Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) **Description of Plan**

The following description of the Florida Urology Partners, LLP 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

(a) **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Florida Urology Partners, LLP (the “Company”) for the benefit of its employees who have completed one year of service, which is defined as 1,000 hours in a twelve-month period and are age 21 or older. Participants can enter the Plan on a semi-annual basis on the first day of the 1st and 7th months of the plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and Principal Life Insurance Company is the Plan’s recordkeeper. Nova 401(k) Associates serves as the Plan’s third-party administrator.

(b) **Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of eligible compensation as pre-tax or Roth contributions, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Additionally, participants age 50 or older, who are making contributions to the Plan, are allowed to make catch-up contributions as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company makes a safe harbor nonelective contribution of 3% of compensation to all eligible employees of the Company during the year. Highly compensated employees are excluded from receiving the safe harbor nonelective contribution. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a \$1,803,446 profit sharing contribution to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations.

(c) **Participant Investment Account Options**

The Plan currently offers various common collective trusts as investment options for participants. Each investment option has its own investment strategy, which can be obtained through the prospectus of the respective fund. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

(1) Description of Plan - Continued

(d) Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company safe harbor nonelective contributions, as well as profit sharing contributions and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(e) Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company's safe harbor nonelective contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contributions is subject to the following vesting schedule:

Regardless of the vesting schedule, participants become 100% vested in their Company profit sharing contributions upon reaching normal retirement age (age 65) or upon death or disability.

(f) Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate in effect on the date of the loan application, plus 2%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may not have more than one loan outstanding at any time. Loan repayment terms may not exceed five years unless the purpose of the loan is to acquire a principal residence.

(g) Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement (after attaining normal retirement age) or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or partial payments from the vested portion of his or her account. Terminated participants with vested balances below certain thresholds as defined in the Plan are subject to mandatory distributions. The Plan also provides for in-service withdrawals for those age 59 ½ or older and for hardship withdrawals in the event of immediate and heavy financial need. Any hardship withdrawal is limited to the amount needed to meet the financial need and must qualify with respect to plan provisions.

(h) Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$9,700 and \$10,200, respectively. These accounts may be reallocated to participant's accounts or used to reduce employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$26,000 of plan forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. Also, employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 are presented net of \$10,047 of plan forfeitures that were used to fund the contributions in 2025.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

(c) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

(d) Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which participant contributions are withheld from compensation. Safe harbor nonelective and profit sharing contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

(e) Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(f) Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(g) Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are not included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(3) Information Prepared and Certified by the Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company and Principal Life Insurance Company on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company, the custodians of the Plan, have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedules.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common Collective Trusts: The common collective trust funds are valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The funds have no unfunded commitments.

Stable Value Common Collective Trusts: The Morley Stable Value Fund and Principal Stable Value Fund are stable value funds that are composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are no participant redemption restrictions; the redemption notice period is applicable to the Plan. The fund has no unfunded commitments.

(5) Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are common collective trusts for which Principal Global Investors Trust Company is the trustee. Principal is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants are managed by Principal at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Principal is the custodian for the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid certain expenses related to the Plan's operations of approximately \$82,000 to Principal. While these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined in Section 3(14) of ERISA, they are expressly exempted from the prohibited transaction rules.

(6) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company profit sharing contributions.

(7) Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined that the pre-approved plan document adopted by the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC and informed Nova 401(k) Associates of such in a letter dated June 30, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(8) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(9) Delinquent Participant Contributions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer’s general assets. The Company did not remit \$33 of employee contributions during the year ended December 31, 2023. Additionally, contributions and loan repayments totaling \$186 and \$10,616 were not remitted within the required time period for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, the Company remitted the lost earnings associated with the \$10,616 of delinquent participant contributions from 2023. The Company is in the process of remitting the remaining delinquent employee contributions, including any lost earnings as a result.

(10) Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan document was amended and restated. As part of this amendment and restatement, the Plan’s eligibility requirements with respect to elective deferrals were changed from one year of service to 60 days of service. Also, the entry date with respect to elective deferrals was changed from a semi-annual basis on the first day of the 1st and 7th months of the plan year to the first day of the month coinciding with or next following date the eligibility requirements are met.

The Plan’s management has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through September 12, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
