Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of Bentley University Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Bentley University Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 11 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of Bentley University Retirement Plan. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion

Bentley University Retirement Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the accompanying financial statements may have been affected by these conditions.

Further, as described in Note 2 to the financial statements, the Bentley University Retirement Plan has excluded from investments in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, as permitted by the Department of Labor's Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, *Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans*. The investment income and distributions related to such contracts and accounts also have been excluded in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The amount of these excluded annuity contracts and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions are not reasonably determinable. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that these contracts and accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Bentley University Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for at least one year following the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of Bentley University Retirement Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditors' report. However, because of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of Bentley University Retirement Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule, Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, it is inappropriate to and we do not express an opinion on the supplemental schedule referred to above.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Bentley University Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective July 1, 1960, as restated January 1, 2010. The Plan covers all eligible employees of Bentley University (the Organization or Employer). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

All employees of the Organization, except for nonresident aliens and student employees, become eligible for participation in the Plan on their date of hire. All employees of the Organization, except for nonresident aliens, student employees, adjunct faculty and temporary employees, become eligible for the Organization's discretionary nonelective contribution after two uninterrupted years of service on the first day of the month after their date of hire, as defined, and upon attaining age 21. Employees who normally work less than 20 hours a week may participate in the Plan but are excluded from receiving the Organization's discretionary nonelective contributions. Long-term part-time employees who met eligibility requirements under SECURE Act are also eligible to participate in the Plan.

Plan Amendments

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow installment payments as a form of benefits paid to participants.

Effective July 15, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow for terminated participants with vested balances less than or equal to \$5,000 to be distributed in the form of a lump sum cash payment or to be automatically distributed to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), depending on the balance, provided that the participant has not elected another form of payment permitted by the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants aged 60-63 are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Automatically enrolled participants will have their deferral rate increase by 1% on the anniversary of their enrollment date until their deferral rate reaches 10%.

The Organization may, at its discretion, make nonelective contributions to the Plan in any plan year in an amount determined by the Board of Directors of the Organization. Participants are eligible for the Organization's discretionary nonelective contributions after two years of service after their date of hire, as defined. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Organization approved discretionary nonelective contributions to the Plan in the amount of \$9,268,398, which is equal to 10% of participant compensation.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Organization's discretionary contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Organization's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Plan Loans

Prior to January 1, 2019, participants could borrow directly from the Custodian, subject to certain limitations, by using a portion of their plan account as security for the plan loan. These loans do not occur directly within a participant's account but rather through a designated Custodian account. Outstanding loan balances were \$14,265 and \$13,664 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and are not reported within the accompanying financial statements of the Plan but serve as collateral against the outstanding plan loan balances. Interest on these loans is paid directly to the Custodian.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range from one to five years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installment payments as provided in the plan document. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of a lump sum cash distribution or an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), depending on the balance, provided that the participant has not elected another form of payment permitted by the Plan. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

Recapture Account

The Plan holds assets in an unallocated account which receives revenue sharing payments related to certain investments held by the Plan as a result of a revenue sharing agreement with Fidelity Management Trust Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, payments to the account totaled \$328,815, which are included as a reduction of net administrative expenses in the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits. Funds in the account are used to pay qualified plan expenses including investment management fees. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$99,824 was used to pay plan expenses and \$168,937 was reallocated to participant accounts. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated assets amounted to \$105,091 and \$41,611, respectively, and are included in TIAA traditional benefit-responsive 2.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, the Plan has excluded such annuity contracts and custodial accounts from investments in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits, as permitted by the Department of Labor's (DOL) Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, "Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans." The investment income and distributions related to such annuity contracts and custodial accounts also have been excluded from the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net assets Available for Benefits. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires that these annuity contracts and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements. The amount of these excluded annuity contracts and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions are not reasonably determinable.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan's investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Recent Regulatory Updates

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the year ended December 31, 2024, and continues to evaluate the impact of the adoption and implementation of this legislation on the Plan. The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through September 5, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under authoritative guidance are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observables and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

CREF Variable Annuity Accounts: Valued based upon the unit values of such pooled accounts held by the Plan at year-end. Unit values are based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the fund derived from inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data or other means, although are not based upon quoted market prices in an active market. The CREF variable annuities reflect a structure similar to mutual funds and have a readily determinable fair value as reported by TIAA each day that current transactions are recorded.

TIAA Pooled Separate Account - Real Estate: Valued using readily determinable fair values based on the fair value of the underlying assets of each investment as determined by TIAA through the use of market quotations obtained from independent pricing market. The TIAA Real Estate account reflects a structure similar to mutual funds and has a readily determinable fair value as reported by TIAA each day that current transactions are recorded.

