Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Renkim Corporation Profit Sharing/401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefit as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Basis for Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Renkim Corporation (Company) Profit Sharing/401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. General

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan incorporating Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k) features covering all eligible employees of the Company who have one year or more of service and are age twenty-one or older. Plan entry dates occur quarterly on the first day of the first, fourth, seventh and tenth months of the Plan year. The Plan instituted automatic enrollment provisions for any newly eligible participants effective January 1, 2020. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

2. Contributions

Participants may elect to make tax deferred cash contributions or Roth contributions not to exceed the annual maximum deferral allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). If no election is made, an automatic 3% deferral will be contributed on their behalf to the Plan. The Company contributes the participant elected salary reductions. In addition, the Company may, at its discretion, contribute additional amounts as a match or profit sharing contribution determined by its Board of Directors. This additional contribution is allocated to each eligible employee in proportion to that employee's eligible compensation. As of December 31, 2024, the Company elected not to make a profit sharing contribution. The elected deferrals and Company contributions are subject to certain limitations including deferral percentage tests as determined under the IRC.

3. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the individual's contributions, (b) the various Company contributions, (c) account earnings and (d) an allocation of forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts when applicable. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

4. Vesting

All voluntary contributions to the Plan by participants and discretionary matching contributions by the Company are fully vested when made. Discretionary profit sharing contributions made by the Company vest based upon the number of years of service the participants have with the Company, with 20 percent of the contributions vesting each year beginning with the completion of the second year of service, and 100% vesting after six years of service.

5. Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow from the Plan an amount not less than \$1,000, but not more than 50 percent of his/her vested account balance. In no event can the participant borrow more than \$50,000 or have more than two loans outstanding at a time. Participant loans are for a period not exceeding five years. The notes are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest.

NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

6. Payment of Benefits

In the case of normal retirement, retirement due to permanent disability, or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive the value of his/her accumulated plan benefits, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan. In the event that a participant dies before retirement, the beneficiary will receive the value of the participant's accumulated plan benefits in a lump-sum distribution. In-service distributions are permitted at attainment of age 59 ½ and for qualified hardships.

7. Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023 forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts will be used to reduce employer contributions or investment advisory or other expenses to the Plan. There were no forfeitures applied to reduce employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

8. Administration

The Plan is administered by an administrative committee consisting of certain employees of the Company. All assets in the Plan are held in trust by the custodian, Fidelity Management Trust Company. The custodian maintains separate accounts for each individual participant. Each participant is allowed self-direction of the assets held in his/her individual account. The custodian offers various investment options, which include debt, equity and fixed rate funds.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Investment Valuation

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. See Note E for fair value considerations.

2. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

3. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

4. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 15, 2025, which is the same date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

NOTE D – ADMINISTRATIVE AND INVESTMENT EXPENSES

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No officer or employee received compensation from the Plan. Certain other Plan administrative expenses are paid directly by the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

NOTE E – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The following tables present fair value measurement information for certain financial instruments. The carrying values of receivables, cash and cash equivalents, and accrued income included in the statement of net assets available for benefits approximated fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and are not included in the following table.

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB), Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, “*Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*”, sets forth a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan used appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1-Fair Value Measurements

The fair values of mutual funds (registered investment companies) are based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

NOTE F – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

All investment information, related investment income and other amounts disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule including cash, notes receivable from participants and investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, were obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (a qualified institution), the custodian, in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to extend the audit to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan which are covered by such certification.

NOTE G – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY- IN- INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are investments under the custody of Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity). Fidelity is the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as transactions with a party-in-interest. During 2024, \$21,239 was paid to Fidelity Investment Institutional Operations Company. Certain other Plan administrative expenses are paid directly by the Company.

LPL Financial, LLC (LPL) and Strategic Advisors, Inc. (Strategic) provide the Plan investment advisory services pursuant to a Plan Services Agreement (PSA) and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. During 2024, fees paid by the Plan to LPL and Strategic totaled \$18,198 and \$1,061 respectively.

NOTE H – TAX STATUS

During 2018, the Plan adopted a volume submitter plan sponsored by FMR, LLC (Fidelity Management & Research, LLC). which obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the form of the volume submitter plan, as then designed was acceptable under the applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code. Plan management believes the Plan is in operational compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, plan management believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE I – PLAN AMENDMENTS

The Plan had no significant amendments other than those that may be discussed elsewhere in the accompanying financial statements during the periods ended December 31, 2024 or December 31, 2023.

NOTE J – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE J – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES (Continued)

Investments are selected and managed individually by the participating members of the Plan. The benefits a participant receives at retirement or on termination under this defined contribution plan are not predetermined. Income distribution or benefits are based on the assets within the participant's individual plan account at the time they retire. Under this Plan, the employee determines which investments his/her contributions, along with the contributions of the Company, are invested in from a selection of investment options available within the Plan. This allows the individual to create a portfolio suited to his/her own investment goals and tolerance for risk. The amount of money an employee has in their individual account within the Plan at retirement is based on the amount of contributions made over the years and the earnings those investments have made.

The Plan's net assets include investments which at times may be holders of some of the following instruments: asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations and commercial mortgage backed securities, including securities backed by subprime mortgage loans. The value, liquidity and related income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.
