Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with US GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other matter - supplemental schedules required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, schedule H, line 4a - schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such supplementary information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures. These additional procedures included comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information

included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Other matter - auditor's report on the 2023 financial statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2023 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 15, 2024, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedules, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, was presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of Cast & Crew 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and Eligibility

The Plan is a defined contribution plan for the employees of Cast & Crew LLC (the Company, the Employer or the Plan Sponsor). Generally, employees of the Company are eligible to participate and receive matching contributions on deferrals in the Plan upon completion of 90 days of service, and attainment of 21 years of age. Employees of the Company are eligible to receive nonelective profit sharing contributions upon completion of 1,000 hours of service, and employment on the last day of the calendar year. Employees of subsidiaries of Cast & Crew LLC, The Team Companies, LLC and Team Employment, Inc., are eligible to participate subject to the above requirements. Employees who are union employees (other than those whose participation in this Plan is specifically provided for in the collective bargaining agreement), leased employees, employees of any controlled group employer or affiliated service group employer that does not affirmatively adopt this Plan, independent contractors, or part-time/temporary/seasonal employees (such an employee is one who works less than 1,000 hours of service in the relevant eligibility computation period) are excluded from participating. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Retirement Plan Committee and Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute from 1% to the maximum allowable by law of eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Roth contributions are permitted under the Plan. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers). Contributions must be directed into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company may make annual discretionary matching contributions to the Plan as a percentage of the participants' elective contributions. Each year, the Company may make nonelective profit sharing contributions to the Plan for eligible employees, equal to a percentage of each eligible participant's compensation (excluding bonuses and severance payments). All Employer contributions in 2024 were discretionary matching contributions of 50% up to 3% of the employee's salary. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings and charged with administrative expenses, withdrawals and Plan losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their participant contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer discretionary matching contributions and nonelective profit sharing contributions are based on years of continuous service, as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance attributable to their participant contributions. The notes are secured by the balance in a participant's account and bear interest at the rate of Prime plus 1%. Prime is defined as the Prime Rate in *The Wall Street Journal* on the 14th business day of the month before the loan is originated. A participant can hold a maximum of two loans at one time. Loan terms range from one to five years, or a longer period for the purchase of a primary residence and are due at various dates through 2039. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, interest rates on outstanding ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. Loans mature through 2039. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to termination of employment, death, disability or retirement, participants or beneficiaries may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account or annual installment payments over a set period of time. Hardship withdrawals are available only to the extent that the participant has no other financial resources to meet the financial need, as defined in the Plan, and the amount of the withdrawal cannot exceed the amount needed. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for participants who have attained age 59^{1/2}. Upon termination, participants with a vested benefit of less than \$5,000, but greater than \$1,000, may elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant, or to receive the benefit directly. If no such election is made, the Company shall pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Company. Account balances under \$1,000 will be paid in a lump-sum payment. Retirees and former employees may choose to leave all or part of the vested balance in the Plan until age 73. After age 73, if a participant is not actively employed, the account must begin required minimum distributions no later than April 1 of the calendar year following the year the participant turns 73. All other in-service withdrawals are subject to an early withdrawal penalty tax of 10%.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Employer discretionary matching contributions, pay administrative expenses, or are reallocated to participant accounts. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$57,944 and \$56,312, respectively. Forfeitures of \$138,461 were used to reduce Employer discretionary matching contributions during 2024.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Plan Sponsor are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's advisory committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, trustee, custodian and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because the contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan (see Note 5).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and expensed as incurred. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Transactional fees and fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the respective participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Under this provision of ERISA, investment information and related activity certified as accurate and complete by a qualified institution need not be subjected to independent audit. Accordingly, Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc. (Lincoln), Trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules is complete and accurate.

- Investments and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Investment income, other income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for the year ended December 31, 2024;
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund, which represents the Net Asset Value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan holds a guaranteed investment contract with Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, which was determined to be a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

The Plan owns a promise to receive interest at crediting rates that are announced in advance and guaranteed for a specific period of time as outlined in the group annuity contract. The contract is backed by the full faith and creditworthiness of the issuer. Guarantees are based on the claims-paying ability of the issuer and not on the value of the securities within the insurer's general account. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate for the first and last two quarters of 2024 were 1.9% and 2.0%, respectively. There are no reserves against the

contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, losses and administrative expenses.

The interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets and is subject to a minimum rate provision but may never fall below 1% after deduction for any expenses. There are no events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract or require the Plan Sponsor to settle at an amount different than contract value. The crediting interest rate is reset per contract provisions. Past interest rates are not indicative of future interest rates. Key factors that could influence future interest crediting rates are changes in economic and market conditions, interest rates, and default or credit failures of the securities in the insurer's general assets.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and a guaranteed investment contract managed by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, through services provided by Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc., the Trustee and Custodian of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations. Participant loans also represent party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being

operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10 - PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit participant contributions totaling \$279 and \$3,600, respectively, within the required timeframe, as stated by the United States Department of Labor regulations. The Plan Sponsor deposited the lost earnings to correct the 2023 untimely remittances in September 2024. The Plan Sponsor is in the process of making all necessary corrections for the 2024 untimely remittances.

NOTE 11 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management evaluated its December 31, 2024 financial statements for subsequent events through September 18, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan restated the Lincoln adoption agreement. Plan changes included, but were not limited to, changing the match formula to satisfy safe harbor requirements and allow auto enrollment into the Plan.
