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To the Plan Administrator and Participants of the  
Northwood Investments Corp 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Northwood Investments Corp 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management of the Plan (Management), having determined that it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL's) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

#### Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

#### 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Northwood Investments Corp 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of eligible employees of Northwood Manufacturing, Inc. and Outdoors RV Manufacturing, Inc. (collectively "the Employer"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). Principal Trust Company ("the Trustee" or "Principal") is the appointed custodian of the Plan's assets. The Plan is administered by management of the Employer. Participants may direct their contributions and account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

##### Eligibility

Employees – other than those who are leased employees, covered by a collective bargaining agreement, residents of Puerto Rico, independent contractors, or non-resident aliens – are eligible to participate in the Plan if they are age 18 or older and have 30 days of service with the Employer. Qualifying employees may participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following the date that they meet the eligibility requirements.

##### Contributions

Participants may elect to defer up to 50% of their eligible compensation, subject to current Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision, whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of their eligible compensation with annual increases by 1% each year up to a maximum of 10% unless the employee affirmatively elects otherwise. Such contributions are invested in an age-based target retirement fund until changed by the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (i.e., rollover contributions). A participant may not make non-deductible voluntary contributions to the Plan.

At the option of the Employer's Board of Directors, the Employer may elect to make matching contributions to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer elected to make matching contributions of 25% of the first 6% of each participant's eligible compensation, as determined on a per-pay period basis.

In addition, the Employer may make a discretionary profit sharing contribution. Discretionary profit sharing contributions are allocated to each participant's account on a proportionate basis of eligible compensation for the Plan year. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer made discretionary profit sharing contributions of \$0 and \$700,843, respectively.

Contributions received from participants for 2024 and 2023 are net of payments of \$81,907 and \$55,391 made in 2025 and 2024, respectively, to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These amounts are also included in the Plan's statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

### Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited (charged) with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Employer's contributions, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) administrative expenses. Earnings (losses) for each investment fund are allocated to participants' accounts based on the individual participant's account balance as compared to the total balance of the related investment fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their voluntary salary contributions, rollover contributions, and the actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Employer's matching and discretionary profit sharing contributions is based on years of service as follows:

In addition, upon death, disability, or retirement at age 65 or older, participants will immediately become 100% vested in their share of the Employer's contributions and the actual earnings (losses) thereon.

### Forfeitures

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts were insignificant. At the Employer's discretion, forfeited accounts may be used to reduce future Employer contributions and/or to pay Plan expenses. Forfeitures that have not been used to reduce Employer contributions or pay Plan expenses shall be allocated to participants as of the last day of the Plan year. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Employer contributions were reduced by forfeitures of approximately \$100,000 and \$104,000, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeitures allocated to participant accounts.

### Notes receivable from participants

Participants may elect to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by the highest outstanding participant note receivable balance in the preceding one-year period. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the balances in the respective participants' accounts. Terms of notes receivable from participants range from one to five years, unless used to acquire the participant's principal residence, in which case the term may be extended up to 25 years. The notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Trustee. Interest rates on notes receivable from participants outstanding as of December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

#### Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

#### **Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant (or their beneficiary) may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For termination of service for other reasons, distributions of vested balances less than or equal to \$1,000 are automatically made in a lump-sum. If the terminated participant's vested balance exceeds \$1,000 but is less than \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to receive a distribution, the Plan permits the plan administrator to make a distribution directly to an individual retirement account set up on the participant's behalf. For vested balances greater than or equal to \$5,000, the Plan permits a participant to elect distribution by lump-sum. Upon reaching age 59½, participants may make in-service withdrawals of part or all of their elective contributions, including the related earnings (losses).

#### **Hardship withdrawals**

Participants who are still employed by the Employer are permitted to take withdrawals from their accounts under certain financial hardship conditions, as described in the Plan document.

#### **Administrative expenses**

At the Employer's discretion, administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid directly by the Employer; certain other administrative expenses may be paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from the accompanying financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the related participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are offset against net appreciation in fair value of investments in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### **Use of estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Investment valuation**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisers and Trustee. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount that participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

#### Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

#### **Investment income recognition**

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Notes receivable from participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the note receivable to be in default, the note receivable balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

#### **Payment of benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### **Subsequent events**

The plan administrator has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements, subsequent events that have occurred through August 27, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

### **3. Certified Investments**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years then ended, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company, a qualified institution.

### **4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (the Contract) with Principal. Principal maintains the related contributions in its general account. The general account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The Contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the Contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the Contract, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The crediting interest rate is based on current economic and market conditions, the general interest rate environment, and both the expected and actual experience of a reference portfolio within Principal's general account but may not be less than 0.15%. Such interest rates are reviewed by Principal on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The crediting rate of the Contract is intended to reflect current market yields on a trailing basis.

#### Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk associated with the Contract issuer or the underlying investments. However, the Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the Contract issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The Contract issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Principal. Such events include additions by the Plan of competing investment options or events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Contract. If the Plan were to request a liquidation of the Contract, a market value adjustment may apply. Management does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value are probable of occurring.

#### 5. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and requires certain disclosures about fair value measurements. The hierarchy of fair value valuation techniques under GAAP provides for three levels: Level 1 provides the most reliable measure of fair value, whereas Level 3, if applicable, generally would require significant management judgment. The three levels for categorizing assets and liabilities under GAAP's fair value measurement requirements are as follows:

- Level 1: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets (that the Plan has the ability to access) for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the applicable asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar (as opposed to identical) assets or liabilities in active markets and quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; and
- Level 3: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using unobservable inputs that are significant to the fair value measurement and reflect the Plan's own assumptions regarding the applicable asset or liability.

An asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for the Plan's assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds* - The fair value of mutual funds is based on the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Pooled separate accounts* – The fair value of investments held in pooled separate accounts is based on the NAV of the units held by the Plan at year-end, which are determined based on the quoted pricing inputs of the underlying investments. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value; and, accordingly, the Plan's investments in pooled separate accounts are excluded from the fair value hierarchy in accordance with GAAP. The underlying investments comprising the pooled separate accounts are primarily mutual funds, which are valued at quoted market prices.

All of the Plan's investments in pooled separate accounts and the guaranteed investment contract provide for daily redemption at the prior day's ending NAV, with no advance notification requirements. Under certain circumstances, as disclosed in Note 4, redemption restrictions may apply.

### 6. Related Party Transactions

Certain of the Plan's investments are invested in funds offered by the Trustee. Therefore, transactions involving these investments qualify as party-in-interest.

The Employer is the sponsor of the Plan and paid substantially all administrative expenses of the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. In addition, the plan administrator is a participant in the Plan.

### 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

### 8. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a volume submitter plan (the Volume Submitter Plan) developed by Principal. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed Principal by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Volume Submitter Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since Principal received the determination letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

#### Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment instruments which are exposed to certain risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the Plan's investments will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.
