1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the KAI U.S.A., Ltd. (“Company”) 401(k) Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Reference should be made to the Plan document for a more complete description of its provisions.

**GENERAL.** The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan and employee profit sharing plan covering employees of KAI U.S.A., Ltd. who have met an age and period of service requirement. The Plan Administrator controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) serves as the investment advisor, trustee, custodian, and agent of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**CONTRIBUTIONS.** Contributions to the Plan are in the form of salary reductions which participants have elected to defer in lieu of current compensation. For 2024 and 2023, the Company contributed 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation plus 65% of the next 3% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company.

**PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS.** Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s elective contributions, an allocation of the employer’s contributions, and an allocation of the Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is based on the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

**INVESTMENT OPTIONS.** Upon enrollment, a participant may direct contributions to certain investment accounts selected by the trustee and the Plan Administrator. Participants may change their investment options daily.

**VESTING.** Participants are fully vested in their rollover, elective, and safe harbor matching contributions plus earnings thereon. Effective April 4, 2004, the Plan became a "safe harbor 401(k) Plan". This type of plan requires a matching contribution equal to 100% of the salary deferrals not to exceed 6% of compensation. This safe harbor matching contribution is fully vested.

**NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS.** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, and are treated as notes receivable from participants. The minimum note amount is \$1,000. Generally, note terms range from one to five years, are secured by the balance in the participant's account, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the local lending market. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

**PAYMENT OF BENEFITS.** On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to their vested account value or a combination of cash distribution and direct rollover distribution. On May 23, 2023 the Plan was amended to require automatic distributions for terminated participants whose balances do not exceed \$5,000.

**HARDSHIP WITHDRAWALS.** Pre-retirement distributions of elective deferrals are available on a hardship basis. These distributions are limited to the specific financial need. They must be approved by the trustee on a nondiscriminatory basis.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN - Continued

PLAN TRUSTEE/RELATED PARTY. The trustee of the Plan is Fidelity Management Trust Company. The trustee is responsible for the custody of Plan assets. A material portion of employee and Company contributions are invested in various money market and mutual funds maintained by an affiliate of the trustee; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The trustee receives fees for services provided on behalf of the investment funds. Fund earnings are presented net of these fees. Plan assets invested in these funds totaled \$21,704,442 and \$18,327,551 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. A net appreciation in fair value of \$1,985,613 and \$2,643,845 occurred in these funds for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan utilizes the investment advisory services of Strategic Advisors, Inc. and recordkeeper services of Fidelity Investments Institutional Operations Company, Inc. These fees qualify as party-in-interest transactions totaling \$13,428 and \$20,564 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Plan employs accounting policies generally accepted in the United States of America. The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") has issued guidance which establishes the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (the "Codification" or "FASB ASC") as the source of authoritative accounting principles recognized by the FASB to be applied to nongovernmental entities in the preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

**BASIS OF ACCOUNTING.** The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**USE OF ESTIMATES.** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS - MONEY MARKET FUNDS.** Money market funds are valued at cost which approximates market.

**VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS - MUTUAL FUNDS.** Investments in mutual funds are carried at fair value, which is the net asset value per unit of each mutual fund multiplied by the number of units owned. The value of each unit is computed by the mutual fund company on the last business day of the plan year, based on quoted market prices of the underlying securities, bonds and other financial instruments owned by each fund.

**NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS.** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**PAYMENT OF BENEFITS.** Benefits are recorded when paid.

**EXPENSES.** Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

## 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - Continued

**RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES.** The Plan provides for investment options in mutual funds, which invest in portfolios of investment securities through Fidelity, trustee of Plan assets. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

From time to time, investments may include securities with contractual cash flows, such as asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations and commercial mortgage backed securities, including securities backed by subprime mortgage loans. The value, liquidity and related income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.

The Plan has implemented the accounting guidance for uncertainty in income taxes using the provisions of FASB ASC 740, *Income Taxes*. Using that guidance, the Plan does not believe it has any uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**SUBSEQUENT EVENTS.** The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 26, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available for issue.

## 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS AND DISCLOSURES

The Plan has adopted the provisions of FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*. FASB ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 for financial assets and financial liabilities are described below:

Pursuant to FASB ASC 820, fair value is a market-based measure, considered from the perspective of a market participant who owns an asset or owes a liability. Accordingly, when market observable data is not readily available, assumptions are set to reflect those that market participants would be presumed to use in pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Prices and inputs are used that are current as of the measurement date, including during periods of market disruption. In periods of market disruption, the ability to observe the prices and inputs may be reduced for many instruments. This condition could cause an instrument to be reclassified from Level 1 to Level 2 or from Level 2 to Level 3.

4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is utilizing a volume submitter as its plan document. The volume submitter obtained its latest opinion letter, dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the employer Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, participants would become fully vested in all their accounts.

6. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE OF THE PLAN

The following summary of unaudited information regarding the Plan and included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule was certified by the trustee of the Plan, Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
