## Independent Auditor's Report

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Suffolk Construction Company, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, are complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

**Basis for Opinion**

#### Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of the Suffolk Construction Company, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan includes employees of Suffolk Construction Company, Inc. and Subsidiaries, Fuse Group LLC, Fuse Build LLC, Fuse Equipment LLC, Fuse Specialty LLC, Suffolk Capital LLC (formerly Suffolk Ventures LLC) and Suffolk Tech LLC (collectively, the Company or Plan Sponsor).

**General:** The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all eligible employees of the Company. The Plan was established on January 1, 1993. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). A Company employee, who is a member of the Investment Committee, serves as the Plan Administrator. Excluding amendments to add participating employers, the Plan was most recently amended effective May 1, 2023, to amend in-service hardship withdrawal provisions and the definitions of fail-safe and qualified matching employer contributions.

**Eligibility:** All employees who are age 21 or older except for employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, residents of Puerto Rico, leased employees, non-resident aliens, co-op employees and interns and independent contractors.

**Contributions:** Each year, participants may make tax deferred or Roth contributions from their eligible compensation, as defined, subject to the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitation. Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan and will defer 3% of their annual eligible compensation, as defined, as a pre-tax contribution unless they inform the Plan Sponsor to contribute a different percentage or elect not to participate in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution or defined benefit plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds, money market funds and a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (group annuity contract) as investment options for participants.

The Plan offers a discretionary matching employer contribution. Under the discretionary matching employer contribution, the Plan Sponsor may make a discretionary matching employer contribution on behalf of each participant in an amount equal to the percentage declared for the contribution period, if any, by a Board of Director's resolution. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company matched 50% of the participant's contribution up to 6% of the participant's year-to-date eligible compensation, as defined.

**Participant accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Plan Sponsor's discretionary matching employer contribution, (b) Plan investment earnings or losses and (c) administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations are based on individual earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting:** Participants are vested immediately in their participant and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's discretionary matching employer contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. A participant vests 20% per year and is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

#### Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

**Investment options:** Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct all contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator in 1% increments. Participants may change their investment options daily.

**Payment of benefits:** The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, retires or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains age 59½ or 72. A participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested benefit or annual installments. If a participant terminates service, the vested amount in his or her participant account may be distributed or rolled over as directed by the participant. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested benefit as a lump-sum distribution.

**Forfeitures:** Forfeitures represent the nonvested portion of terminated participants' account balances. These amounts can be used to reduce future discretionary matching employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. During 2024, forfeitures totaled \$1,160,347, including investment earnings, and \$2,018,345 were used to fund discretionary matching employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeiture amounts available were \$34,079 and \$892,078, respectively.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000 (adjusted to lesser of 100% of their vested balance or \$100,000 for loans issued between March 27, 2020 and September 22, 2020, through the CARES Act). Loan terms range up to five years or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence, as established by the Plan Administrator at the time of the loan. The loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. This rate ranges from 4.50% to 10.00% on all loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024, which mature through 2034. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. Participants are not allowed to have more than one loan outstanding at any time.

#### Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of accounting:** The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The FASB sets generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) to ensure net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits are consistently reported. References to U.S. GAAP issued by the FASB in these footnotes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (FASB ASC). The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Investment valuation and income recognition:** Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Use of estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

**Payment of benefits:** Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Administrative expenses:** The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Plan Sponsor as provided by the Plan document. During the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023, the Plan paid its administrative expenses. Administrative expenses are presented net of administrative credits.

**Income taxes:** U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any uncertain tax positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by federal, state or local tax authorities for years before 2020.

#### Note 3. Information Prepared and Certified by Plan's Trustees

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, that was prepared by or derived from information provided by John Hancock Trust Company (JH), the former trustee, and Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), the current trustee, and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from Fidelity for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by the trustee related to the following assets are complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information which appears throughout the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to the following assets:

#### Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

**Level 1:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2:** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the best level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual funds:** Mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices. These securities are categorized in Level 1 as they are actively traded, and no valuation adjustments have been applied.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Interest-bearing cash:** Reported at fair value based on quoted market price of the fund and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

**Pooled separate account:** Unit value is calculated based on the observable net asset value (NAV) of the underlying investment. NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### **Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their discretionary matching employer contributions.

#### **Note 7. Income Tax Status**

The Plan has received a prototype opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated May 27, 2015, stating that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving this prototype opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and is tax-exempt.

#### **Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near-term and such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **Note 9. Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 4, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
