Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of MyPath 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Opinion

- the certified investment information in the accompanying financial statements agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the MyPath 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees, except union and leased employees and client workers who provide work as part of rehabilitation or training programs, who have attained the age of 21 and completed four months of service. The entry date into the Plan is the first day of the month coinciding with or immediately following the date the employee satisfied the Plan's eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Oconomowoc Residential Programs, Inc. is doing business as MyPath (the Company).

Contributions

The Company may make matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan as determined by the Board of Directors. Beginning in 2003, the Company match and discretionary contributions are allowed to be made in the MyPath Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP) for those participants who are eligible for the ESOP. Previously the Plan was amended such that the Company began contributing the matching contribution to the ESOP. The Company matched \$0.25 for each \$1.00 of the participant's salary deferral contribution for the 2024 Plan year. The matching contribution is subject to change and the Company match was limited to contributions on the first 6% of the participant's eligible compensation for the 2024 Plan year.

The participant must meet eligibility requirements of the Plan, complete at least four months of service during the Plan year and be employed by the Company on the last workday of the calendar year in order to be eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contributions of that calendar year, unless they are not employed due to death, total or permanent disability, or termination due to normal retirement age.

Newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled to make contributions of 4%. The Plan Administrator will automatically increase the amount of the participant's elective contributions by 1% each year, up to a maximum of 10% compensation, the maximum contribution rate has been increased from 6% to 10% of compensation, effective January 1, 2024. The automatic increase will not be made if the participant elects to change the amount of their elective contribution or to revoke the automatic election to make elective contributions. The annual increase will be effective on the first day of each Plan year following the first Plan year in which the participant makes automatic contributions under the Plan.

Participants may make voluntary contributions in the form of salary deferrals to the Plan. The Plan Administrator has set the percentage to comply with regulations set forth by ERISA. Participants may direct their contributions among one or more funds. Changes in allocation of future contributions and transfers among funds of presently invested contributions are permitted pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution, if any, and net Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Each participant shall become vested in the employer's contribution on the basis of the number of years of credited service as defined in the Plan, in accordance with the following vesting schedule:

Participants are 100% vested in employee contributions.

If while still employed by the Company, a participant dies or becomes totally disabled, the employer's matching contributions shall become 100% vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Eligible participants may apply for a loan with the Plan Administrator, which are recorded as Notes Receivable from Participants. Participants may borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. There is a minimum loan balance of \$1,000 and a maximum of one loan outstanding. Loans are repayable through payroll deductions over periods up to 30 years and are due and payable in their entirety upon severance of employment unless directly rolled over to another employer's plan. Interest is charged based on the prime rate plus 1% at the inception of the loan, which ranged from 8.75% to 9.50% during 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Withdrawals are permitted in the event of retirement or early retirement, disability, death, employment termination, or financial hardship. In-service distributions are permitted upon the attainment of age 59½.

Upon termination of service, a participant with a vested account balance greater than \$5,000, may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution of their vested Plan account in one of the following forms: a single lump sum in the form of a direct rollover to another qualified retirement plan or traditional IRA, in a check payable to a participant, or a combination of the above, provided the direct rollover is at least \$500. Amounts in the Elective Roth Contribution Account are treated separately for purposes of the \$500 determination. Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to offer partial distributions.

The participant may also elect to leave his or her account balance in the Plan but must begin receiving distributions by April 1 following the year in which the participant attains the age of 70½ if reached before January 1, 2020, or, if the participant reaches the age of 70 1/2 on or after January 1, 2020, they have until the April 1 following the year in which they reach the age of 72.

Participants with vested account balances less than \$5,000 are required to withdraw the balance within 30 days of receiving notice from the Plan Administrator.

Forfeitures

A forfeiture will occur on the earlier of the last day of the Plan year in which the former Participant incurs five consecutive one-year breaks in service or the distribution of the entire vested portion of the Participant's account. The Plan Administrator may elect to use forfeitures to pay administrative expenses. To the extent the Plan Administrator does not use all the forfeitures to pay expenses, any remaining forfeitures will be applied first to restore the nonvested account of a participant who is reemployed and repays a distribution. The Plan was previously amended such that the Company will no longer use forfeitures to reduce matching contributions. Forfeitures will continue to be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed to the Plan. There were forfeiture balances of \$26,183 and \$22,422 as of December 31, 2024, and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures used during 2024 were \$3,761.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses are paid directly by the Plan. Participant accounts are charged for any expenses to the investments in their accounting within the Plan.

ESOP Diversification

For the six consecutive years after an ESOP participant has attained age 55 and completed at least ten years of participation in the ESOP the participant may elect to diversify up to 25% of the total number of shares in each of the first five plan years and the participant may elect to transfer 50% of the value of Company stock held in the ESOP to the Plan in the sixth year. During 2024 and 2023, \$172,668 and \$198,954, respectively, was transferred from the ESOP to the Plan, which are included in rollover contributions on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Plan Modifications

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated to increase the automatic deferral escalation maximum from 6% to 10% of compensation.

Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated to modify the definition of compensation to exclude Stock Appreciation Rights (SARs) payouts from all contributions.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting, except for benefit payments which are recorded upon distribution.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The investments of the Plan are reported at fair value in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price).

Purchases and sales of the investments within the Plan are reflected on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses on the sale of securities are computed based on costs for each individual security and are reflected in net depreciation or appreciation in fair value of investments in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds represent investments with various investment managers. The fair value of these investments is determined by reference to the fund's underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. Shares held in mutual funds traded on national securities exchanges are valued at the net asset value (NAV) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common Collective Trust Funds

Common collective trust funds represent investments with various investment managers. Units held in common collective trusts, including stable value funds, are valued at the net asset value as reported by the investment managers as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

While the majority of the underlying asset values are based on quoted prices, the NAV of the common collective trust fund is not publicly quoted. The NAV is reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement date based on recent transaction prices. The common collective trust funds provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported NAV with no advance notice requirement. The Plan is permitted to redeem investment units at NAV on the measurement date. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unfunded commitments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest. According to the Plan, a note receivable from participants is collectible upon termination and any portion of this note receivable from participants that is not collected is deemed to have defaulted. Defaulted loans are deemed distributed and recorded as benefits paid to participants in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. During 2024 and 2023, there were \$5,294 and \$0 in deemed distributions, respectively.

Contributions Receivable

Participant contributions and Employer matching contributions are recognized in the period during which the Company makes the respective payroll deduction from the participant's compensation. Non-elective/Profit sharing contributions are recorded in the relevant period in accordance with the terms in the Plan document.

Risk and Uncertainty

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' accounts, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. Included in investments on December 31, 2024 and 2023, are shares of State Street Target Retirement 2055 CL-K Fund amounting to \$4,873,976 and \$4,110,451, respectively, which represents approximately 12.4% and 11.9% of total investments on December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. A significant decline in the market value of these investments would significantly affect the net assets available for benefits.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Information Certified by the Plan's Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Newport Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income (loss) and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information included in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

4. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP established a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The

hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liabilities.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

5. Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, in the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

6. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Party-in-Interest and Related Party Transactions

Certain employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan. These employees are not paid by the Plan for their services.

The Plan makes payments to the Trustee for administrative expenses which are recorded as such on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Administrative expenses of \$230,768 were paid to the Trustee for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

8. Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
