Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Realty Trust Group, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) at December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The Realty Trust Group, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is sponsored by Realty Trust Group, LLC (Company). The following description of the Plan is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code. An eligible employee is any person employed by the Company and has 1 year of service and is age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

Employees may defer up to 100% of their compensation, as defined by the Plan, up to limited amounts prescribed by law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan permits after tax contributions. The Company makes safe harbor contributions limited to 3% of a participant's salary and may make discretionary matching contributions. Discretionary matching contributions will not exceed 4% of a participant's compensation.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited non-vested amounts are used to reduce administrative expenses or Company contributions to the Plan. There was \$7 and \$518 of forfeited non-vested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Approximately \$1,916 was used to offset the Plan's fees during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contributions, net earnings or losses associated with their investments and an allocation of Plan expenses. Allocated earnings and expenses are based on participant account balances or earnings, as defined in the Plan. Participants may direct the investment of their account as allowed by the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Effective June 2024, participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1-5 years or up to 30 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Interest rates on notes receivable varied, but at year end was 9.5%

Payment of Benefits

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account. Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement (defined as reaching age 65), the participant will receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump-sum distribution. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts contributed may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59 ½.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN, CONCLUDED

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Investment Options

Participants are afforded several investment options covering a wide range of investment objectives and risk. Participants may allocate their contributions across these options in any proportion they wish and can change this allocation at any time. Transfers of account balances between elected investment options may also be made at any time. All investments are participant directed.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the modified cash method of accounting. Under this method, contributions are recorded when received, benefit payments and other expenses when paid, and investments stated at fair value. Interest and dividends are recognized when received.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of distributions and notes receivable from participants are charged directly the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of certain contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenue and expense during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value with the exception of the fully benefit responsive group annuity contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONCLUDED

Participant Notes Receivable

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when paid by the participant. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

3. INVESTMENTS

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians of the Plan, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the custodians.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan categorizes its assets and liabilities measured at fair value into a three-level hierarchy based on the priority of the inputs to the valuation technique used to determine fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset and liabilities' fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds are Level 1 investments.

Self directed brokerage accounts: These accounts are primarily comprised of publicly traded mutual funds and common stocks. Common stocks are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded. A small amount of these accounts is comprised of exchange traded funds where the Plan has significant transparency into the underlying positions and have no significant restrictions on redemption rights. These are valued at fair value using NAV as the practical expedient.

5. INVESTMENT IN INSURANCE CONTRACT

The Plan has a fully benefit responsive group annuity contract with an insurance company, which is called the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (KGPF). Empower Annuity Insurance Company (EAIC) maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the insurance company. Such events include the following: (1) premature termination of the contracts by the Plan, (2) plant closings, (3) layoffs, (4) Plan termination, (5) bankruptcy, (6) and early retirement incentives. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The insurance company may not terminate the contract at any amount less than the contract value.

Participant level transactions take place daily; typically, the liquidation would be processed one business day after requested. Upon termination of the EAIC group annuity contract on the Plan level, the Plan sponsor may choose the following options associated with KGPF depending on the provisions in the applicable KGPF rider:

- Receive the payout of the fund in a lump sum with a market value adjustment.
- Receive the payout of the fund in a lump sum at book value. EAIC may defer payment to a date no longer than 12 months in the future if this option is selected.
- Mutually agree in writing to any other payout option allowable under applicable law.

The insurance company is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the insurance company. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The crediting rate of the product will be established based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The average yield earned by the Plan for the group annuity contract is derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average for 2024 and 2023 was 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively. The actual average yield earned by the Plan for the group annuity contract is derived by averaging the Plan's quarterly interest rates. The average for 2024 and 2023 was 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, branded as Empower Retirement, the custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. The Plan paid fees of \$5,117 for these services during 2024.

The Plan sponsor provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. The Plan sponsor also pays for some audit and administrative expenses for the Plan for which no reimbursement is received from the Plan.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. In general, investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. PLAN TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a non-standardized plan prototype. This prototype plan volumizer obtained an opinion letter dated June 1, 2021, in which the Internal Revenue Service states that the Plan as designed was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has since been amended. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The modified cash basis of accounting requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan did not have any such uncertain tax positions for either of the years ended 2024 or 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any periods in progress.

10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through the date of the audit report which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
