NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Venezia Transport Service, Inc. Employee Savings and Protection Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which commenced April 1, 1990. All employees of Venezia Transport Service, Inc. and Venezia Hauling, Inc. (collectively, the "Company") who have completed three months of service and are age 21 or older are eligible to participate. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute to the Plan up to 75% of their gross compensation on a pre-tax basis or after-tax (ROTH) basis through salary reduction. The Company will make a matching contribution, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed 50% of the first 3% of the participant's compensation. As of February 1, 2022, the plan was amended as follows: the company will make a matching contribution, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed 50% of the first 6% of the participant's compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers).

Participant Accounts

A separate investment account is maintained for each Plan participant. Participants may direct the investment of their account into the various funds specified by the Plan. Participant accounts are credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of the Company's matching contribution and Plan earnings/(losses), as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their own contributions to the Plan plus earnings.

Vesting in the Company's matching contributions and earnings increases 20% for each year of employment after two years of service, reaching 100% after six years of service. In determining years of service for vesting purposes, the elapsed time method is used. Employees will receive a year of service by the actual amount of time that has passed since an employee's hire date.

Plan Loans

Plan participants are eligible to borrow against the Plan by pledging a percentage of their vested account balance as collateral. A loan amount may not be less than \$1,000 nor may it exceed the lesser of 50% of the individual's vested account balance up to \$50,000. The term of the loan may not exceed five years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan (to acquire a principal residence). The interest rate applicable to the loan is determined at the time of application based on prime rate plus one for general purpose loans and prime rate for Primary Residence Loans. Upon default, any loan amounts not repaid will be taxed as a distribution of benefits, as defined in the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are eligible to receive a distribution of the vested portion of their individual account balance upon the following:

- The occurrence of any of the distributable events specified in the Adoption Agreement,
- The participant's termination of employment after attaining normal retirement age, or
- Termination of the Plan.

The normal retirement age under this Plan is 65. Participants will receive a lump-sum distribution without regard to amounts involved.

Forfeitures

Employees who terminate employment and are not fully vested will forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance to the Plan, as specified in the Adoption Agreement. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts were \$5,003 and \$2,825. During 2024, \$118,942 were used to reduce employer contributions.

Plan Termination

Upon termination of the Plan by the Company, each Participant shall be 100% vested and have a nonforfeitable interest in the participant's employer matching account.

Plan Amendments

On December 29, 2022, the "Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) 2.0 Act" was signed into law in the Under States. The Secure 2.0 Act is an expansion of the Secure Act passed during 2019. The Act includes several mandatory and optional provisions that will become effective across several years. The Secure 2.0 Act aims to expand retirement access, increase retirement savings, and simplify plan administration. Plans may choose to operationally implement the provisions of the Secure 2.0 Act, however plan administrators have until December 31, 2026 to officially amend the plan document to reflect the provisions adopted by the plan

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Quoted market prices are used to value the mutual funds and the money market fund. The Plan's investments in the common collective trust are stated at net asset value per share as a practical expedient as reported by the trustee which include a mix of mutual funds and managed accounts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Date of Management's Review

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 3, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

Level 1 inputs are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access. *Level 2* inputs are other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly through market corroboration, for substantially the full term of the financial instrument. *Level 3* inputs are unobservable inputs based on the Plan's assumptions used to measure assets and liabilities at fair value. The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

These transactions in the investments and participant loans qualify as party-in-interest transactions, allowable under ERISA guidelines.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Plan utilizes a volume submitter Plan sponsored by Fidelity Management & Research Co. The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The volume submitter Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During the audit, the Company became aware of certain operational failures. The Company is working with The Plan's third party administrator to correct these failures in accordance with Department of Labor guidelines.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investments of the Plan are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect investment assets reported in participant account balances and in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Venezia Transport Service, Inc. Employee Savings and Protection Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which commenced April 1, 1990. All employees of Venezia Transport Service, Inc. and Venezia Hauling, Inc. (collectively, the "Company") who have completed three months of service and are age 21 or older are eligible to participate. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute to the Plan up to 75% of their gross compensation on a pre-tax basis or after-tax (ROTH) basis through salary reduction. The Company will make a matching contribution, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed 50% of the first 3% of the participant's compensation. As of February 1, 2022, the plan was amended as follows: the company will make a matching contribution, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed 50% of the first 6% of the participant's compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers).

Participant Accounts

A separate investment account is maintained for each Plan participant. Participants may direct the investment of their account into the various funds specified by the Plan. Participant accounts are credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of the Company's matching contribution and Plan earnings/(losses), as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their own contributions to the Plan plus earnings.

Vesting in the Company's matching contributions and earnings increases 20% for each year of employment after two years of service, reaching 100% after six years of service. In determining years of service for vesting purposes, the elapsed time method is used. Employees will receive a year of service by the actual amount of time that has passed since an employee's hire date.

Plan Loans

Plan participants are eligible to borrow against the Plan by pledging a percentage of their vested account balance as collateral. A loan amount may not be less than \$1,000 nor may it exceed the lesser of 50% of the individual's vested account balance up to \$50,000. The term of the loan may not exceed five years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan (to acquire a principal residence). The interest rate applicable to the loan is determined at the time of application based on prime rate plus one for general purpose loans and prime rate for Primary Residence Loans. Upon default, any loan amounts not repaid will be taxed as a distribution of benefits, as defined in the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are eligible to receive a distribution of the vested portion of their individual account balance upon the following:

- The occurrence of any of the distributable events specified in the Adoption Agreement,
- The participant's termination of employment after attaining normal retirement age, or
- Termination of the Plan.

The normal retirement age under this Plan is 65. Participants will receive a lump-sum distribution without regard to amounts involved.

Forfeitures

Employees who terminate employment and are not fully vested will forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance to the Plan, as specified in the Adoption Agreement. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts were \$5,003 and \$2,825. During 2024, \$118,942 were used to reduce employer contributions.

Plan Termination

Upon termination of the Plan by the Company, each Participant shall be 100% vested and have a nonforfeitable interest in the participant's employer matching account.

Plan Amendments

On December 29, 2022, the “Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) 2.0 Act” was signed into law in the Under States. The Secure 2.0 Act is an expansion of the Secure Act passed during 2019. The Act includes several mandatory and optional provisions that will become effective across several years. The Secure 2.0 Act aims to expand retirement access, increase retirement savings, and simplify plan administration. Plans may choose to operationally implement the provisions of the Secure 2.0 Act, however plan administrators have until December 31, 2026 to officially amend the plan document to reflect the provisions adopted by the plan

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Quoted market prices are used to value the mutual funds and the money market fund. The Plan’s investments in the common collective trust are stated at net asset value per share as a practical expedient as reported by the trustee which include a mix of mutual funds and managed accounts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Date of Management’s Review

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 3, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

Level 1 inputs are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access. *Level 2* inputs are other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly through market corroboration, for substantially the full term of the financial instrument. *Level 3* inputs are unobservable inputs based on the Plan's assumptions used to measure assets and liabilities at fair value. The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Plan utilizes a volume submitter Plan sponsored by Fidelity Management & Research Co. The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The volume submitter Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During the audit, the Company became aware of certain operational failures. The Company is working with The Plan's third party administrator to correct these failures in accordance with Department of Labor guidelines.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investments of the Plan are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect investment assets reported in participant account balances and in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
