To the Plan Administrator and Participants of the

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Heidelberg Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Note 1 - Description of plan:

The following description of the Heidelberg Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Heidelberg Americas, Inc. (the Company or Plan Sponsor), except those employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, consultants, contractors, leased employees as defined by the Plan, co-operative student employees, nonresident aliens who do not receive any earned income from the Company which constitutes United States source income, and temporary foreign employees, as defined by the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Upon attainment of age 18, eligible employees of the Company, as defined by the Plan, may contribute up to 50% of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) annual limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants age 50 or older are allowed to make catch-up contributions. All newly eligible employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan at the elective deferral rate of 6%, increasing by 1% per year up to 10% of pay. The Company may elect to make matching contributions or profit-sharing contributions at the discretion of each participating Company's board of directors. The discretionary profit-sharing contributions are allocated to participants pro rata based upon an eligible active participant's compensation for the Plan year. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company elected to make matching contributions of 50% of the first 6% of participant contributions to the Plan. A discretionary matching contribution of \$1,485,929 was made for the year ended December 31, 2024. No discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and an allocation of the Company's discretionary matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions, Plan earnings, and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to

which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various investment options in mutual funds, a stable value fund, a self-directed brokerage account, a pooled separate account, and common/collective trust funds.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their employee and Company discretionary matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contributions is based on years of continuous service. Participants become vested in discretionary profit-sharing contributions in accordance with a five-year graded vesting schedule. Participants are immediately 100% vested upon death, disability, retirement, or a reduction in force.

Forfeited accounts

Forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested account balances are used to either pay administrative expenses or reduce employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan or pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,197 and \$1,154, respectively.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination of service, retirement, death, or disability, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or installment payments for a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant and his or her beneficiary. A participant may request a withdrawal from the Plan while still under the employment of the Company if the participant is at least 59½ or for reasons of financial hardship, but the withdrawal is limited to the amount of the participant's contributions, matching contributions, and nonelective contributions plus the earnings on those contributions.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The minimum amount that can be borrowed is \$1,000. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed as determined by the Plan Sponsor. Note terms are for a period not exceeding 5 years unless for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the note term may not exceed 15 years. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies:

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Common/collective trust fund and stable value fund

Investments in the common/collective trust fund (CCT) and stable value fund (SVF) are required to be reported at fair value. The CCT and SVF are composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts held by the fund's trustee. These contracts are not considered fully-benefit responsive to the Plan as the underlying contracts are not direct investments between the Plan and the issuer. The Plan has elected to value the CCT and SVF using net asset value (NAV) as the practical expedient to determine fair value.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation include the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and Company matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

The Plan received employee and employer contributions on December 31, 2024, in the amount of \$235,818, which was paid to the Plan's trust prior to the applicable payroll date of January 3, 2025. Because the payroll was paid to employees in 2025, contributions could not have been withheld in 2024. As a result, the contributions have been excluded from the accompanying December 31, 2024 statement of changes in net assets available for benefits and recorded as a prepaid contribution on the statement of net assets available for benefits. The contribution will be recognized in the Plan's 2025 financial statements.

Benefit payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. The Company reserves the right to elect to pay, or have the Plan pay, administrative costs in the future. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Recent accounting pronouncements

The AICPA Financial Reporting Executive Committee (FinREC) approved enhanceive accounting updates related to accounting for revenue sharing arrangements in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) ASC No. 606, Revenue from Contracts with Customers. Revenue sharing amounts are not considered revenue under ASC No. 606 due to the fact that they are intended to reduce administrative costs for the plan and not paid to the plan for delivering or producing goods, rendering services or undertaking other activities for the investment manager. A plan should consider all relevant facts and circumstances, including the terms of the agreement to determine the appropriate presentation of revenue sharing amounts. The presentation should be applied on a consistent basis and the plan should consider whether the presentation of revenue sharing amounts is a significant accounting policy that should be disclosed in the notes to the financial statements. If significant, the notes to the financial statements include a description of revenue sharing arrangements including how such arrangements are presented in the financial statements. The adoption did not have a material impact to the Plan's financial statements.

Recent legislative developments

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and is awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Department of Labor. The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Subsequent events

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through September 9, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. All subsequent events, if any, requiring recognition as of December 31, 2024, have been incorporated into these financial statements.

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower) is the trustee for the Plan. Empower holds the Plan's investment assets and executes investment transactions. Management has determined that Empower is a qualified institution and the information prepared and certified by Empower meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Sponsor and certified as complete and accurate by Empower.

Note 4 - Fair value measurements:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB Accounting Standards Codification No. 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no significant changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Shares of mutual funds are valued by the Plan at year end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges.

Note 4 - Fair value measurements - continued:

- Investments held in the self-directed brokerage accounts are valued by the Plan at year end by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges.
- Investments held in the Pooled separate account are valued at the net asset value (NAV) provided by the custodian as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the quoted market prices of the underlying investments held in the variable annuities at year end.
- Units of participation of the common/collective trust funds and stable value fund are valued at the NAV provided by the fund's trustee as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investments for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common/collective trusts or stable value fund, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Exempt party-in-interest transactions:

Certain Plan investments and participant notes were managed by affiliates of Empower. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation. The Plan made direct payments to Empower and affiliates of which is included in administrative expenses. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

Note 6 - Plan termination:

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7 - Tax status:

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and; therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan administrator has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS pre-approved plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator is taking steps to bring the Plan in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and; therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 - Delinquent contributions:

For one paydate during 2024, the Plan Sponsor did not timely remit participant contributions. The missed earnings calculated for the delinquent contributions were funded to the trust in 2025.
