NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) adopted on January 1, 2004.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective October 2, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated to include Black ICE Holdings, Inc., the parent company of Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC, as a participating employer. No other changes were made with this amendment.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees age 21 and older except part-time, seasonal and temporary employees of Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC, and its wholly owned subsidiaries Blue Star Software, LLC and Pathoras Corporation, and parent company Black ICE Holdings, Inc. (together "the Company"). Part-time, seasonal and temporary employees become eligible to participate in the plan when they have completed at least 1,000 hours of service within the reporting period. The entry date for the Plan is the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date the employees satisfy the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Participants may contribute on a pre-tax or after-tax basis up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to the statutory limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The after-tax "Roth" contributions are subject to federal income taxes in the year of deferral. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans referred to as rollover contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers Pooled Separate Accounts through John Hancock as investment options for participants.

The Plan allows for employer matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions at the option of the Company's Board of Trustees. During 2024, the Company matched 50% of deferral up to 6% of compensation. The employer matching contributions totaled \$1,709,865 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company did not make discretionary profit share contributions to the Plan during 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions, investment earnings and losses and any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant investments held, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Plan participants have daily access to their account via phone or internet and may change the allocation of their investments to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals, rollovers, employer matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions. Participants who terminated employment prior to January 1, 2022, are subject to a two-year vesting schedule on their employer contribution account balances - they become 20% vested in the Company contributions to the Plan after one year of service and the vesting percentage increases to 100% after the second year of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants in the Plan may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their eligible account balance, reduced by any outstanding note balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer for the purchase of a principal residence. Plan participants may have up to three loans outstanding at any one time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Interest rates on outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to retirement, death, full and permanent disability or attaining age 65, participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their account, a direct rollover into a qualified retirement plan, or a combination of the two. For termination of service due to other reasons, participants may receive their benefits in the form of a distribution equal to the value of the vested interest in their account. The Plan allows in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and hardship withdrawals under certain circumstances, as defined in the Plan document.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$18,747 and \$28,085, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions at the discretion of the employer or to pay plan expenses. During 2024, the Plan used \$18,143 of the available forfeitures to pay plan expenses.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recognized on the accrual basis. Related fees are recognized as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan agreement.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the associated Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Company for expenses paid on behalf of the Plan. Administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid from excess revenue sharing, the forfeiture account, or by charging participants' accounts.

Administrative Expenses (Continued)

Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

The Plan has a revenue sharing agreement with the plan custodian. If the custodian receives fund compensation above a certain amount, this excess compensation is deposited into a Plan Expense Reduction Account (PERA) and is made available to the Plan to offset plan expenses. The balances of the PERA account are not included in net assets available for benefits as the PERA credits do not belong to the Plan until they are used to offset Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of the PERA that may be used to offset future expenses totaled \$-0-. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Plan no expenses were paid from the PERA account.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified by John Hancock Life Insurance Company U.S.A ("John Hancock"), the plan custodian as complete and accurate in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts

Pooled separate accounts represent investments in participation units held in pooled separate accounts through sub-accounts of an insurance company. The pooled separate accounts, except for the stable value fund, are primarily invested in mutual funds listed on national securities exchanges and are valued daily at the unit value of shares held by the Plan in the separate investment accounts based on the underlying mutual funds and their quoted net asset value (NAV), which is an observable input. The Plan has concluded that the NAV as adjusted (for mutual fund dividends, mutual fund splits and administrative maintenance charges and other items) and reported by the insurance company, denotes readily determinable fair value.

Pooled Separate Accounts - Stable Value Fund (SVF)

Included in the pooled separate accounts is a stable value fund, which represents participation units of a collective investment trust for which the NAV is based on the market value of the underlying investments. The stable value fund is invested primarily in fully benefit responsive contracts, issued by state regulated insurance companies and banks, including but not limited to John Hancock Life & Health Insurance Company, and are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust, which is an observable input. The NAV, as determined, is the basis for current transactions. Investments in the stable value fund can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. The Plan has concluded that the NAV as reported by the insurance company, denotes readily determinable fair value.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 6 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Plan investments are managed by John Hancock. John Hancock is the custodian of the plan and, therefore, the transactions in these funds qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Personnel and facilities of the Company have been used to perform administrative functions for the Plan at no charge to the plan. There were no financial transactions recorded between the Company and the Plan other than contributions made. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a profit-sharing prototype plan sponsored by Pollard & Associates, Inc. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 30, 2020, which states that the prototype plan, as then designed, is in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) adopted on January 1, 2004.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective October 2, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated to include Black ICE Holdings, Inc., the parent company of Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC, as a participating employer. No other changes were made with this amendment.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees age 21 and older except part-time, seasonal and temporary employees of Bogart Associates of Northern Virginia, LLC, and its wholly owned subsidiaries Blue Star Software, LLC and Pathoras Corporation, and parent company Black ICE Holdings, Inc. (together "the Company"). Part-time, seasonal and temporary employees become eligible to participate in the plan when they have completed at least 1,000 hours of service within the reporting period. The entry date for the Plan is the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date the employees satisfy the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Participants may contribute on a pre-tax or after-tax basis up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to the statutory limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The after-tax "Roth" contributions are subject to federal income taxes in the year of deferral. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans referred to as rollover contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers Pooled Separate Accounts through John Hancock as investment options for participants.

