We have audited the financial statements of A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit] for the year ended December 31, 2024 and have issued our report thereon dated September 11, 2025. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by Fidelity Management Company, the trustee, which is a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, that prepared and certified the statements or information regarding assets so held in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our engagement letter to you dated May 30, 2025. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Matters

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group 401(k) Plan are described in Note (2) to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024.

We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was:

- Management's estimate of investments at fair value is based on the quoted market prices of the underlying investments. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop the value of the investments in determining that they were reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole. The trustee of the Plan certified to us that the Plan's investments and related activity is complete and accurate. We did not perform any auditing procedures with respect to the investments at fair value.

Certain financial statement disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The most sensitive disclosure affecting the financial statements was:

- The disclosure of fair value of investments in Notes (2) and (9) to the financial statements is based on the quoted market prices of the underlying investments and is in accordance with FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditors' report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditors' report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated September 11, 2025.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan's auditors.

During our audit of the December 31, 2024 financial statements, we discussed the following matters:

Missed Employee Deferrals and Employer Match

It was noted that one participant's employee deferrals were unintentionally stopped during the 2024 plan year. This was caused by a carryover contribution cap from a prior year that was not removed. As a result, the participant did not have the opportunity to make the full amount of their elected contributions. The Plan corrected this by making a restorative contribution to the participant's account, which included a percentage of the missed deferrals and 100% of the missed match, along with calculated lost earnings. The Plan has reported this as a late remittance on the Form 5500. We recommend the Plan review its payroll and administrative processes to ensure contribution caps are properly monitored and removed at the start of each plan year.

The result of those discussions was not a condition to our retention.

Other Matters

Our responsibility for the ERISA-required supplemental schedules accompanying the financial statements is to perform adequate procedures to evaluate whether the form and content of the ERISA-required supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, is presented in compliance with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and whether the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

This information is intended solely for the use of the Executive Vice President, the board of directors and the management of A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group 401(k) Plan and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The supplemental schedules, Schedule H, Line 4(a) - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

(1) Description of the Plan

The following description of A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information on the provisions of the Plan.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of A Betterway Rent-A-Car Group, Inc., Adamson Car & Truck Rental, Inc., Easy Car Rental Company, The Kansas City Landsmen, LLC d/b/a Budget Rent-A-Car Kansas City, The Memphis Landsmen, LLC, The Salt Lake City Landsmen, LLC d/b/a Budget Rent-A-Car of Salt Lake City and The Wichita Landsmen LLC, (collectively the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor") who have completed one year of service and attained the age of 21. The Plan was established effective February 15, 1997, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

During 2024, \$566 in assets was transferred into the Plan from The Kansas City Landsmen, LLC Retirement Plan that merged with the Plan in 2022.

Contributions - Participants may elect to contribute from 1% to a maximum of 100% of their salary on a pretax basis up to a maximum amount determined annually by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Elective deferrals can be made in whole percentages of compensation or in specific dollar amounts, not to exceed \$23,000 for 2024 and \$22,500 for 2023. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions not to exceed \$7,500 for 2024 and 2023. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions ("rollover assets") from other qualified defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Employees are eligible to designate a portion of their elective deferrals as Roth elective deferrals. Effective January 1, 2018, employees who satisfy the eligibility requirements are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 2% salary deferral. The provision was applicable only to employees who started on or after that date. For applicable employees, the automatic deferral went into effect on January 1, 2019. The automatic deferral increases annually by 1%, until 4% has been reached, unless opted out by the participant. Any Company match is discretionary. Participants must have completed 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year to receive an employer matching contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company elected to match 25% of the first 6% of a participant's compensation contributed to the Plan. The employer match is limited to 1.5% of total compensation. The Plan Sponsor recorded discretionary matching contributions totaling \$164,375 and \$177,211 for the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's pre-tax and Roth 401(k) contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) Plan earnings, including unrealized appreciation, and (c) forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(1) Description of the Plan (continued)

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon once they reach the Plan entry date. Participants become vested in employer contributions in accordance with Plan provisions based upon years of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of continuous service. Participants who reach normal retirement age while still employed by the Company are also fully vested in their accounts.

Forfeitures - Forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts may be used to reduce future Company contributions or to pay Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$2 and \$3, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024 and 2023, \$13,336 and \$13,238, respectively, of forfeitures were used to reduce the Company contributions.

Investment options - The Plan offers several investment options and participants may instruct the trustee in how they want to invest their funds without regard to their vested interest. Participants may change their investment options and move their investments from one fund to another in accordance with rules established by the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator may change the investment options available to participants at any time.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between the investment fund(s) and the participant loans fund. Loan terms range from 1 to 5 years and are granted for hardship reasons or specified financial needs. The loan terms can be up to 30 years if the loan proceeds are used for the purchase of a principal residence. A participant may have no more than one loan outstanding during the Plan year. Principal and interest are repaid through payroll deductions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at market rates that are periodically adjusted by the Plan administrator, which ranged from 3.25% and 9.50% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant or beneficiary will receive an amount equal to the vested interest in the participant's account. This payment will be in the form of a lump-sum distribution of their total account balance. Participants with vested benefits in excess of \$5,000 or less are eligible to receive a lump sum distribution. Participants with vested benefits in excess of \$5,000 must give consent before a distribution is made, subject to Plan provisions. Distributions from the Plan will normally be subject to income taxes and in certain circumstances may also be subject to IRS penalties unless the distribution is transferred to another qualified plan or IRA.

Plan expenses - Substantially all Plan administrative expenses are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Basis of accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

Investment valuation and income recognition - The Plan's investments are stated at fair value in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"), Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures*, as more fully described in Note (9). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The market value of mutual funds is determined by the quoted market prices.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Investment income (loss) - Investment income (loss) consists of interest, dividends, gains (losses) on sales of securities and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in fair market value of investments. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains (losses) on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Participant loans are considered delinquent and in default when payment obligations are not met by the participants. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Risk and uncertainties - The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan expenses - Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid out of the assets of the Plan unless paid by the Plan Sponsor, as defined in the Plan document. These expenses include, but are not limited to, legal and accounting fees. However, individual transaction fees for withdrawals or notes receivable from participants are paid from the participant's account. A proportionate share of fees and expenses paid by the Plan is charged to each participant's account.

Estimates - The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

(4) Plan termination

The Company intends to continue the Plan indefinitely for the benefit of its employees, but reserves the right to amend, modify, or terminate the Plan at any time or for any reason subject to the terms of ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, the participants will be entitled to the full amounts in their account as of the date of termination, regardless of their percent vested at the time of the Plan's termination.

(5) Tax status

The Company adopted a Prototype Basic Plan Document which obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the IRS on June 30, 2020. The Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

(5) Tax status (continued)

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(6) Fidelity bond coverage

ERISA Code Section 412 requires the Plan to maintain fidelity bond coverage in an amount equal to the lesser of 10% of the total funds in the Plan as of the preceding plan year or \$500,000. The Plan has sufficient bond coverage as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(7) Excess contributions

Corrective distributions totaling \$103,478 and \$154,110 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, were made in the subsequent Plan year to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. The excess contributions are also included in the Plan's statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(9) Fair value measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest bearing cash and mutual funds: These investments consist of various publicly traded money market funds and mutual funds. The fair values are based on quoted market prices and are therefore classified as Level 1 investments.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(10) Party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and therefore those transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management and other services totaled \$80,023 and \$65,124 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

(11) Subsequent events
