Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of *Troon Golf, L.L.C. 401(k) Plan* (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) Description of the Plan

The following description of the *Troon Golf, L.L.C. 401(k) Plan* (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

- A. **General** – The Plan was formed effective September 1, 1995, and restated as of January 1, 2022, to provide retirement savings benefits to all eligible employees of Troon Golf, L.L.C. (the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.
- B. **Eligibility** – Participation in the Plan is available to any employee of the Company who is age 19 or older following three months of service. All eligible employees are auto-enrolled into the Plan, unless the employee makes a contrary election. Effective October 1, 2022, all auto-enrolled employees are enrolled into the Plan using default deferral elections of 5% of eligible compensation (to increase 1% each year, not to exceed 10%) with investment elections into the appropriate age-based target fund, unless the participant elects otherwise.
- C. **Entry Date** – Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.
- D. **Contributions** – Participants may contribute up to 60% of eligible compensation on a pre-tax or Roth basis, not to exceed the dollar limit set by the Internal Revenue Code. Participant contributions under the Internal Revenue Code section 401(k) were subject to a maximum of \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions not exceeding \$7,500 for the year ended December 31, 2024. For the plan year ended December 31, 2025, participants who are between the ages of 60 and 64 before the year ended may make an additional catch-up contribution of \$3,750. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a diverse range of registered investment companies, two separately managed funds, and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options. The Company makes a discretionary matching contribution of 25% of participant contributions up to the first 5% of each participant's compensation.
- E. **Participant accounts** – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.
- F. **Vesting** – Participants vest immediately in their voluntary and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, and such amounts are non-forfeitable. Vesting in the matching contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant vests 3 1/3% per year after the first year of credited service and is 100% vested after three years of credited service. A participant will also be 100% vested in the employer contributions if employed on or after normal retirement age, or if termination of employment is due to death or becoming disabled.
- G. **Payment of benefits** – Upon termination of service due to retirement, disability, death or termination, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive a distribution equal to the vested balance in his or her account (or keep the balance in the Plan). Distributions may be taken in a lump sum or a series of installment payments. If the participant's vested account does not exceed \$7,000, the entire vested balance shall be payable to the participant in a single lump-sum payment.

(1) Description of the Plan (continued)

- H. **Notes receivable from participants** – Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms may range up to five years unless the loan is for the purchase of their principal residence, in which case the term can be extended to 15 years. All loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of 1% over the prime rate published in *The Wall Street Journal* on the first business day of the month the loan is originated. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly or biweekly payroll deductions.
- I. **Administrative expenses** – Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee received compensation from the Plan. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.
- J. **Plan termination** – Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.
- K. **Forfeitures** – Forfeited balances of terminated participants' accounts can be applied to pay administrative expenses, with the remaining balance available to reduce matching contributions. There were approximately \$43,000 and \$13,000 of forfeited non-vested amounts in the Plan at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures totaling approximately \$749,000 were used to reduce matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- L. **Plan merger** – As the result of an acquisition, the Eventive 401(k) Plan merged into Troon Golf 401(k) Plan, effective August 8, 2024. The merger was a complete merger including all investments of the Eventive Plan totaling approximately \$4,765,000.

(2) Significant accounting policies

The significant accounting policies followed by the Plan are as follows:

Basis of accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). Accordingly, income and contributions are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when incurred.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan invests in investment contracts through a guaranteed investment account (See Note 5).

Management's use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

(2) Significant accounting policies (continued)

Investment valuation and income recognition – Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Risks and uncertainties – The Plan provides for various investment fund options which in turn invest in any combination of stocks, bonds and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as benefit payments based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent events – Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements of the Plan were available to be issued.

(3) Fair value measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or collaborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

(3) Fair value measurements (continued)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Separately managed accounts: Stated at unit value, or the equivalent of net asset value, which is a practical expedient for estimating the fair value of these investments. Investments in the separately managed accounts may be redeemed daily with a notice period of one day and had no unfunded commitments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(4) Information certified by the Plan's trustees

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower Trust) and Empower Annuity Insurance Company, the trustees of the Plan, have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments
- Notes receivable from participants
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Interest and dividends
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Other income
- Schedule of assets (held at end of year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

(5) Investment contract with insurance company

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance reported at contract value. Empower Annuity Insurance Company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in the basis of accounting disclosure because the investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity Insurance Company represents contributions made under the contract plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following; (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The investment contract does not permit Empower Annuity Insurance Company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

(6) **Party-in-interest transactions**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company and Empower Annuity Insurance Company, who are the trustees as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. Fees paid to the trustees totaled approximately \$1,512,000 and other service providers totaled approximately \$241,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

(7) **Tax status**

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan has adopted a new Empower Trust Company, LLC Prototype Plan (the "Prototype Plan"). The Prototype Plan received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Prototype Plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Management has not obtained an individual determination letter for the Plan. The Prototype Plan has been amended since receipt of the opinion letter. Management and the Plan Administrator believe that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust remains tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been made in the accompanying financial statements.
