are valued at Level 3 in the fair value hierarchy.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Fixed Annuity Contracts

The Plan holds a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract, for which contributions are maintained in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the sponsoring trustee, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is a fixed annuity contract that is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA-CREF, a New York domiciled non-profit, legal reserve life insurance company.

During the accumulation phase, the TIAA Traditional Annuity provides a guarantee of principal, a guaranteed minimum rate of interest (generally 1% to 3%), and the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the “declaration year,” which begins each March 1. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. When the accumulation in TIAA Traditional Annuity is converted to an annuity based on life expectancy, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulation. The TIAA Traditional Annuity does not permit TIAA to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at the specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Fixed Annuity Contracts (Continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Such events include:

1. amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan);
2. changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions;
3. bankruptcy of the School or other School events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan;
4. the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; or,
5. premature termination of the contract.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. These events may be different under each contract. Such events include:

1. an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines;
2. a breach of material obligation under the contract;
3. a material misrepresentation; or,
4. a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

6. Related-Party and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by TIAA, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the School. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the plan document to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

8. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a volume submitter plan offered by TIAA-CREF stating that the written form of the underlying specimen plan is qualified under Section 403(b) of the IRC. The volume submitter plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated August 7, 2017, stating that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods pending or in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
