Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Container Graphics Corporation Retirement and Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

(1) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and present the net assets available for plan benefits and changes in those net assets of Container Graphics Corporation Retirement and Savings Plan (the "Plan").

(b) Fair Value Measurements

For determining fair value measurements, fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. Management follows an established framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy, which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value are described below:

Level 1: quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2: inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly

Level 3: one or more significant inputs or significant value drivers are unobservable or based on market assumptions

(c) Investments

Investments in pooled separate accounts are reported at fair value based on net asset values provided by Principal Life Insurance Company ("Principal"). Guaranteed interest accounts are reported at fair value as provided by Principal (Level 3). The contract value of the guaranteed interest accounts approximates fair value. Shares of mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices in an active market for shares held by the Plan at year-end (Level 1), as provided by Principal Trust Company.

The Morley Stable Value I Fund (the "Fund") invests primarily in benefit responsive investment contracts with insurance companies, banks, and other financial institutions, the performance of which may be predicated on underlying fixed income securities. The Fund is recorded at fair value based on net asset values provided by Principal.

(c) Investments, Continued

The trustee of the Fund uses various valuation techniques to measure the fair value of the assets within the Fund. The fair value of conventional investment contracts is determined using a discounted cash flow methodology where the individual contract cash flows are discounted at the prevailing interpolated yield curve rate as of year end. Individual assets of the synthetic investment contract are generally valued at representative quoted market prices. Short-term securities, if any, are stated at amortized cost, which approximates market value. Debt securities are valued based on valuations furnished by a pricing service approved by the Fund trustee, which determines valuations using methods based on market transactions for comparable securities and various relationships between securities which are generally recognized by institutional traders. Accrued interest, if any, on the underlying investments is added to the fair value of the investments for presentation purposes.

There are several specific risks to investment contracts. One of the primary risks involved is credit risk of the contract issuer. Credit risk for security-backed contracts includes risks arising from the potential inability of the issuer to meet the terms of the contract wrapper and the potential default of the underlying fixed-income securities. Secondly, liquidity is limited because of the unique characteristics of investment contracts and the absence of an actively traded secondary market. Interest rate risk is also present because rates may be fixed with these products.

Liquidation of the entire contract with Principal may cause a one-time adjustment to the contract value resulting in a fair value different from the contract value. This total liquidation is a contingent event which cannot be initiated by the Plan participants and can only be initiated by the Plan trustees upon termination of the Plan, or complete change of funding vehicle.

Investment transactions are accounted for on the trade-date basis. There are no unfunded commitments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(d) Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

(e) Custodial and Investment Fees and Administrative Expenses

Custodial and investment fees are paid by the Plan. Certain investment management fees are charged to the individual funds in the Plan and are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments. Certain administrative expenses are absorbed by the Plan sponsor.

(f) Excess Contributions

Excess contributions owed to participants are for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). These amounts are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to employee contributions.

(g) Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(h) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the use of estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for plan benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for plan benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(2) Description of Plan

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan, a defined contribution plan sponsored by Container Graphics Corporation (the "Company"), was created to provide retirement and disability benefits to employees of the Company, and to compensate and reward them for continuous, loyal and faithful service. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Effective January 1, 2015, the plan documents were restated to ensure compliance with current regulations.

All full-time employees are eligible to participate in the Plan following 90 days of service and attainment of age 21.

(2) Description of Plan, Continued

Each Plan participant has two individual accounts: an employee pre-tax account which is funded by reductions in the employee's compensation and an employer matching account which is funded by employer matching of employee salary reduction contributions. In some cases, the participant may have a rollover account balance and/or ESOP account balance as described in note 3. The employee pre-tax account is fully vested at all times. Participants vest in their employer matching account at the rate of 20% per year after their second year of service and are fully vested after six years of service.

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Company matching contributions.

During 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were available to reduce future Company matching contributions.

Upon death, disability, or retirement at age 65, the participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a distribution of the employee pre-tax account and the employer matching account in a lump sum or in another payment form approved by the Plan administrator. Upon termination of employment for any other reason, including early retirement, participants are entitled to receive a distribution of their employee pre-tax account and the vested portion of their employer matching account.

Although the Plan sponsor does not intend to terminate the Plan, the Plan can be amended or terminated at any time. Plan termination would not deprive participants of any benefits accrued under the Plan. Participants become fully vested in their account balances upon termination of the Plan. No distributions will be made upon termination unless the participant has a right to the distribution, or the employer does not maintain a successor defined contribution plan.

The Plan's recordkeeper, and one of the custodians, is Principal. Principal offers numerous investment options in which Plan participants can elect to invest their allocated contributions. Contributions to individual funds or transfers between funds must be made in 1% increments.

(3) Contributions

Eligible employees may make contributions through payroll deductions by electing to reduce their compensation by a percentage or fixed dollar amount. In addition, salary deferrals for 2024 and 2023 were limited to \$23,000 and \$22,500, respectively, in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code. The employer may match a percentage of the employee contribution, based upon the discretion of the employer. The employer matched 50% of the first 2% of employee contributions for 2024 and 2023. In addition, the employer may make additional contributions to the Plan. No such additional contributions were made during 2024 and 2023.

(3) Contributions, Continued

The Plan administrator establishes and maintains individual accounts for each participant. Individual accounts are also maintained for all former participants who have not received distribution of the vested amounts held for their account. Allocation of the net investment earnings is made on the ratio that the balance of each participant's account on the preceding January 1 bears to the balance of the accounts of all participants on that date. For this purpose, however, account balances are reduced by amounts distributed to participants during the year. Forfeitures of non-vested balances by existing participants are treated as a reduction of the employer contribution otherwise made for the Plan year in which the forfeiture occurred.

(4) Investments and Fair Value Measurements

The custodians, Principal and Principal Trust Company, have certified that the Plan's investments and investment return as presented in the accompanying financial statements and schedule are complete and accurate as follows:

The Plan is funded with a group annuity contract with Principal. Contributions are made to the contract and are then invested in a wide spectrum of investment choices as directed by each participant. The investment objectives and underlying investments of the pooled separate accounts vary. Plan participants should refer to the Plan enrollment forms and prospectuses of the underlying investments for full descriptions of the investment strategies and redemption provisions of each individual pooled separate account.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, investments under the contract were invested in pooled separate accounts, mutual funds, a stable value fund and guaranteed interest accounts. The guaranteed interest accounts, which are not benefit responsive, represent amounts held in the general assets of Principal, which offer interest rate and principal guarantees. The rate of return totaled approximately 1.7% and 2.4% for 2024 and 2023, respectively. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments (including investments bought, sold and held during the year) appreciated by \$4,795,099 and \$5,521,760, respectively.

Interest and dividends earned on these investments totaled \$56,763 and \$39,686 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

(5) Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans may be made from Plan assets to participants on a nondiscriminatory basis. Borrowings by participants may not exceed 50% of their vested participant account balance and are subject to plan provisions. All notes are evidenced by a negotiable promissory note bearing interest at a reasonable interest rate and are secured by the participant's account balance. There was \$623,872 and \$526,550 in notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These loans bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 10.00% and become due at various times through 2048. Interest earned on loans totaled \$45,164 and \$32,354 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

(6) Federal Income Taxes

The Plan's custodians have received a letter dated March 31, 2014, in which the IRS stated that the form of the prototype plan which the Company has adopted is acceptable under the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. No provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(7) Risk and Uncertainties

Financial instruments, which potentially subject the Plan to concentration of credit risk, consist principally of investments held by Principal and Principal Trust Company in mutual funds and investment contracts. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.
