Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of or for the year ended December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements, but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Bradford White Corporation 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document, including plan amendments, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1997. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan covers all nonunion employees of Bradford White Corporation (BWC), and its wholly-owned subsidiaries, Niles Steel Tank Company (NST), Laars Heating Systems Company (Laars), Electro Industries, Inc. (Electro), Heat-Flo, LLC (Heat-Flo) and FloLogic, Inc. (FloLogic) (collectively the Company). Eligible employees will become participants in the Plan on the next entry date after their employment date of hire. Entry dates are the first day of each quarter. Participants who have completed 1,000 hours of service within one year of employment with the Company, are eligible for matching and discretionary contributions. The trustees of the Plan are responsible for plan oversight, determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Contributions

The Plan is funded by contributions from its participants and the Company. Participants may elect to defer a specific dollar amount or a percentage amount in their elections plus 100 percent of any employer-paid cash bonus as contributions to the Plan up to a maximum of \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. NST matches 35 percent of participant deferrals up to a maximum of 5 percent of participants' compensation. Laars matches 25 percent of the participants' elective deferrals up to 6 percent of participants' compensation. For employees working at the Keltech unit, BWC matches 50 percent of participant deferrals up to 6 percent of the participant's compensation. For 2023, the Company declared a 15% discretionary contribution to be made for NST and Laars. The Company may also contribute an additional amount at the discretion of the respective boards of directors. BWC did not make discretionary contributions for 2024. Laars, NST, Electro and Heat-Flo made discretionary contributions of \$531,853, \$59,456, \$86,621 and \$31,746, respectively for 2024.

Effective May 1, 2023, participants may make deferrals to the Plan on an after-tax basis in accordance with the Roth provisions of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contributions and Company match to the participants' accounts, if any, is based on years of service. A participant is 20 percent vested after one year of service, 40 percent vested after two years of service, 60 percent vested after three years of service, 80 percent vested after four years of service, and 100 percent vested after five years of service. However, regardless of a participant's years of service, if an active participant becomes permanently disabled or dies prior to attaining the normal retirement age, or upon termination of the Plan, then the participant's account becomes 100 percent vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest rates between 4.25 and 9.50 percent, which are commensurate with market rates on similar loans as determined by the plan administrator. During any period in which the participant is in active military service, the interest rate will not exceed six percent per annum. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or their beneficiaries may elect to receive a distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or annuity, or a combination of both. All distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the plan agreement.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$66,435 and \$16,522, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. During 2024, forfeitures of \$68,941 were used to offset employer contributions.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and Principal Trust Company (Principal). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recognized on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 23, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Financial Information Certified by the Qualified Institution

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments, notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company, a qualified institution.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open end investments that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. Registered investment companies are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common trust funds: Valued at NAV of units held. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

(5) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in registered investment companies and a common trust fund managed by Principal. Principal is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

(6) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

(7) Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter, dated June 29, 2023, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code and is, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(8) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(9) Prohibited Transactions

During 2022, 2023 and 2024, the Company failed to remit certain employee contributions and participant loan repayments amounting to \$24,592, \$324,031 and \$51,450, respectively, to the Plan's custodian within the period prescribed by the Department of Labor's regulations. The Company corrected the 2022 and 2023 contributions during 2024 and plans to make contributions during 2025 to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for missed contributions and potential lost income due to the delays.

(10) Transfers to Affiliated Plan

During 2024, transfers of net assets to the Plan from Bradford White Corporation 401(k) Plan for Union Employees amounted to \$538,431.
