

Notes to the Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Tremblays Bus Co LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan was established on January 1, 1992, as restated January 1, 2024. The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Tremblay's Bus Co., LLC (the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA) and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's plan administrator.

Eligibility - The Plan is offered to all full-time employees who are at least 21 years of age and have completed at least one year of service to the Company. Once an employee reaches the eligibility requirements, they may enter the Plan on January 1 or July 1 of the upcoming plan year. Participants are also eligible to receive discretionary profit-sharing contributions if actively employed at the Company as of the last day of the year.

Contributions - Participants may contribute a percentage of their pretax eligible compensation, from 1 percent to 100 percent in increments of 1 percent, up to the maximum allowed by the IRC, as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants who have reached the age of 50 prior to the current year end are eligible to make catch-up contributions, subject to certain limitations. The Plan also allows participants to make after-tax Roth contributions subject to certain limitations determined by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan also offers participants the ability to make Roth contributions as a percentage of post-tax compensation into the Plan.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions in an amount equal to 100 percent of the first 2 percent of a participant's eligible compensation, and 50 percent of the next 2 percent of a participant's eligible compensation contributed to the Plan. Employer safe harbor matching contributions are subject to certain limitations under the IRC. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed \$201,125 in safe harbor matching contributions.

The Company, at its discretion, may make additional employer matching contributions and profit-sharing contributions to eligible participants, as defined by the Plan. Allocations are based on each participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation. The Company made no discretionary employer matching contributions or profit-sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, allocations of the Company's discretionary contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, employer safe harbor contributions and discretionary employer matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20 percent vested after two years of credited service and continues to vest in increments of 20 percent until 100 percent vested after six years of credited service. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a participant shall be 100 percent vested in and have a nonforfeitable right to his or her account upon reaching normal retirement, death or total and permanent disability while in service.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined daily, is set at one percent above the prime rate, as defined. Terms range up to five years or up to 10 years in length for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or by direct payment to the Plan. A participant may have two notes outstanding at any given time.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account, or annual installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or applied to the purchase of an annuity contract. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the plan administrator may make a lump sum distribution to the individual. If the participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 but no more than \$5,000, the plan administrator may make a direct rollover to an eligible individual retirement account. In-service withdrawals are allowed from any of the participant's vested accounts once they are over age 59½.

Distribution of vested account balances of at least \$5,000 may be deferred by retired employees until age 72, at which time required minimum distributions under ERISA must begin. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions where a participant may withdraw a portion of his or her vested balance to meet specific heavy financial needs as defined by the IRC, subject to certain limitations outlined in the Plan.

Forfeited accounts - Forfeited funds are used to reduce future employer contributions or plan administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$210 were used to reduce employer matching contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no unallocated forfeitures.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and changes in net assets available for benefits during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year such adjustments are determined.

Investment valuation and income recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The investment in pooled separate accounts is valued at the net asset value (the NAV) per unit, as determined by the custodian at year end. The NAV is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the fair value of the underlying investment held by the fund, less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Investments valued at NAV used as the practical expedient are excluded from the fair value hierarchy.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

If a participant fails to make a payment when a loan is due under the terms of the loan, that participant will be in default. In the event of default, the loan shall become due and payable immediately, and interest will continue to accrue until the entire loan balance is repaid. The Plan will take all reasonable actions to collect the balance owed on the loan. Under certain circumstances, the loan in default could be considered a distribution from the Plan and could be considered income to the participant. In any event, failure to repay a loan will reduce the benefit to which a participant would otherwise be entitled from the Plan.

Payment of benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent events - Subsequent events were evaluated through September 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation technique used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the technique used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Pooled separate accounts invest in mutual funds and are valued at the NAV of unit of individual mutual funds the accounts have invested in. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the accounts less its liabilities. Pooled separate accounts are not available in an exchange and active market, however, the fair value is determined based on the underlying investments as traded in an exchange and active market. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (John Hancock), the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

5. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the custodian of the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the plan sponsor. No such officer or employee receive compensation from the Plan.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by John Hancock Retirement Plan Services. The pre-approved plan received an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Determination Letter dated June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Determination Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax asset or liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of an asset or liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Tremblays Bus Co LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan was established on January 1, 1992, as restated January 1, 2024. The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Tremblay's Bus Co., LLC (the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA) and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's plan administrator.

