Notes to Financial Statements

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Essen Medical Associates, P.C. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan, established on January 1, 2007, is a participant-directed defined contribution plan covering all employees of Essen Medical Associates, P.C. and Affiliates (collectively referred to as the “Company,” the “Employer,” or the “Plan Sponsor”) who have completed at least one month of service and reached 21 years of age, except for members of a collective bargaining unit and non-resident aliens. The Plan provides eligible employees with a means to save for retirement. It also provides certain benefits in the event of death, disability, or other termination of employment. Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity” or the “Trustee”) is the Plan’s Trustee. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Plan Administration

The Company is the administrator of the Plan and, as such, carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Company has appointed the Administrative Committee to oversee the operation and administration of the Plan. Fidelity serves as the Plan’s directed trustee and asset custodian and an affiliate of Fidelity provides record-keeping services and manages participant accounts and participant related transactions.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute to the Plan up to 100% of compensation on a pre-tax basis, with dollar limits established by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Such contributions are excluded from the participant’s Federal taxable income until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers) and may elect to make “after-tax” Roth contributions. During 2024, the maximum annual 401(k) pre-tax contribution limit was \$23,000, and the maximum annual catch-up contribution for participants 50 years of age and older was \$7,500.

The Plan provides for employer safe harbor contributions for all eligible participants. Safe harbor contributions are based on a percentage of a participant’s compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made safe harbor contributions in amounts equal to 100% of the first 3% of participants’ eligible compensation, and 50% of the next 2% of participants’ eligible compensation which totaled \$386,124. Additionally, the Company may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions and qualified non-elective contributions (“QNECs”). For 2024, there were no discretionary profit-sharing contributions or QNECs made. The total contributions of the Company and participants for any Plan Year cannot exceed the lesser of (1) 100% of the participants’ compensation or (2) maximum allowable by the IRC. Employee rollover contributions from other qualified plans and catch-up contributions are excluded from the Company’s salary match calculation.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with the participant's contribution and allocations of (i) employer's 401(k) matching contributions and (ii) the participant's share of earnings or losses on contributions and administrative expenses. Each participant directs all amounts credited into their account into one or more of the investment options available under the Plan. Accordingly, as a participant-direct plan, each participant's investments determine their share of earnings or losses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollovers, safe harbor matching contribution, additional discretionary matching contributions or profit-sharing contributions, if any, plus actual earnings thereon.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions in 1% increments, into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their contribution investment options daily and may transfer part or all of past investments to other investment options daily. Participants may also elect to change their contribution percentage on the first day of the quarter.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested fund account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested interest of the participant in the Plan. A participant may have no more than 2 loans outstanding at any time. All loans are required to be repaid within five (5) years from the date of the loan or up to ten (10) years for the purchase of a principal residence. The loans are secured by at least 50% of the participant's vested account balance in the Plan and, unless otherwise determined by the Plan Administrator, bear interest at a fixed rate using the prevailing prime rate (which was 7.50% and 8.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively) plus 1% at the date of the loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Loans mature through November 2029 with interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 8.50%.

Hardship and In-Service Withdrawals

The Plan Administrator may authorize a lump-sum distribution of up to 100% of the participant's salary deferrals (excluding any investment earnings) but not to exceed the amount necessary to meet the financial need created by the hardship provided the participant submits positive evidence of an immediate and heavy financial need as defined in the Plan. In-service distributions of the participant's vested interest are available for any reason upon attaining age 59½.

Deemed Distributions

Deemed distributions are recorded when a participant ceases to make loan repayments under the terms of the loan agreement. Deemed distributions on defaulted notes are recorded in the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter during which the loan was defaulted. These amounts are no longer included in net assets available for benefits and are recorded as benefit paid to participants. There were \$1,194 of deemed distributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 included in benefits paid to participants or beneficiaries.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of employment prior to age 59½, Plan participants with account balances greater than \$1,000 may elect to defer distributions to normal retirement age. Participants have the option to receive either lump sum payments or installment payments. Under the terms of the Plan, if the vested value of the account of a participant is \$1,000 or less, the Plan Administrator will direct the Trustee to distribute it to the participant as a lump sum distribution without the participant's consent. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, all employees who elected to withdraw from the Plan had been paid.

Forfeited Accounts

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan, represents a forfeiture. However, if the participant is re-employed and fulfills certain requirements as defined by the Plan, the participant's account will be reinstated. Unused forfeitures may be used to reduce administrative costs of the Plan. Any remaining amounts may then be used to reduce future employer matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$5,020 of forfeitures were used to reduce administrative costs of the Plan.

Expenses of the Plan

Administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Plan Sponsor. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Certain Plan expenses are deducted from participant accounts, and the remainder of the Plan expenses are generally paid by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan Sponsor is under no obligation to pay such expenses.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Participant's benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All Plan investments are held by the Trustee. The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements).

Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The Plan presents, in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, the net appreciation or decline in the fair value of its investments, which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation or decline on those investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Subsequent Events

Plan management evaluated subsequent events for recognition or disclosure from December 31, 2024 through the date these financial statements were available to be issued, September 15, 2025. No such events were identified.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEES

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor ("DOL")'s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity, the Trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Net appreciation in the fair value of the investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the quoted market prices of shares or units held by the Plan. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market funds: Valued at the quoted market prices of shares or units held by the Plan.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST

At December 31, 2024, certain Plan investments were managed by Fidelity and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative fees paid by the Plan to the Trustees were \$16,574 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan sponsored by FMR LLC., which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”), dated June 30, 2020, as to the Plan’s qualified status. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC, and accordingly no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan does not believe it has any uncertain tax positions.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan’s administrator believes it is no longer subject to tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 8 – PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

The DOL considers late deposits to be prohibited transactions. Plan Management determined that during the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor failed to remit certain employee deferrals and loan repayments to the Plan in a timely manner according to DOL regulations, in the amount of \$6,401 and \$75,216, respectively. The Employer has undertaken the necessary procedures to calculate and reimburse the affected participants for lost earnings due to these late contributions under the DOL’s Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program (“VFCP”). As of December 31, 2023, corrections for lost earnings and interest thereon, have been fully restored to the participants’ accounts for the late contributions in the year ended December 31, 2023. During August 2025, corrections for lost earnings and interest thereon, have been fully restored to the participants’ accounts for the late contributions made in the year ended December 31, 2024.



