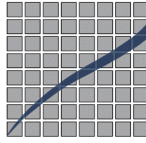

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**1. PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following description of Left Hand Brewing Company 401(k) Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, which became effective January 1, 2015, is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Indian Peaks Brewing Company dba Left Hand Brewing Company ("Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Eligibility

Eligible employees include all employees, as defined in the plan document, who have completed two months of service and who are at least 21 years old.

Contributions

Deferral contributions cannot exceed certain limits as set forth by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") (\$23,000 and \$22,500 for 2024 and 2023, respectively; \$30,500 and \$30,000 for employees age 50 or older in 2024 and 2023, respectively). The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") adjusts this limitation each year for cost-of-living increases. Rollover contributions are accepted, as permitted by the Plan. Contributions from plan participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

The Company may make discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions on behalf of each eligible employee. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made no contributions to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company matched 100 percent of participants' elective deferrals up to 1 percent of compensation and 25 percent of each additional percentage of participants' elective deferrals up to 9 percent of compensation, with a maximum match of 3 percent. The total non-elective employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$0 and \$40,148, respectively.

Automatic deferral

The Company has implemented an automatic deferral contribution of 7% of plan compensation and increases 1% per year, up to a maximum of 9%. Employees may elect other deferral amounts or not to participate.

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Participant accounts

Each participant's account is increased with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions and allocations of plan earnings, and is decreased by the participant's distributions and an allocation of plan losses and expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. There is a six-year graded vesting schedule for the Company's contributions.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts in amounts ranging from a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest. The term of the loan is a maximum of five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence. A participant may not have more than one outstanding note at any one time. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum or partial payments for the amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account over a specified period not to exceed the life or life expectancy of the participant. For termination of services due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution as soon as administratively practicable following the date the participant terminates employment.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses, reduce future employer contributions, or be reallocated participant accounts. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$20,010 and \$0 was used to reduce employer contributions, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$26,390 and \$24,349 was used to pay administrative expenses, respectively. As of December 31,

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2024 and 2023, the forfeiture balances totaled \$28,166 and \$52,710, respectively.

Unallocated funds may be used to reduce employer contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$18,900 and \$345 was used to reduce employer contributions, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated fund balances totaled \$1,634 and \$20,796, respectively.

Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in the Company's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP") requires the use of estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

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Payments of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Tax status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the letter, the Plan administrator and tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate income tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the income tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Subsequent events

Plan management evaluated subsequent events through the date of the attached independent auditor's report, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

**4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce amounts that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used between December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three levels:

Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than prices included in Level 1, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated with observable market data

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

The Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option is a traditional investment contract in which participant principal and interest are fully guaranteed by the entire general account assets of Principal Life Insurance Company ("insurance company"). The

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investment contract is a general account product offered through a group annuity contract and crediting rates are net of cost of capital and expenses covered by the fund and guarantee provisions. The strength of the guarantee is dependent on the financial strength of the insurance company issuing the contract. Based upon the characteristics of the contract, the contract meets the definition of fully benefit-responsive investment contract.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the insurance company. Such events include: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; or (5) premature termination of the contract. Plan management does not believe that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is probable. The insurance company is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

Certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

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**7. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investments. Investments, in general, are exposed to risks, including interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and potentially the participants' abilities to withdraw funds from certain investment accounts. These risks could impact the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