Eligibility - The Plan is offered to all full-time employees who are at least 21 years of age and have completed at least one year of service to the Company. Once an employee reaches the eligibility requirements, they may enter the Plan on January 1 or July 1 of the upcoming plan year. Participants are also eligible to receive discretionary profit-sharing contributions if actively employed at the Company as of the last day of the year.

Contributions - Participants may contribute a percentage of their pretax eligible compensation, from 1 percent to 100 percent in increments of 1 percent, up to the maximum allowed by the IRC, as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants who have reached the age of 50 prior to the current year end are eligible to make catch-up contributions, subject to certain limitations. The Plan also allows participants to make after-tax Roth contributions subject to certain limitations determined by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan also offers participants the ability to make Roth contributions as a percentage of post-tax compensation into the Plan.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions in an amount equal to 100 percent of the first 2 percent of a participant's eligible compensation, and 50 percent of the next 2 percent of a participant's eligible compensation contributed to the Plan. Employer safe harbor matching contributions are subject to certain limitations under the IRC. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed \$201,125 in safe harbor matching contributions.

The Company, at its discretion, may make additional employer matching contributions and profit-sharing contributions to eligible participants, as defined by the Plan. Allocations are based on each participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation. The Company made no discretionary employer matching contributions or profit-sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, allocations of the Company's discretionary contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, employer safe harbor contributions and discretionary employer matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20 percent vested after two years of credited service and continues to vest in increments of 20 percent until 100 percent vested after six years of credited service. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a participant shall be 100 percent vested in and have a nonforfeitable right to his or her account upon reaching normal retirement, death or total and permanent disability while in service.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined daily, is set at one percent above the prime rate, as defined. Terms range up to five years or up to 10 years in length for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or by direct payment to the Plan. A participant may have two notes outstanding at any given time.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account, or annual installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or applied to the purchase of an annuity contract. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the plan administrator may make a lump sum distribution to the individual. If the participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 but no more than \$5,000, the plan administrator may make a direct rollover to an eligible individual retirement account. In-service withdrawals are allowed from any of the participant's vested accounts once they are over age 59½.

Distribution of vested account balances of at least \$5,000 may be deferred by retired employees until age 72, at which time required minimum distributions under ERISA must begin. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions where a participant may withdraw a portion of his or her vested balance to meet specific heavy financial needs as defined by the IRC, subject to certain limitations outlined in the Plan.

Forfeited accounts - Forfeited funds are used to reduce future employer contributions or plan administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$210 were used to reduce employer matching contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no unallocated forfeitures.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and changes in net assets available for benefits during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year such adjustments are determined.

Investment valuation and income recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The investment in pooled separate accounts is valued at the net asset value (the NAV) per unit, as determined by the custodian at year end. The NAV is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the fair value of the underlying investment held by the fund, less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Investments valued at NAV used as the practical expedient are excluded from the fair value hierarchy.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

If a participant fails to make a payment when a loan is due under the terms of the loan, that participant will be in default. In the event of default, the loan shall become due and payable immediately, and interest will continue to accrue until the entire loan balance is repaid. The Plan will take all reasonable actions to collect the balance owed on the loan. Under certain circumstances, the loan in default could be considered a distribution from the Plan and could be considered income to the participant. In any event, failure to repay a loan will reduce the benefit to which a participant would otherwise be entitled from the Plan.

Payment of benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent events - Subsequent events were evaluated through September 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation technique used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the technique used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Pooled separate accounts invest in mutual funds and are valued at the NAV of unit of individual mutual funds the accounts have invested in. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the accounts less its liabilities. Pooled separate accounts are not available in an exchange and active market, however, the fair value is determined based on the underlying investments as traded in an exchange and active market. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (John Hancock), the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

5. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the custodian of the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the plan sponsor. No such officer or employee receive compensation from the Plan.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by John Hancock Retirement Plan Services. The pre-approved plan received an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Determination Letter dated June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Determination Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax asset or liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of an asset or liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
