Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of C.R. Meyer and Sons Company Employees Profit Sharing and Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of C.R. Meyer and Sons Company Employees Profit Sharing and Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of C.R. Meyer and Sons Company Employees Profit Sharing and Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to qualifying employees of C.R. Meyer and Sons Company, (the "Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended. The Plan Administration Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

Eligibility

Employees become eligible for employee contributions, as well as the Company discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions on the first day of the subsequent calendar month after attainment of age 21 and six continuous months of employment in which the employee is credited with at least 900 hours of service. If an employee does not complete the hours of service requirement during the six-month period starting with their date of hire, the employee is subject to a one-year service requirement. To be eligible for the discretionary profit sharing contribution, a participant must also provide 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year. Effective January 1, 2024, under the SECURE 2.0 Act, long-term part-time employees who reached age 21 and worked at least 500 hours in the previous three consecutive years are also eligible to participate in the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 85% of eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, on a pre-tax or Roth basis. Contributions cannot exceed the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows rollover contributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company may make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. In 2024, the Company made a discretionary matching contribution of 100% up to the first 3% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Discretionary matching contributions totaled \$433,254 in 2024. The Company made a discretionary profit sharing contribution during 2024 of \$1,490,550. Rollover contributions are not matched.

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company discretionary matching contributions, and allocations of (a) the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions, and (b) plan earnings and losses. Participants accounts are reduced by withdrawals and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest at a rate of 20% per year beginning with the second year of service and become fully vested after six years of service. In addition, a participant becomes 100% vested upon death or disability.

Payment of Benefits

Plan benefits are available in a lump-sum distribution upon termination of service because of death, disability, retirement (age 62), or normal termination with vested interests. The Plan allows for in-service distributions upon attaining age 59 1/2. Participant account balances are also distributable to the participant upon termination of employment if the balance is less than \$5,000. Participants may withdraw their rollover contributions at any time.

Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures arise as a result of participants who terminate service with the Company before becoming 100% vested in the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$57,665 at December 31, 2024 and \$20,704 at December 31, 2023. Forfeitures must first be used to pay any plan expenses or used to reduce any company contributions. Any remaining forfeitures can be used in any permissible way, as defined in the plan document, at the discretion of the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Company discretionary matching contributions were reduced by \$35,577 and Company discretionary profit sharing contributions were reduced by \$57,956 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

SECURE 2.0 Act

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 ("SECURE 2.0"), signed into law on December 29, 2022, makes significant changes to existing law for retirement plans by building upon provisions in the SECURE Act of 2019. SECURE 2.0 introduces new requirements and considerations for plan sponsors that are intended to expand coverage, increase savings, preserve income, and simplify plan rules and administrative procedures. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements. The Plan has adopted the required minimum distribution at age 73 effective January 1, 2023, the provision for long-term part-time employees previously discussed, and is in process of evaluating other voluntary provisions. The Plan is required to be amended in regard to other requirements of SECURE 2.0 by December 31, 2026.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the payment of benefits are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain fees incurred by the Plan are allocated proportionately to plan participants based on their respective account balances and are included in net appreciation in fair of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing rather than direct payment. All other expenses paid directly by the Plan are allocated proportionately to plan participants based on their respective balances and are included in administrative expenses.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority level; Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1); and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common/collective trust fund: The OneAmerica Stable Value Fund is a stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that are valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of units of the common/collective trust fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it were determined to be probable that the fund would sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common/collective trust fund, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Redemptions can occur daily with a one day notice, and there are no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 4: Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments and non-interest-bearing cash at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company ("Matrix"), the trustee of the Plan.

Note 5: Party-in-Interest Transactions

OneAmerica Retirement Services, LLC is the recordkeeper of the plan, and OneAmerica Investment Advisory serves as the investment advisor for the Plan. Transactions with these parties qualify as party-in-interest transactions. For 2024, fees paid by the Plan to OneAmerica Retirement Services, LLC for recordkeeping services were \$49,611, and fees paid by the Plan to OneAmerica Investment Advisory for investment advisory services were \$16,082.

Certain plan investments are managed by OneAmerica Asset Management, an affiliate of OneAmerica; therefore, these transactions also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment-related services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Specific detail for investment-related service fees are not available from the trustee.

Note 6: Tax Status

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document with an IRS notification letter dated August 19, 2020, which states the plan document as then designed is in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The plan document has been amended since receiving the notification letter; however, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 7: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the plan document to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions.
