Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of CASCO 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about CASCO 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Notes to the Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the CASCO 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution retirement plan, was established on May 1, 1985 by CASCO Diversified Corporation (the Plan Sponsor) to provide retirement income to its employees. The Plan covers all employees of the Plan Sponsor who have completed one month of service and are age 21 or older. Effective January 1, 2024, temporary/seasonable employees are eligible to participate upon meeting eligibility requirements. Employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement are not eligible. An eligible participant can enter the Plan on the first day of each month of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan allows for pre-tax and roth contributions.

The Plan Sponsor controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Empower Trust Company, LLC (ETC) serves as the trustee of the Plan. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA) serves as the custodian.

SECURE 2.0 Act

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 ("SECURE 2.0"), signed into law on December 29, 2022, makes significant changes to existing law for retirement plans by building upon provisions in the SECURE Act of 2019. SECURE 2.0 introduces new requirements and considerations for plan sponsors that are intended to expand coverage, increase savings, preserve income, and simplify plan rules and administrative procedures. Each of the provisions in SECURE 2.0 has its own effective date ranging from the date of enactment to 2028 and beyond, with the bulk of the provisions taking effect in 2023 and 2024. In accordance with SECURE 2.0, the Plan increased the age for required minimum distributions (RMD) from age 72 to age 73 effective January 2023. Further changes set forth in the SECURE 2.0 Act include eliminating pre-death RMD rules for Roth accounts and several voluntary changes to distribution provisions, effective January 2024. The Plan is in the process of evaluating other voluntary provisions. The Plan is required to be amended in regard to other requirements of SECURE 2.0 by December 31, 2026.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, but limited to the amount specified by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). These contributions can be made as pre-tax or roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan Sponsor may make matching and discretionary employer nonelective contributions, which are determined annually by the Plan Sponsor; employees who have completed 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and are employed on the last day of the plan year are eligible to share in the discretionary employer nonelective contributions. The Plan Sponsor did not make matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor made discretionary employer nonelective contributions of \$371,714 for the year ended December 31, 2024, which were subsequently deposited into the Plan during the first quarter of the following Plan year.

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Contributions (Continued)

The Plan allows automatic enrollment at a rate of 3% of compensation unless the participant makes a contrary election. For participants with a plan entry date beginning on January 1, 2023, the deferral rate will increase 1% a year until a maximum of 10% deferral rate is reached. Employees who opt out of automatic enrollment must complete a form to decline participation.

Participant Accounts

Participant accounts are credited with their contributions, the Plan Sponsor's matching contributions, an allocation of the Plan's earnings and the Plan Sponsor's discretionary nonelective contribution, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined in the Plan Agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their account is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of credited service and vesting increases 20% per year until 100% vesting after six years of completed service. A participant becomes 100% vested upon death or total or permanent disability.

Forfeitures

Participants who terminate their employment and are less than 100% vested in their employer's contributions forfeit the non-vested portion. Forfeitures occurring during a Plan year can be used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$4,361 was used to reduce the employer contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was a balance of \$14,722 and \$5,866, respectively, in the forfeiture account. The forfeiture account will be used to reduce future administrative fees or employer contributions.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms are up to five years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan for the participant's principal residence, for which the period is not to exceed fifteen years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% over the Prime Rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of the month the loan is originated. Interest rates range from 4.25% to 9.50% for loans outstanding during 2024. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Hardship Withdrawals

Participants may withdraw a minimum of \$1,000 from that portion of their account resulting from salary deferrals in the event of undue financial hardship. The maximum hardship withdrawal is the total of the participant's fully vested elective deferral account and any rollover account.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, if the total vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the participant's vested account balance will be distributed automatically in a lump sum. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59 1/2 subject to Plan provisions. If the total vested account balance is between \$1,000 and \$7,000 and no election has been made for the type of distribution, the balance will be automatically rolled into an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). If the total vested account balance exceeds \$7,000, participants may elect either to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of their vested account balance or may elect a distribution under a systematic withdrawal plan, as described under the Plan Agreement.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct contributions in any of the applicable investment options available to Plan participants.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Method of Accounting

The Plan follows the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value with the exception of the guaranteed investment contract, which is stated at contract value. See Notes 3 and 4 for discussion of fair value measurements and the guaranteed investment contract, respectively. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Guaranteed investment contracts are reported at contract value, which is the amount participants would normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are valued at their outstanding balances plus any unpaid accrued interest, which approximates fair value. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant notes receivable are recorded as benefit payments on the basis of the terms of the plan document.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are allocated proportionately to plan participants based on their respective account balances and are included in total investment income.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end and are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 4: Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with EAICA. EAICA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAICA, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but will never be less than 0%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Note 4: Guaranteed Investment Contract (Continued)

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 5: Tax Status

The Plan is a Non-standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan that received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS on November 14, 2022, which stated the Plan as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC. The Plan Sponsor is not aware of any action or event that has occurred that might affect the Plan's qualified status.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the tax authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for the three prior tax filings.

Note 6: Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee and Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for the Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments, at fair value and investments, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation from investments, at fair value, interest, dividends and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the trustee, ETC, and the custodian, EAICA.

Note 7: Related-Party Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

ETC is the trustee of the Plan assets. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain Plan investments are shares of investment funds managed by ETC and the fully guaranteed investment contract managed by EAICA.

The Plan incurs expenses related to general administration and record-keeping. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note 8: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
