Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the UnitedHealth Group Puerto Rico Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE 1 - Description of the Plan

The following description of the UnitedHealth Group Puerto Rico Savings Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Optum Services (Puerto Rico) LLC ("the Company") under the laws of Puerto Rico. All employees (excluding those subject to collective bargaining agreements, nonresidents of Puerto Rico, leased employees, independent contractors, and employees that are not classified as an employee for purposes of withholding employment taxes) are immediately eligible for the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA) and Section 1081.01 of the Puerto Rico Internal Revenue Code (PR Code). Banco Popular de Puerto Rico is the trustee of the Plan ("the Trustee").

The UnitedHealth Group Employee Benefits Plans Administrative Committee ("Plan Administrator") is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The UnitedHealth Group Employee Benefits Plans Investment Committee ("Investment Committee") determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Effective March 31, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow loans to participants.

Change Healthcare PR Retirement Plan merged into the Plan on April 8, 2024, with total assets of \$186,690.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum dollar amount permissible under the PR Code. Participant contributions include pretax deferrals and rollover contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year may make additional catch-up contributions, subject to limitations imposed by the PR Code.

The Company makes a matching contribution equal to 100% of applicable contributions up to 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of the next 3% of eligible compensation for a maximum contribution of 4.5% per payroll period as defined in the Plan document. Participants who have completed one year of service are eligible for employer matching contributions to the Plan. The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan for the benefit of its eligible participating employees. The Company did not elect to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral contributions, rollover contributions, the Company's matching contributions, discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if any, and plan earnings or losses (net of administrative expenses). Allocations are based on the participant's eligible compensation or account balances, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investments Classification

All investments are participant directed. The Plan is intended to comply with ERISA section 404(c). Participants have the right to individually select the percentage of their accounts to be invested among different classifications of investments made available to them.

NOTE 1 - Description of the Plan (cont.)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions, rollover contributions, and earnings thereon. Employer matching contributions and discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if any, and earnings thereon vest in accordance with provisions of the Plan as follows:

Less than 2 years	0%
2 or more	100%

Notwithstanding the vesting schedule above, employer matching contributions and discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if any, will become fully vested (100%) upon the occurrence of any of the following events while the participant is employed by the Company: death, the latter of attainment of normal retirement age (age 65) or the 5th anniversary of the participation commencement date, disability, attainment of early retirement age (age 55) and completing 5 years of service, partial plan termination with respect to the participant or complete termination of the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,867 and \$8,462, respectively. Forfeitures can be used to reduce future employer contributions, pay certain administrative expenses or can be reallocated to participant accounts. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$43,500 was used to reduce employer contributions for the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits may be paid to the participant or beneficiary upon death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, as defined in the Plan document. The total vested portion of a participant's account balance is distributed in the form of a lump-sum payment. With Plan Administrator approval, participants may withdraw all or part of their employee contributions in the event of financial hardship.

There are no amounts owed to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan, but had not been paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 (subject to reduction for certain loan balances in the prior 12 months) or 50% of their vested account balances. These loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest based on the prime interest rate plus one percent determined as of the date the loan is initiated. The maximum term for a loan is 59 months, except if the loan is used to acquire the participant's principal residence, in which case the term of the loan may not exceed 118 months. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants are permitted to have one outstanding loan at a time.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the PR Code are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants during 2024 and distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants during 2025.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for recognition or disclosure through September 16, 2025, the date the financial statements were approved and available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained by the Plan Administrator and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee.

NOTE 4 - Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under authoritative guidance are described as follows:

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan can access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs for the asset.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common collective trusts: Valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of units held. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the trust will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay the withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5 – Related Party and Party-in-interest Transactions

The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - Tax Status

The Plan is maintained on a master plan document sponsored by the Trustee. The Puerto Rico Treasury Department ("PR Treasury") has determined and informed the Trustee by a letter dated September 21, 2018, that the master plan document and the related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the PR Code, as amended. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the PR Code, and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the PR Treasury. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had investments of \$9,933,851 and \$6,825,606, respectively, concentrated in five investments that each accounted for more than 10% of plan investments.

NOTE 9 – Delinquent Participant Contributions

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Delinquent Participant Contributions Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances identified on the Schedule H, Line 4(a) - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions, which totaled \$127,940, were corrected during 2024. Additionally, the Company has compensated participants for lost earnings resulting from the delay in contributions.
