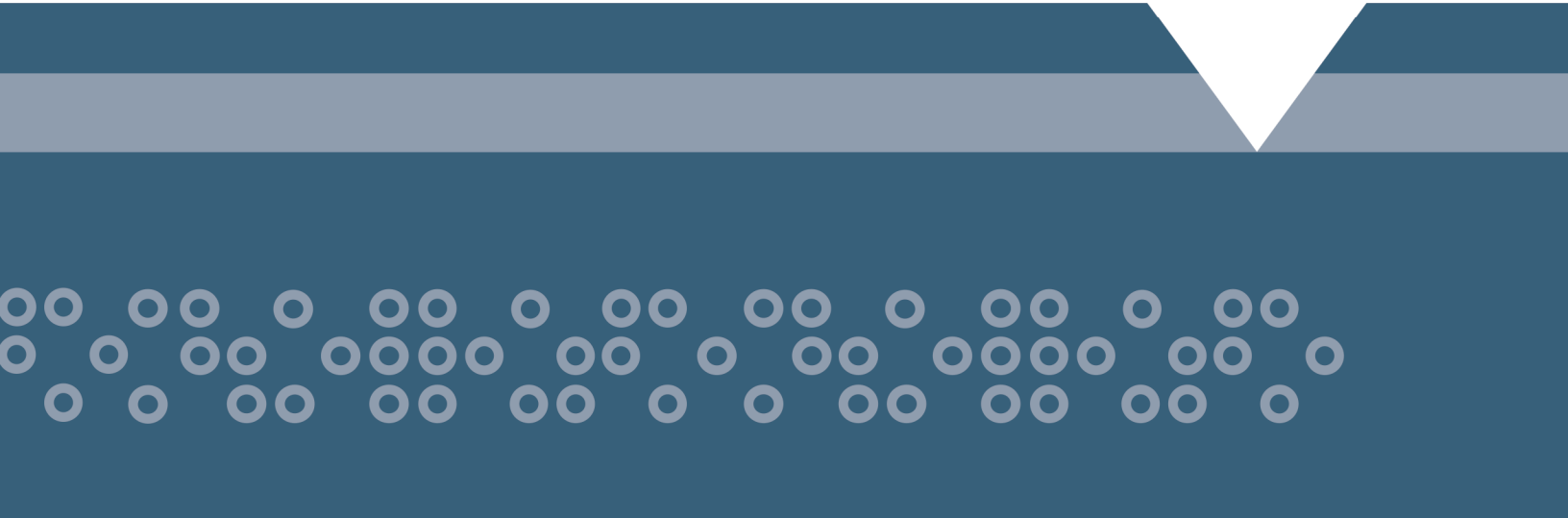

Independent Auditor's Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Palacios Marine and Industrial Coatings 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1 – Description of Plan:

The following description of Palacios Marine and Industrial Coatings 401(k) Plan (“the Plan”, “we”, or “our”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of our provisions.

General

The Palacios Marine and Industrial Coatings 401 (k) Plan (the Plan) is a defined contribution plan adopted by Palacios Marine and Industrial Coatings, Inc., and participating employers: PMI Staffing, LLC, PMI Terminal Services, LLC, Leverage Engineering, PMI Management, Leverage Mechanical Services, Inc. and Insight NDE, Inc. (collectively, the Company). The Plan is designed to encourage and assist eligible employees in adopting a regular savings program on a tax-advantaged basis. The Plan is administered by the Company and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The summary of significant provisions of the Plan presented provide general information. Participants and users of the financial statements should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of Plan provisions.

Eligibility

The Plan covers employees of the Company and its participating employers, except non-resident aliens and union employees. Employees must be at least 21 years of age and have fulfilled at least six consecutive months of service. Eligible participants are allowed to enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date a participant satisfies the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Participants may elect to reduce their compensation by a specific percentage or dollar amount and have that amount contributed to the Plan as a salary deferral. There are two types of salary deferrals: pre-tax 401 (k) deferrals and Roth 401 (k) deferrals. In addition, participants who have attained age 50 as of the last day of the year are eligible to contribute additional before-tax or Roth contributions during such year that may exceed normal Plan limits.

Participants are eligible to begin to receive discretionary matching contributions upon entry to the Plan.

The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution equal to a uniform percentage of participant salary deferrals. Each year, the Company will determine the amount of discretionary percentage. During 2024, the Company elected to make matching contributions equal to 100 percent of participant elective deferrals up to 2 percent of compensation on a per payroll basis. Matching contributions will be made to the Plan and allocated to the matching contribution accounts of participants who meet the eligibility requirements.

