Opinion

Note 1. Description of the C.C. Clark, Inc. Health and Welfare Benefit Plan

General

The following description of the C.C. Clark, Inc. Health and Welfare Benefit Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and *Summary Plan Description* for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the Plan administrator.

The Plan provides health and certain other welfare benefits covering substantially all employees and covered dependents, as applicable, of the following companies (collectively, Company):

- Clark Distributing Company, Inc.
- Clark Beverage Group, Inc. (Kentucky).
- Clark Beverage Group, Inc. (Mississippi).
- C.C. Clark, Inc.
- C.C. Clark Kentucky, Inc.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as amended. The Plan's trustees are William Dallas Clark III, Robert Clark, and George Clark.

Benefits

The Plan provides health benefits (medical and prescription drugs) to full-time participants with at least 30 days of service and to their beneficiaries and covered dependents. The Plan also provides continuation of certain benefits upon termination of employment through the *Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act* (COBRA) and certain other postemployment benefits. Benefits are paid on behalf of eligible participants after they have satisfactorily complied with the claim's procedures specified in the Plan.

Stop-Loss Coverage

The Plan has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for individual participant claims over a specific dollar amount.

Self-Insured Benefits

All Plan benefits are self-insured. The claims for self-insured benefits are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under administrative services only arrangements. The Plan pays claims processed by third-party claims processors directly to providers on behalf of participants. Despite the Plan's utilization of third-party claims processors, ultimate responsibility for payments to providers is retained by the Plan.

Contributions

In addition to deductibles and copayments, participants contribute specified amounts, based on applicable premiums for their respective benefit elections. The Company makes contributions to the Plan, as needed, to fund claims in excess of participants' contributions. Any deficiency of the Plan's net assets over benefit obligations is funded by the Company on a pay-as-you-go basis.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations, and changes therein, incurred but not reported, claims payable, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Claim payments are recorded when paid by the third-party claim's processors. The third-party claims processors process claims of participants, dependents, and beneficiaries, but the responsibility for payments to providers is retained by the Plan. These payments are recorded as claims paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Stop Loss

Premiums for stop-loss insurance are included in administrative expenses in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. The insurance limited the Plan's exposure per individual for the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, to \$500,000. No claims exceeded the stop-loss limits during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Refunds

Refunds received by the Plan are recorded when earned and are netted with benefits paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Refunds due as of the financial statement date are recorded as a receivable, if applicable.

Other Plan Benefits

Plan obligations for health and other claims incurred but not reported, are estimated based upon historic claims experience and actual claims reported subsequent to the Plan year-end. Additional accruals are included for the estimated ultimate cost of future claims, only if such claims are covered as of the Plan's fiscal year-end and the Plan is obligated to pay for the care, regardless of continued participation in the Plan.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value and consist solely of an interest-bearing cash account. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

Note 3. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield

curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections, and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy. The Plan has no investments valued within level 2 or 3 of the hierarchy.

Note 4. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Fees in the amount of \$652,699 and \$642,910 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, were paid by the Plan to MaxorPlus, LTD. and UnitedHealthcare, the Plan's third-party administrators, for certain administrative services and stop-loss premiums. Fees paid for professional and other services totaled \$125,224 and \$23,109 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

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Amounts currently payable to or for participants, dependents, and beneficiaries are recorded on the Form 5500 for estimated benefit claims that have been processed and approved for payment prior to December 31, but not yet paid as of that date.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to, and contributions required of, participants to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, remaining assets will be applied in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner toward the provision of benefits for or on account of the participants. No assets of the Plan may revert to the Company or be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.

Note 7. Tax Status

The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is intended to qualify, pursuant to Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The trust has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the IRS and the Plan sponsor believes the trust continues to qualify and to operate in accordance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8. Plan Amendment

Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to change the eligibility requirements from 60 days of service to 30 days of service.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 20, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
