Note 1: Description of the Plan

General

The following description of Midwest Community Bancshares, Inc. Safe Harbor 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Midwest Community Bancshares, Inc. (the "Company") for the benefit of its employees who have at least one year of service (1,000 hours) and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Effective December 26, 2023 the Plan changed recordkeeper and custodian from Empower and Great-West Life & Annuity Company to Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity company (Voya). The conversion initiated a "Black Out" period beginning on December 18, 2023, and continued through January 19, 2024. During this period, funds could not be applied to the employee-selected funds with Voya or withdrawn from the Plan until Voya had time to accurately complete the conversion. During this period, employee contributions continued to be made through payroll deductions and the contributions were deposited and held in the Voya Fixed Account until the completion of the Black Out period. At the end of the Black Out period, these funds were invested in funds as requested by each participant.

Contributions

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Company make annual contributions of eligible compensation, subject to IRS limits. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. The Plan makes matching contributions of 100% of employees' salary deferral amounts on the first 3% of employees' compensation and 50% on the following 2% of the employees' compensation and profit-sharing contributions. Profit-sharing contributions are discretionary as determined by the Company's Board of Directors; however, there were none in 2024 or 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Forfeitures are used to reduce employer contributions and administrative expenses. Forfeitures totaled \$648 and \$8,937 respectively, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Investment Account Options

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

The Plan includes an automatic deferral feature whereby a participant is treated as electing to defer 3% of eligible compensation, unless the participant made an affirmative election otherwise.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution and Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses.

Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefits to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary and safe harbor employer contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is fully vested after six years of continuous service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan Document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan to active eligible participants. Loans are made to any eligible participant demonstrating a qualifying need. The minimum amount of a loan shall be \$1,000. The maximum amount of a participant's loans is determined by the available loan balance restricted to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. All loans are covered by demand notes and are repayable over a period not to exceed five years (except for loans for the purchase of a principal residence) through payroll withholdings unless the participant is paying the loan in full. Interest on the loans is prime rate as of the date of the loan plus 2%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participants' vested interest in his or her account or a continuous right of withdrawal.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Common collective trusts are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Pooled separate accounts are valued at estimated fair value provided by Voya.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

Revisions

Certain immaterial revisions have been made to the 2023 financial statements related to the fair value hierarchy of investments. The revisions resulted in the presentation of \$11,177,093 as Level 2 pooled separate accounts instead of level 1 mutual funds and \$2,248,766 as Level 2 pooled separate accounts instead of Level 2 common collective trust funds. The revisions did not affect financial statement line items or net assets available for benefits as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There is a hierarchy of three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets

Level 2 Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets

Level 3 Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets

There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan had no assets measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy. The Plan has no Level 1 or Level 3 investments.

Note 4: Certification of Plan Custodians

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Great-West, a qualified institution has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements for the period January 1, 2023 through December 26, 2023 and Voya, also a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule as of and for the period ended December 27, 2023 through December 31, 2023 and as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such investment information to the related information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 5: Investment Contracts with Insurance Companies

Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company

From January 1, 2023 through December 26, 2023 the Plan had a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company (“GW”). GW maintained contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The average yield earned by the Plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average for the period ended December 26, 2023 was 1.55%.

The guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by GW, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company

From December 27, 2023 through December 31, 2024, the Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (“VRIAC”). VRIAC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The average yield earned by the Plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average for the period December 27, 2023 through December 31, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 was 1.00%.

The guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by VRIAC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to Plan’s prohibition on

competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The guaranteed investment contract permits the insurance company to terminate the agreement with 60 days' written notice.

Note 6: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan incurs and pays expenses related to general administration and record keeping. The Company pays certain separate accounting and auditing fees relating to the Plan.

Note 7: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 8: Tax Status

The Plan operates under a non-standardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust custodial document sponsored by CCH Incorporated. This prototype Plan Document has been filed with the appropriate agency and obtained a determination letter dated June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service, stating that the prototype was qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since the prototype received the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of

investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 10: Non-Exempt Transactions

There were unintentional delays by the Company in submitting participant contributions to the Custodian in the amount of \$33,194 during the year ended December 31, 2024. These delinquent contributions constitute prohibited transactions were paid outside of the Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program ("VFCP") during 2024.

Note 11: Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