In addition to the discretionary matching contributions, the Company also may make a discretionary profit sharing contribution of a certain percentage of a participant's earnings on a yearly basis. The participant always shares in the profit-sharing contributions regardless of the amount of service completed during the Plan year. During 2024, the Company did not make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan.

Rollover contributions from qualified retirement plans and certain IRAs are also permitted by the Plan. All contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Participant's Account

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions (b) Plan earnings and losses, and (c) forfeitures of discretionary matching contributions, and is charged with withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions, eligible compensation, participant account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account activity to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds as investment options. Participants may make changes to their investment direction as allowed under the Plan, including transferring any contribution from one investment option to another at any time.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50 percent of their vested account balance, or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account. Participants may have only one outstanding loans at any time. The interest rate charged will be a commercially reasonable rate which the Company will determine by reviewing the rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. The interest rate will be fixed for the duration of the loan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through after-tax payroll deductions within a period of at least 12 months, but no more than 60 months, unless the loan is to be used to acquire a principal residence. If a participant fails to make a loan repayment by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the missed payment was due, it is deemed to be in default. If a loan is not repaid, under certain circumstances, it may be treated as a distribution to the participant and could be considered taxable income.

Payment of Benefits Upon Severance From Employment

Participants can receive a total distribution of their vested Plan account balance upon termination of employment as soon as administratively feasible. If a participant dies, their beneficiary receives the distribution of the participant's account. Furthermore, if an employee becomes disabled while participating in the Plan, the participant will become entitled to receive 100 percent of their account balance. Upon termination, if a participant's balance is \$5,000 or less, they will automatically receive a final payment of the balance in their account regardless of whether the participant consents to receive it. However, if a participant's account balance is more than \$5,000, they can take an immediate lump-sum distribution or elect other distribution options.

In-Service Withdrawals

Participants who are active employees and who have attained age 59½ may withdraw up to the entire vested balance of their Plan accounts.

Hardship Withdrawals

Under certain circumstances, a participant may request a hardship withdrawal for an immediate and heavy financial need subject to certain eligibility requirements. Hardship distributions can only be made from accounts in which the participant is fully vested.

Plan Termination

The Company currently intends to continue the Plan indefinitely, but retains the right to terminate the Plan, in whole or in part, at any time and for any reason. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments.

Vesting

Each participant shall have a 100 percent vested, nonforfeitable right to their elective and rollover contributions in the Plan. Participants will vest in the Company matching contributions and additional Company profit-sharing contributions as follows: 20 percent vested after one year of service, 40 percent vested after two years of service, 60 percent after three years of service, 80 percent after four years of service, and 100 percent vested after five years of service. Each participant will have a 100 percent vested right to their discretionary matching contributions and discretionary profit-sharing contributions upon death, disability, or retirement. Retirement is defined as reaching the normal retirement date which is the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the normal retirement age of 65 years old.

Forfeited Accounts

Any unvested portion of a terminated participant's account shall be forfeited. Amounts arising from forfeitures shall be used to reinstate previously forfeited amounts, reduce future employer contributions or pay reasonable Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$5,800 were available for future use.

Note 2 – Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Presentation

Our financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires us to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions from those estimates. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are

recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participant's account balances. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess Participant Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan is required to distribute excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the subsequent calendar year. Failure to distribute excess contributions can result in excise taxes owed by the Plan Sponsor.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, credit, and global event risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements:

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments held within the group variable funding agreement which are measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Interest-Bearing Cash: Valued at cost, which approximates fair value.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 – inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 – observable inputs, such as, quoted market prices of similar assets or liabilities in active markets or for identical assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, and Level 3 – inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

Note 4 – Concentration of Credit Risk:

The Plan contains certain investment options, whose balances represent a significant concentration of Plan investments. For the year ended December 31, 2024, American Funds 2035 Target Date, 2045 Target Date, and 2055 Target Date represented 53 percent of total investments, and each individually represented in excess of 10 percent of total investments. For the year ended December 31, 2023, American Funds 2035 Target Date, 2045 Target Date, and 2055 Target Date represented 54 percent of total investments, and each individually represented in excess of 10 percent of total investments.

Note 5 – Information Prepared and Certified by Plan Custodian:

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Capital Bank and Trust Company.

Note 6 – Party-in-Interest:

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor (DOL) regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain plan investments were managed by the Capital Bank and Trust Company and notes receivable from participants reflect party-in-

interest transactions. Certain professional fees for the administration and audit of the plan were paid by the Company. Various administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Note 7 – Tax Status:

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, indicating that the non-standardized pre-approved plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended from the original prototype document, Plan management believes that the Plan was operated in accordance with the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

Note 8 – Subsequent Events:

We have evaluated subsequent events through September 12, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
