Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Anesthesiology Group Associates, Inc. (APMC) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. Note A – Description of The Plan

The following description of the Anesthesiology Group Associates, Inc. (the Company) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The original effective date of the Plan was October 3, 1969. It has since been amended and restated effective January 1, 2022. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Act of 1974 (ERISA). Company management oversees the governance of the Plan and believes it is operating in compliance with the most recent rules and regulations.

The Plan is a defined contribution, safe harbor and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of the Company who have at least one month of service and are age twenty-one years or over. Entry dates for the Plan are the first day of the month coincident with or following the date after requirements eligibility are met. The Plan has an automatic enrollment feature for participants that become eligible after January 1, 2022.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a portion of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to maximum amounts and percentages as prescribed in the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts from another qualified retirement plan or IRA. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company makes a safe harbor match of 3% and a discretionary profit sharing contribution from 1.4% to 10.2% of a participants salary up to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, any rollover contribution, the Company's matching or profit-sharing contribution, and the earnings thereon. Each participant directs his or her own individual account and may redirect or exchange his or her account balance at any time. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the vested portion of a participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their contributions, as well as, the Company's profit sharing contribution upon retirement, death, or disability. The participant's vested interest in the Company's safe harbor match is based on years of continuous service with the participant being 100% vested after 5 years of service.

Payments of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or select an alternative benefit period as defined in the plan. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

The Plan allows for forfeited accounts to be used to pay certain Plan expenses or to reduce employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 forfeited account balances were \$9,744 and \$5,275, respectively.

Notes Receivable for Participants

Loans to participants are permitted in the minimum amount of \$1,000. The maximum amount that can be borrowed is the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding balance in the previous 12 months or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Each participant is allowed to have two loans outstanding at any given time. The interest rate on the loan is based on the current rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for similar loans at the time the loan is made.

Participant loan payments are made in substantially equal payments through direct, after-tax payroll deductions. Loans are to be repaid over a period of time not to exceed 5 years except that in the case the loan is used for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the loan is payable over a period of time not to exceed 15 years. There is no penalty for early loan repayments.

A loan is considered in default when a participant fails to timely remit payments under the loan when due. The plan administrator may grant the participant a cure period to correct any default which may not extend beyond the last day of the quarter following the quarter in which the loan payment was due. Any loan that has been defaulted and not corrected within the cure period is considered a distribution from the Plan.

SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 29, 2022, President Biden signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (CAA 2023) into law. The CAA 2023 includes the package of retirement provisions described as SECURE 2.0. These provisions continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on getting more participants into the retirement system, enabling them to accumulate more assets, and connecting them with those assets when they retire. The required changes in the SECURE 2.0 Act are effective for Plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2024 and fully implemented with Plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2026.

Note B – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investments are valued on each business day for which there is an established market based upon quoted market prices as of that date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net investment income includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as, held during the year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

All expenses of operating, reporting, compliance, and administration of the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements.

Date of Management's Review

In preparing these financial statements the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through the date of the independent auditors' report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note C –Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net investment income/(loss) in fair value of investments and interest for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank.

The information certified includes total investments of \$46,476,166 and \$44,804,097 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively and related investment earnings of \$6,159,332 and \$6,450,202 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note D – Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The money market account is a cash equivalent and is therefore reported at fair value.

The fair value of the mutual funds are based on quoted values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds are considered to be actively traded.

The fair value of the self directed brokerage accounts are based on the quoted values of the underlying investments which consist of interest and non interest bearing cash, common stock, mutual funds, corporate bonds, and investment trusts. These investments are regulated by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and must publish their daily values and transact at that price. These investments are considered to be actively traded.

Note E – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note F – Related Party and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Charles Schwab. Charles Schwab is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Fees paid by the Plan for investment management and administrative services amounted to \$75,913 and \$70,749 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Other costs associated with the operation, reporting, compliance and administration of the Plan are paid for by the Company.

All of these party in interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note G – Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note H - Tax Status

The Plan document is a "prototype" plan and trust sponsored by Charles Schwab. The Company is relying on an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) determination letter, dated September 21, 2020 stating the form of the Plan is acceptable under IRS Code. The Company believes that the Plan is designed and operated in compliance with applicable Code sections and, therefore, maintains its tax-exempt status.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan is no longer subject to income tax examination for tax years prior to 2020.
