## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR’S REPORT**

To the Administrative Committee  
24 Hour Fitness Savings and Investment Plan

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the 24 Hour Fitness Savings and Investment Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting as described in Note 1 to the financial statements.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting**

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1, and for determining that the cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with modified cash basis of accounting as described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with modified cash basis of accounting as described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023**

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#### **1. THE PLAN AND ITS SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**General** – The following description of the 24 Hour Fitness Savings and Investment Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established in 1993 by 24 Hour Fitness USA, LLC (the “Company”), formerly 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc., to provide benefits to eligible employees as defined in the Plan document. The Plan is intended to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and the provisions of ERISA.

The Company most recently amended and restated the Plan effective September 3, 2024 as a result of a change in trustee and custodian.

**Administration** – The Company has appointed an Administrative Committee to manage the operation and administration of the Plan. Beginning September 3, 2024, T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. (“T. Rowe Price”) is the trustee and custodian of the Plan assets. Prior to September 3, 2024, State Street Bank and Trust Company (“SSBT”) was the trustee and custodian of Plan assets. Beginning September 3, 2024, T. Rowe Price acts as third-party administrator, processes and maintains the records of participant data. Prior to September 3, 2024, Transamerica Retirement Solution Corporation (“Transamerica”) acted as third-party administrator, processed and maintained the records of participant data.

**Basis of accounting** – The Plan prepares its financial statements on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”). Consequently, contributions and certain investment income are generally recognized when received rather than when earned and distributions and administrative expenses are generally recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

**Estimates** – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Forfeited accounts** – Forfeited non-vested accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay expenses of the Plan. During 2024 and 2023, forfeitures totaling \$143,644 and \$112,821, respectively, were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had unallocated forfeitures totaling \$10,332 and \$118,713, respectively.

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*Investments* – Investments of the Plan are held by T. Rowe Price (and previously SSBT until September 3, 2024) and are invested based solely upon instructions received from participants.

The Plan's investments are stated at actual fair value or amounts approximating fair value. Mutual funds are stated at fair value as reported by the Plan's trustee as determined by quoted market prices on an established exchange. The Plan's investments in common/collective trusts are valued at fair market value, as provided by the Plan's trustee. The common/collective trust is credited with contributions made under the contract, plus earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Realized gains or losses on investment transactions are recorded as the difference between the proceeds received and the fair value of the investment at the beginning of the Plan year, or cost if acquired during the Plan year. In accordance with the Plan's policy of stating investments at fair value, net unrealized appreciation or depreciation is included in the statement of changes in net assets in the period in which the market change occurs. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received.

The Plan follows the guidance of U.S. GAAP for measuring fair value of investments. Those principles establish a framework for the measurement of fair value and provide a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level one measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level three measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level one: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level two: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level two input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level three: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Transfers in and out of level three are recognized on the date of the event or circumstance that caused the transfer.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation

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techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The Plan's method of valuing investments may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

***Income taxes*** – The Plan received the latest favorable determination letter dated August 19, 2020. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is operated in accordance with, and qualifies under, the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and related state statutes, and that the trust, which forms a part of the Plan, is exempt from federal income and state franchise taxes. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

***Risks and uncertainties*** – The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of investment securities offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in market values, interest rates or other factors in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis. Financial instruments, which potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of the aforementioned risks, consist of mutual funds and common/collective trust funds. As the Plan's investments are well-diversified and issuers of the funds' underlying securities are dispersed throughout many industries and geographies, the concentrations of credit and other risks are limited.

***Subsequent Events*** – The Plan's management evaluates events or transactions occurring after the statement of net assets available for plan benefits date but before the financial statements are available to be issued for potential recognition or disclosure. The financial statements include all subsequent events considered necessary for a fair presentation. For the purposes of the accompanying financial statements, subsequent events have been evaluated through September 5, 2025, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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#### **2. PARTICIPATION AND BENEFITS**

***Participant contributions*** – Participants may elect to have the Company contribute their eligible pre-tax compensation to the Plan, up to the amount allowable under the Plan document and current income tax regulations. Participants who elect to have the Company contribute a portion of their compensation to the Plan agree to accept an equivalent reduction in taxable compensation. Participants may also elect to have the Company contribute a portion of their compensation after-tax in the form of a Roth deferral. Contributions withheld are invested in accordance with the participant's direction.

Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions of amounts received from other tax-qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans. Such contributions are deposited in the appropriate investment funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the Plan's provisions.

***Employer contributions*** – The Plan allows for employer contributions in the form of discretionary matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 25% of each eligible participant's contribution, up to a maximum of 4% of each participant's eligible compensation per pay period. The Company made matching contributions totaling \$467,407 and \$494,265 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Company did not make any profit sharing contributions during the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

***Participant accounts*** – A separate account is maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Plan earnings or losses and an allocation of Company contributions, if any, less withdrawals, distributions and administrative expenses, if any. Allocation of Company matching contributions is based on participant contributions. Participants direct the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered under the Plan. Participant accounts are valued on a daily basis. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

***Vesting*** – Participants are fully vested at all times in their salary deferral and rollover contributions and related earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and profit sharing contributions is progressive based on length of service. Participants generally become fully vested in Company contributions over a three-year period.

***Notes receivable from participants*** – The Plan allows participants to borrow not less than \$1,000 and up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the participant's vested balance. Such loans bear interest at the available market financing rates. The term of the loans generally cannot exceed five years, except for the purchase of a principal residence, which may be repaid over a period of 20 years (previously 30 years with Transamerica). Principal and interest are repaid ratably through payroll deductions. Notes receivable from participants are stated at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest but unpaid interest. Any participant defaults are deemed taxable distributions to the participant.

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*Administrative expenses* – All reasonable expenses of administering the Plan may be paid out of the Plan assets or directly by the Company. The majority of Plan administrative expenses were paid by the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Payment of benefits* – Benefits are generally recorded when paid. Upon termination, participants or beneficiaries may elect to leave their account balance in the Plan, or receive their benefits in a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested account interest. The Plan allowed for an involuntary direct rollover distribution of participant vested account balances exceeding \$1,000 but not exceeding \$5,000, to an individual retirement account. Effective September 3, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow for an involuntary direct rollover distribution of participant vested account balances exceeding \$1,000 but not exceeding \$7,000, to an individual retirement account. Accounts under \$1,000 are distributed in cash.

### **3. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Plan’s trustee and custodian. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

### **4. PLAN TERMINATION OR MODIFICATION**

The Company intends to continue the Plan indefinitely for the benefit of its participants. However, it reserves the right to terminate or modify the Plan at any time by resolution of its Board of Directors and subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated in the future, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

### **5. CERTIFIED INFORMATION**

In accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, T. Rowe Price and SSBT certified the information presented below that was used in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule. The following information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate and was not audited by independent certified accountants:
