#### **Note 1 - Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Bob's Red Mill 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### General

The Plan is a defined contribution safe-harbor profit-sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Bob's Red Mill Natural Foods, Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after attaining age 18 and completing 60 days of employment. The Plan engages Principal Trust Company (Custodian) to hold and invest Plan assets and execute Plan transactions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

##### Contributions

Participants are automatically enrolled to defer 5% of eligible compensation at the next entry date after they become eligible unless they choose a different percentage. The automatic enrollment can be declined by the employee upon request by the employee to change the deferral percentage to zero. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company matches a discretionary portion of participants' annual deferral.

Participants may elect to contribute up to the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), each year instead of receiving that amount in cash. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Contributions include employee pre-tax salary deferral contributions, after-tax Roth deferral contributions, or a combination of both. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover). The pre-tax amount deferred will not be subject to income tax until it is actually distributed to the participant. The amount deferred is, however, subject to Social Security tax at the time of deferral. The participants may change their deferral election each pay period.

The Plan Sponsor provides a safe harbor matching contribution up to 100% of the first 3% of eligible wages and 50% up to the next 2% of eligible wages. Matching contributions are made for all persons who were active participants and made elective deferrals at any time during the year.

The Plan also allows the Company to make discretionary non-elective contributions to participants who have met the eligibility requirements described above. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any discretionary non-elective contributions into the Plan.

##### Investment Elections

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants have the opportunity to change their investment combinations on a daily basis.

##### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are made in a manner which recognizes each participant's account balance, investment selection and timing of contributions and withdrawals. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### **Note 1 - Description of the Plan, continued**

##### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Additionally, participants are 100% vested in their non-elective contributions (safe harbor). Vesting in the Company's discretionary match plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service and occurs gradually. A participant becomes partially vested at the end of two years of credited service and is 100% vested after six years of credited service. A participant becomes fully vested in the entire balance of their account upon attainment of normal retirement age, permanent disability, death or termination of the Plan. Any amount not vested upon a participant's separation from service is forfeited and may be used to reduce the Company's contribution or pay Plan expenses.

##### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years or based on standard commercial loan terms for the purchase of a principal residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with rates charged by commercial lenders for loans made under similar circumstances. The interest rates were 3.25% to 8.50% for the year ended December 31, 2024 (3.25% to 8.50% for the year ended December 31, 2023).

##### Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to any reason, participants with vested account balances of less than \$5,000 receive an automatic distribution to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Participants with vested account balances of \$5,000 or more may elect to receive a single lump-sum amount or choose to roll over their balance into another qualified retirement plan or IRA. Participants may also elect to take in-service or hardship withdrawals subject to the terms of the Plan document and Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations.

#### **Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

##### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### Investments Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

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#### **Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued**

##### Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses to be made from the Plan's assets. Fees are charged to participants on a pro rata basis, equally to participant accounts, or specifically to a participant account for transactions specifically related to that participant.

##### Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

##### Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 18, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued (see Note 10).

#### **Note 3 - Information Certified by Custodian**

The Plan's investments are held by Principal Trust Company, the Custodian of the Plan. Investment decisions are made at the direction of the participants. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses as charged by the Custodian. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Custodian as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Custodian is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Interest on notes receivable from participants

#### **Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value is the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

The Plan follows a fair value hierarchy to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Three levels of inputs may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds):* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Collective Trusts (CCT):* CCTs invest in a variety of guaranteed investment contracts, domestic stocks, international stocks, mutual funds, bonds and other securities. The majority of the underlying securities have observable level 1 quoted pricing inputs. While the underlying asset values are generally based on publicly quoted prices, the net asset value (NAV) of each individual CCT is not valued using publicly quoted prices.

The Plan has an investment in the Principal Stable Value Z Fund which is a CCT fund that invests in conventional, synthetic, and separate account investment contracts issued by life insurance companies, banks, and other financial institutions. Characteristics of these contracts allow for their principal value to remain stable regardless of the volatility of the financial markets. The contracts are nontransferable but provide for benefit responsive withdrawals and participant transfers to noncompeting options by Plan participants at contract value. Contract value represents invested principal and accrued interest thereon. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

#### Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

#### Note 6 - Tax Status

The IRS has determined by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to section 401 of the IRC and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS.

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#### Note 6 - Tax Status, continued

Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Principal Life Insurance Company provides third-party administration services to the Plan, Principal Trust Company provides custodial services to the Plan and Cambridge Investment Research Advisors, Inc. provides investment advisory services to the Plan. Transactions with these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

#### Note 8 - Delinquent Employee Deferral Transmittals

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company was in compliance with the timely remittance of employee deferrals. In the prior year ended December 31, 2023, the Company failed to timely remit certain employee deferrals totaling \$113, of which \$89 was corrected within the same year. The remaining \$24 was subsequently remitted, and the Company made the required contributions to the Plan for lost earnings associated with these late remittances.

#### Note 9 - Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

**Note 10 - Subsequent Events**

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to introduce an automatic annual increase of employee deferral contributions by 1%, up to a maximum of 10%.
