Opinion



A. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The Mississippi Management, Inc. 401(k) Retirement and Savings Plan ("The Plan") was implemented effective January 1, 1993. Effective October 1, 1997, the Mississippi Management, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan was merged into the 401(k) Plan with the 401(k) Plan being the surviving plan. The 401(k) Plan was amended effective January 1, 2007 to allow participants to make Roth 401(k) contributions. The Plan was also amended effective July 15, 2008 to appoint Charles Schwab as trustee. Effective August 1, 2014, the Plan began offering the use of Schwab Retirement Planner. This service includes the development of personalized investment and savings strategies for participants. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was restated to an IRS pre-approved defined contribution plan document. The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2024, to adopt a two month requirement for eligible participation and to change vesting to 100% after three years of service. The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. *General* – Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan on the next entry date after completing two months of service in 2024 and six months of service prior to January 1, 2024 and attainment of age eighteen (18). Employees may enter the Plan the first day of each month. Employees having attained one year of service on or before January 1, 1993 became eligible to participate on the effective date of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).
2. *Contributions* – For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, participating employees may defer up to fifty percent (50%) of their compensation not to exceed \$23,500 (\$31,000 if over age 50) and \$22,500 (\$30,000 if over age 50), respectively. Participants may also elect to treat all or part of the amount withheld as a Roth 401(k) contribution. The Company, at its sole discretion, may contribute a percentage of each employee's deferred income. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 50% of a participant's deferrals up to the first 6% of the participant's compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company contributed 25% of a participant's deferrals up to the first 4% of the participant's compensation. Employees must be employed by the Company on the last day of the year to be eligible to participate in the Company contribution unless they terminated during the year due to retirement, death, or disability.

3. *Participant Accounts* – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, any employer's contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings. The allocation is based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.
4. *Investment Options* – Participants direct contributions, including employer contributions, into several investment options. Participants may change their investment options daily.
5. *Notes Receivable from Participants* – Prior to January 1, 2022, the Plan allowed participants to borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. For a loan to be granted, the participant must have participated in the Plan for at least one year and cannot have any other loans outstanding with the Plan at the time of the request. The minimum amount of a loan is \$1,000 and it bears interest at a reasonable rate. Participants have up to 5 years to repay the loan. Each loan is secured by the borrowing participant's vested interest in their Plan account balance. After December 31, 2021, loans are no longer available.
6. *Vesting* – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in Company contributions and earnings thereon is based on years of service. Effective January 1, 2024, a participant is 100 percent vested in Company contributions after three years of service. Prior to January 1, 2024, a participant was 100 percent vested in Company contributions after five years of service. Participants were credited toward their vesting with years of service prior to the Plan effective date of January 1, 1993. All participants in the Profit Sharing Plan were 100 percent vested at the time of the merger.
7. *Forfeitures* – Forfeitures are first used to restore required amounts to any current or former participants. The remaining forfeitures are used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and to reduce the cost of future Company contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$8,048 and \$6,326, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$8,059 and \$5,239 were used to reduce employer matching contributions.

8. *Payment of Benefits* – On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive their vested balance in a single payment either in cash or as a direct rollover to an individual retirement account or another tax-qualified plan or in installment payments.

B. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuations – The money market account and mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Accounting Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – The Company absorbs certain administrative expenses of the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Plan participants are charged for administrative expenses related to loan set-up, loan maintenance, and a recordkeeping fee. Also, those participants who choose the Schwab Retirement Planner are charged an asset-based fee.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurements accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority.

D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 – Fair Value Measurements

The fair values of mutual funds are based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. The money market account is valued at its carrying value which approximates fair value.

E. CREDIT RISK

The Plan has a money market account held as an investment with deposits more than federally insured limits. These excess deposits totaled \$54,607 and \$57,355 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. However, these deposits are insured to the federal limits per plan participant when aggregated with all other deposits held by the participant in the same capacity at Schwab Bank. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, excess deposits at the participant level totaled \$0.

F. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent (100%) vested in their accounts.

G. TAX STATUS OF PLAN

The Company adopted a Non-standardized Profit Sharing Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated September 21, 2020. The letter stated that the Plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

H. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

In July, 2008, the Plan Sponsor and Plan Administrator entered into a directed employee benefit trust agreement with Charles Schwab. Under the agreement, Charles Schwab acts as the directed, nondiscretionary trustee of the trust for the Plan assets. With the restatement of the Plan in August, 2014, Charles Schwab Bank was appointed as the directed trustee. Included in the assets that the trust holds are certain funds in which Charles Schwab is a party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan totaled \$21,337 and \$19,341 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

I. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

J. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 29, 2025, at which time the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule were available to be issued. The Plan has determined that no significant events occurred after December 31, 2024, but prior to the issuance of these financial statements, that would have a material impact on its financial statements.