Fidelity Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Consists of interest bearing cash, mutual funds, units, and noninterest bearing cash. Interest bearing cash and noninterest bearing cash are valued at their stated value which approximates fair value. Mutual funds and units are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

TIAA Traditional Annuity Accounts - Nonbenefit-Responsive: The guaranteed annuity contracts consist of the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account's RA and RC subaccounts and are reported at contract value, which approximates fair value per TIAA, based on TIAA's ability to pay the guaranteed claims in accordance with the terms of the contract. As of December 31, 2024, TIAA's credit ratings were as follows: A++ by A.M. Best Company, AAA by Fitch Ratings, Aa1 by Moody's Investors Service and AA+ by Standard & Poor's. The high credit ratings of TIAA as of the measurement date uphold their ability to meet obligations set forth in the contract.

Contract value is the aggregation of contributions, plus interest, less withdrawals, if any. Crediting rates are a combination of a guaranteed rate and an annually established discretionary rate. Additionally, the discretionary rate applied to contributions received during a reporting period may vary from the discretionary rate applied to account balances at the end of the prior reporting period. Contract value approximates a discounted cash flow value calculated using an appropriate risk-adjusted market discount rate, which correlates closely with the historical crediting rates.

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The TIAA Account has redemption restrictions based on the terms of the underlying contract selected by the participant and loan agreements with participants, and claims against the contracts are solely supported by TIAA's ability to pay on such claims. The redemption restrictions do not have a material impact on the contract value of the TIAA Account.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan offers the option to invest in the TIAA traditional annuity account, a guaranteed annuity contract with TIAA. Plan participants enter into these contractual agreements with TIAA by selecting a TIAA traditional annuity account. Participants of the Plan previously invested in the following transitional accounts: Group Supplemental Retirement Annuity (GSRA), Supplemental Retirement Annuity (SRA) and Retirement Annuity (RA). Currently, all new contributions, rollovers and external transfers are directed into the Retirement Choice (RC) or Retirement Choice Plus Annuity (RCP) accounts. All amounts in the GSRA, SRA and RA accounts will remain in those accounts until distributed or transferred to another investment option by the participant.

The RCP, GSRA and SRA are considered fully benefit-responsive and are reported at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The RA and RC are considered nonbenefit-responsive and are reported at fair value.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the sponsoring trustee, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The TIAA traditional annuity account is a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest. Interest is credited to the account and accumulations include a guaranteed rate, plus discretionary additional amounts determined annually by the TIAA Board of Trustees. The additional amounts, when declared, remain in effect through the "declaration year," which begins each March 1. The guaranteed annual interest rate is 3% for all premiums remitted since 1979 under all TIAA traditional annuity accumulating contracts with the exception of the RC account. For the RC account, the guaranteed rate is between 1% and 3%. They are not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in fair value of underlying assets, therefore the average yield earned by the Plan is the interest earned on the group annuity contract.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of TIAA or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon by TIAA, which will not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The TIAA traditional annuity account does not permit TIAA to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC
- Premature termination of the contracts
- Plan termination or merger
- Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
- Bankruptcy of the Organization or other Organization events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants. In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
- A breach of material obligation under the contract
- A material misrepresentation
- A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

5. Concentrations

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had investments of \$100,506,996 and \$99,676,336, respectively, that were concentrated in two funds.

6. Related-Party and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company and TIAA CREF, the Custodians, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in the fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Custodians receive revenue from investment fund service providers for services the Custodians provide to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the Custodians for their administrative services to the Plan. If the revenue received by the Custodians from such investment fund service providers exceeds the amount owed for its services, the Custodians remit the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. The Plan or Organization may make a payment to the Custodians for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Organization. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

8. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a volume submitter plan offered by Fidelity Workplace Services LLC stating that the written form of the underlying specimen plan is qualified under Section 403(b) of the IRC. The volume submitter plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated August 7, 2017, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and to recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

10. Excluded Contracts

For ERISA reporting requirements, the Plan Administrator has elected to exclude from investments certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts which may have been issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, as permitted by the Department of Labor DOL's Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, *Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans*. These annuity contracts and custodial accounts, and the related income and distributions have also been excluded from the accompanying financial statements. U.S. GAAP require that these accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements. The effects of this departure from generally accepted accounting principles on these financial statements are not reasonably determinable.

11. Information Certified by Custodians

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company and TIAA CREF, the Custodians of the Plan, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024. Such information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by a qualified institution.

12. Subsequent Events

Effective January 2025, the Organization approved the provision for participants aged 60-63 to be eligible to make additional catch-up contributions under SECURE Act 2.0

Effective July 2025, the Organization approved the increase in the threshold for involuntary cash-out distributions from \$5,000 to \$7,000 under the provisions of SECURE Act 2.0.