The Plan allows for employer matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions at the option of the Company's Board of Trustees. During 2024, the Company matched 50% of deferral up to 6% of compensation. The employer matching contributions totaled \$1,709,865 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company did not make discretionary profit share contributions to the Plan during 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions, investment earnings and losses and any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant investments held, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Plan participants have daily access to their account via phone or internet and may change the allocation of their investments to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals, rollovers, employer matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions. Participants who terminated employment prior to January 1, 2022, are subject to a two-year vesting schedule on their employer contribution account balances - they become 20% vested in the Company contributions to the Plan after one year of service and the vesting percentage increases to 100% after the second year of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants in the Plan may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their eligible account balance, reduced by any outstanding note balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer for the purchase of a principal residence. Plan participants may have up to three loans outstanding at any one time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Interest rates on outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to retirement, death, full and permanent disability or attaining age 65, participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their account, a direct rollover into a qualified retirement plan, or a combination of the two. For termination of service due to other reasons, participants may receive their benefits in the form of a distribution equal to the value of the vested interest in their account. The Plan allows in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and hardship withdrawals under certain circumstances, as defined in the Plan document.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$18,747 and \$28,085, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions at the discretion of the employer or to pay plan expenses. During 2024, the Plan used \$18,143 of the available forfeitures to pay plan expenses.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recognized on the accrual basis. Related fees are recognized as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan agreement.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the associated Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Company for expenses paid on behalf of the Plan. Administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid from excess revenue sharing, the forfeiture account, or by charging participants' accounts.

Administrative Expenses (Continued)

Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

The Plan has a revenue sharing agreement with the plan custodian. If the custodian receives fund compensation above a certain amount, this excess compensation is deposited into a Plan Expense Reduction Account (PERA) and is made available to the Plan to offset plan expenses. The balances of the PERA account are not included in net assets available for benefits as the PERA credits do not belong to the Plan until they are used to offset Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of the PERA that may be used to offset future expenses totaled \$-0-. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Plan no expenses were paid from the PERA account.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified by John Hancock Life Insurance Company U.S.A ("John Hancock"), the plan custodian as complete and accurate in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts

Pooled separate accounts represent investments in participation units held in pooled separate accounts through sub-accounts of an insurance company. The pooled separate accounts, except for the stable value fund, are primarily invested in mutual funds listed on national securities exchanges and are valued daily at the unit value of shares held by the Plan in the separate investment accounts based on the underlying mutual funds and their quoted net asset value (NAV), which is an observable input. The Plan has concluded that the NAV as adjusted (for mutual fund dividends, mutual fund splits and administrative maintenance charges and other items) and reported by the insurance company, denotes readily determinable fair value.

Pooled Separate Accounts - Stable Value Fund (SVF)

Included in the pooled separate accounts is a stable value fund, which represents participation units of a collective investment trust for which the NAV is based on the market value of the underlying investments. The stable value fund is invested primarily in fully benefit responsive contracts, issued by state regulated insurance companies and banks, including but not limited to John Hancock Life & Health Insurance Company, and are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust, which is an observable input. The NAV, as determined, is the basis for current transactions. Investments in the stable value fund can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. The Plan has concluded that the NAV as reported by the insurance company, denotes readily determinable fair value.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 6 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Plan investments are managed by John Hancock. John Hancock is the custodian of the plan and, therefore, the transactions in these funds qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Personnel and facilities of the Company have been used to perform administrative functions for the Plan at no charge to the plan. There were no financial transactions recorded between the Company and the Plan other than contributions made. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a profit-sharing prototype plan sponsored by Pollard & Associates, Inc. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 30, 2020, which states that the prototype plan, as then designed, is in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements are available to be issued.
